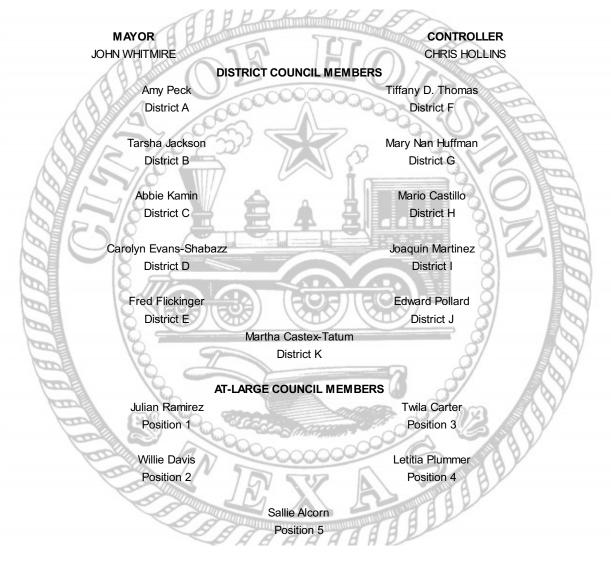

The TDHCA administers the state's Housing Tax Credit program, which provides federal tax credits to spur the development of quality, affordable housing.

Per Texas Government Code Section 2306-67071, the governing body of the jurisdiction where a project is to be located must "hold a hearing ... to solicit public input concerning the Application or Development" before a developer can submit an application for noncompetitive 4% tax credits.

HCD has performed a threshold review and recommends a Resolution of No Objection for the following reasons:

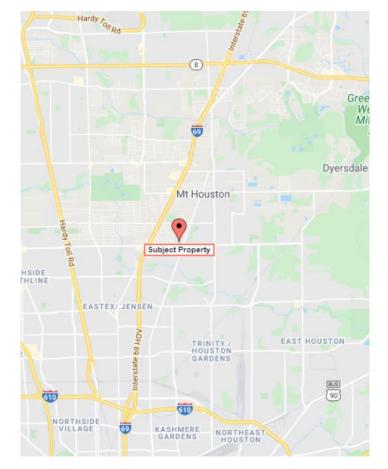

Background:

The Houston Parks and Recreation Department (HPARD) recommends Council approval of an Ordinance authorizing the findings related to the use or taking by Center Point Energy Resources of approximately 2,979 square feet (0.07-acre) of park properties for a gas main relocation in support of the hike and bike trail and will not adversely affect the park properties.

The park properties were acquired by Houston Parks Board specifically to support the hike and bike trails along Brays Bayou and were transferred to the City for those purposes. The properties are also restricted to park purposes only; however, the City has obtained a release from the Kinder Foundation to accommodate the relocation of the gas lines. The two easements will use approximately the total of 2,979 square feet (0.07-acre) of the park properties, are 10 feet wide and run along the property lines to minimize impact to the park. The easements are necessary for relocation of CenterPoint facilities to accommodate the widening of bridge in order to extend a hike and bike trail across Brays Bayou.

Houston Parks Board, CenterPoint Energy and the Parks and Recreation Department have worked together to ensure that the Project has a minimal, if any, impact on the park properties. Since there

is no reasonable prudent alternative for the reroute of the gas lines and impact to the park land is minimal, the Houston Parks and Recreation Department supports the project.

Texas Parks and Wildlife Code Chapter 26 requires the City to publish three public notices and hold a public hearing prior to authorizing the use or taking of park land for non-park purposes. Public notices were posted in the Houston Chronicle on April 1, 2024, April 8, 2024, and April 15, 2024.

