## **Background:**

**SUBJECT:** Accept Work for FY 2024 Ditch Maintenance Work Order Contract.

**RECOMMENDATION:** (SUMMARY) Pass a motion to approve the final Contract Amount of \$992,806.94 or 0.72% under the original Contract Amount, accept the Work, and authorize final payment.

**<u>PROJECT NOTICE/JUSTIFICATION:</u>** This project was part of the Transportation and Drainage Operations Program, and it was required to provide work authorization on a location by location as-needed basis, for the operation and maintenance of stormwater drainage assets.

**DESCRIPTION/SCOPE:** This project consisted of the Citywide Program that provided maintenance services for open drainage systems. The time allotted for construction of this project was 730 calendar days. The project was awarded to DL Glover Utilities, LLC with an original Contract Amount of \$1,000,000.00.

**LOCATION:** The projects were located throughout the City of Houston.

**CONTRACT COMPLETION AND COST:** The Contractor, DL Glover Utilities, LLC has completed the work under the subject Contract. The project was completed within the original Contract time. The final cost of the project, including overrun and underrun of estimated unit price quantities is \$992,806.94, a decrease of \$7,193.06 or 0.72% under the original Contract amount. The decreased cost is a result of the difference between planned and measured quantities.

**M/WSBE PARTICIPATION:** The advertised M/WBE contract goals for this project were 18% MBE and 5% WBE. The M/WBE goals approved for this project were 18% MBE and 5% WBE. According to the Office of Business Opportunity, the actual participation achieved on this project was 27.52% MBE and 7.26% WBE. The MWBE performance on this project was rated Outstanding for the following reasons: All goals were exceeded, and goal credit subcontractors

were utilized. For the reasons listed, the MWSBE performance meets the good faith efforts requirements mandated by the City's MWSBE Program.

# **Background:**

Beginning May 7, 2025, City Council's Budget and Fiscal Affairs Committee hosted a series of budget workshops to review and discuss the Fiscal Year 2025 operating budget. The budget was distributed to City Council on May 6, 2025, in accordance with the City Charter and the Texas Local Government Code. The expenditure operating budget for all funds totals approximately \$8.7 billion, which includes a General Fund expenditure budget of approximately \$3.0 billion.

The budget ordinance includes the following provisions:

- Approval for budget transfers of up to 5% of a "budget expenditure group" between departments within a fund;
- Approval of the incorporation in the Adopted Budget for FY2026, FY2025, and FY2024 information, and the adjustment of fund balances that may occur as a result;
- Approval to increase the budgets for the Aviation Revenue Fund, but only for transfer to the Airport Improvement Fund, in the event, and to the extent, of unanticipated revenue increases in the Fund as certified by the City Controller;
- Approval to increase the budgets for the Water and Sewer Operating Fund and the Combined Utility System Operating Fund, but only for transfer to the Combined Utility System General Purpose Fund in the event, and to the extent, of unanticipated revenue increases in the Fund as certified by the City Controller;
- Approval to increase the budgets in various Funds to the extent of unanticipated revenue increases in the Fund as certified by the City Controller;
- Approval to charge \$35.00 plus tax and postage per set for the purchase of the budget

document.

The budget totals include maintenance and operation expenditures, interfund transfers, and operating and capital reserves, as well as planned ending fund balances. The budget does not include the budgets for the Tax Increment Reinvestment Zones, which will be brought before City Council in a separate action. The Budget is available for review on the Internet, accessible through the City's home page located at https://www.houstontx.gov/budget/26budprop/index.html.

# **Background:**

After adoption of the budget ordinance, a second vote to ratify the increase in property tax revenues included in the budget must be taken as required by Section 102.007(c) of the Texas Local Government Code for budgets adopted after September 1, 2007;

"Adoption of a budget that will require raising more revenue from property taxes than in the previous year requires a separate vote of the governing body to ratify the property tax increase reflect in the budget. A vote under this subsection is in addition to and separate from the vote to adopt the budget or vote to set the tax rate required by Chapter 26, Tax Code, or other law."

Chapter 102 of the Texas Local Government Code also sets out language to be included, verbatim, in any budget adopted after September 2013, and in the posted published notices of the related public hearing. Accordingly, the following statement has been included in the budget and in the required notices to comply with the law.

"This budget will raise more revenue from property taxes than last year's budget by an amount of \$76,886,916, which is a 5.39 percent increase from last year's budget. The property tax revenue to be raised from new property added to the tax roll this year is \$27,323,397."

Approval of this item ratifying the increase in property tax revenues reflected in the budget, as required by State law, is recommended.

ARA's ParkHouston Division oversees the City's Employee Parking & Transit Program, which provides either a METRO Transit pass or parking space for eligible City employees working in or near the central business district.

## Background:

**RECOMMENDATION:** Approve and authorize a First Amendment to the Construction Management at Risk contract with Anslow Bryant Construction Ltd., and appropriate additional funds.

**SPECIFIC EXPLANATION:** On April 10, 2019, by Ordinance No. 2019-260, City Council appropriated the sum of \$3,595,845.00 out of the Fire Consolidated Construction Fund to the In-House Revolving Fund for the renovations during FY2019 of the Houston Fire Department (HFD) Fire Station No. 17 Renovation Project.

On September 15, 2021, by Ordinance No. 2021-794, City Council (i) awarded a Construction Manager at Risk (CMAR) contract to Anslow-Bryant Construction, Ltd.; (ii) de-appropriated the sum of \$1,646,224.89 out of the Fire Consolidated Construction Fund (previously appropriated by Ordinance No. 2019-260); and (iii) appropriated the sum of \$3,960,224.89 out of the Fire Consolidated Construction phase services for Fire Station No. 17 Renovation Project.

On June 21