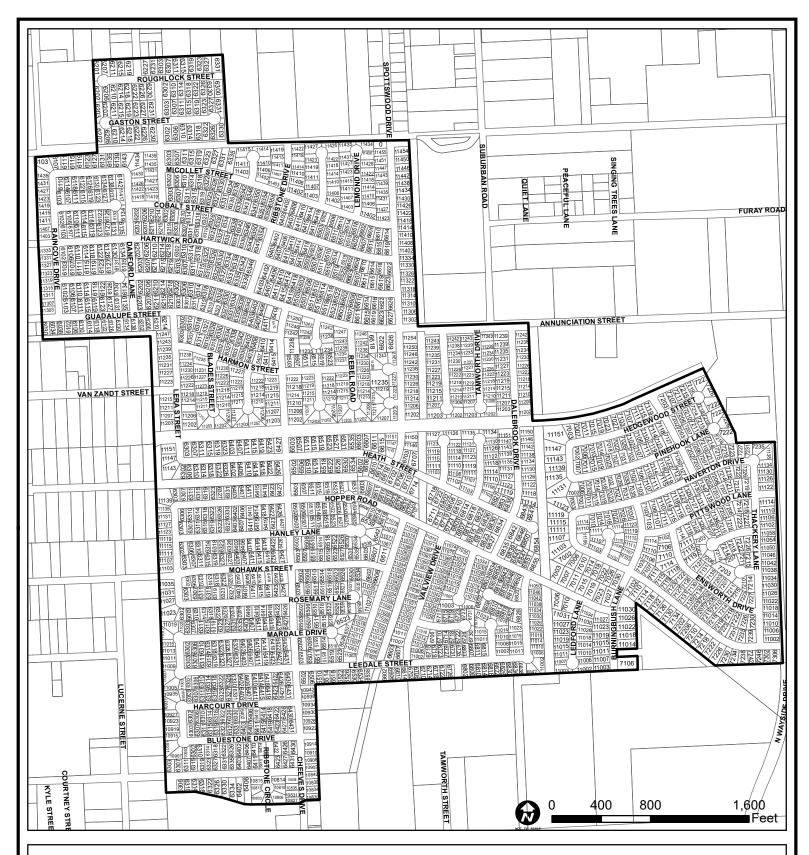

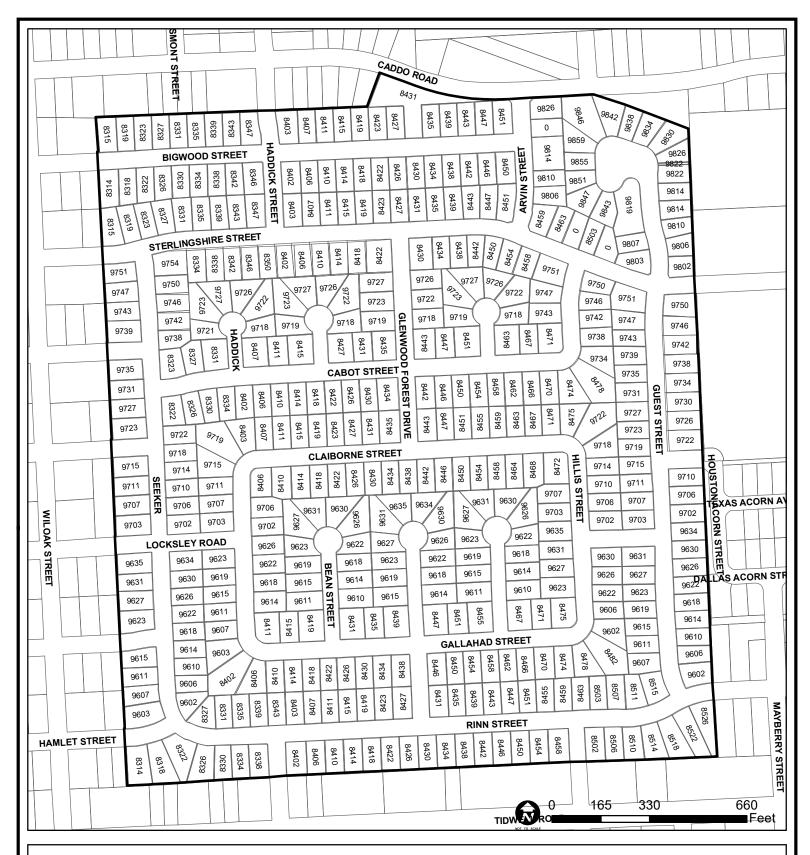

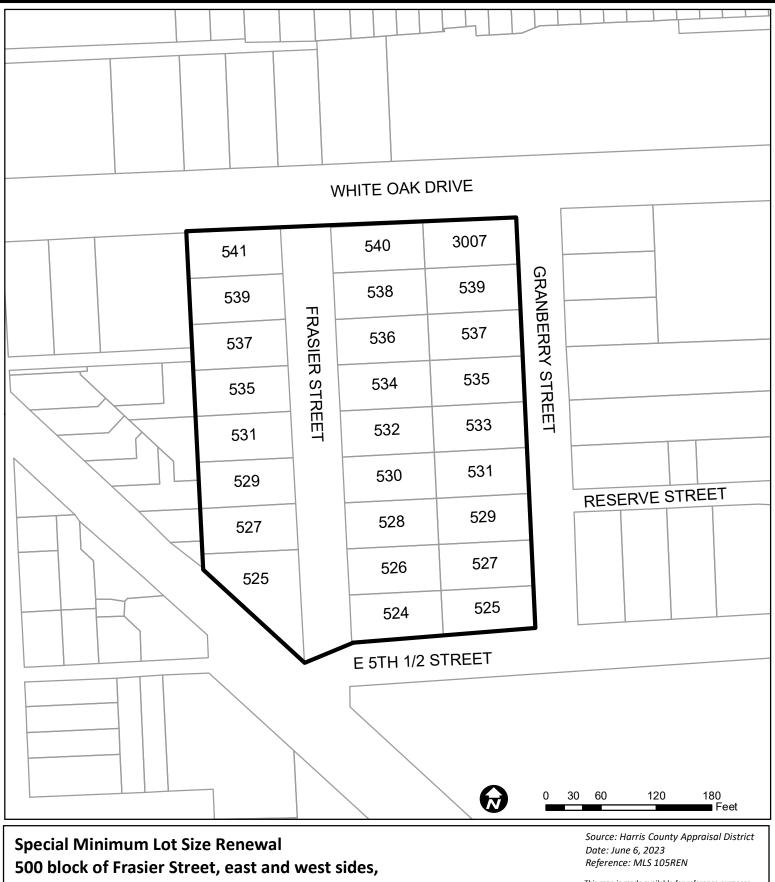

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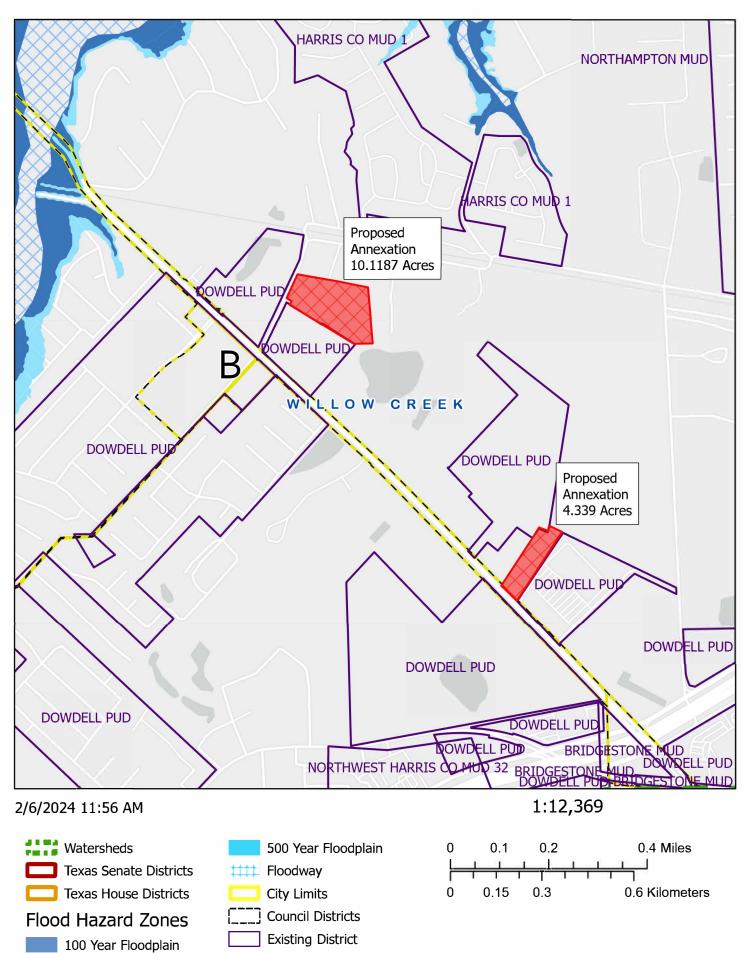

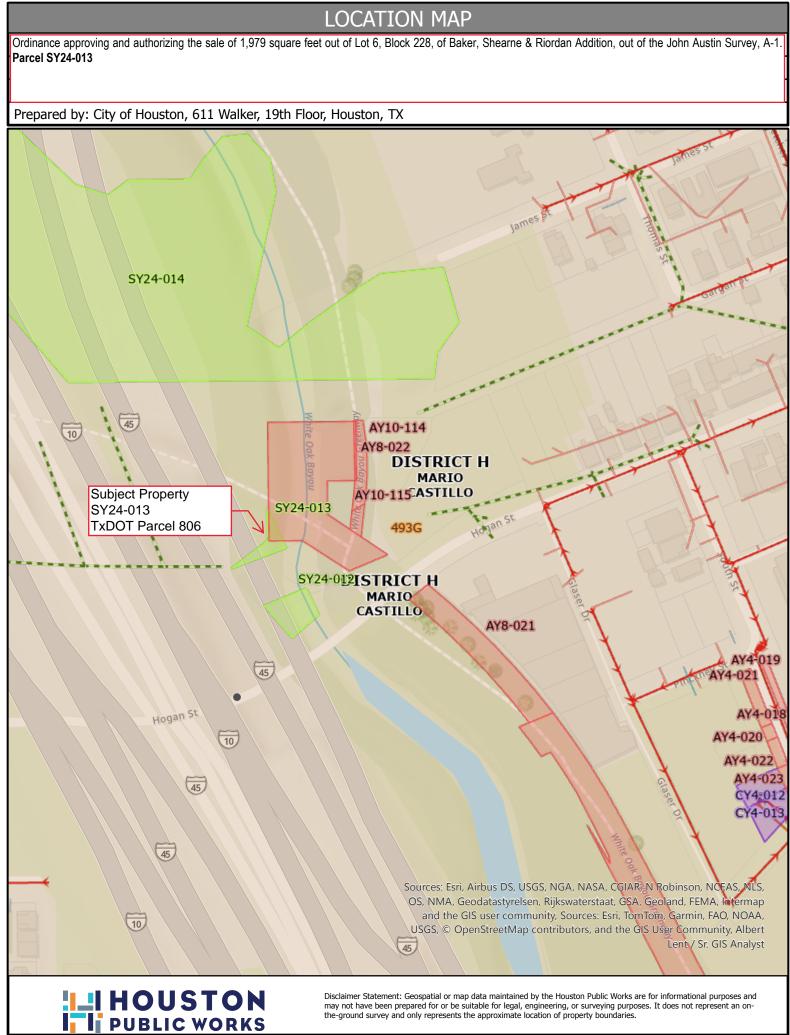
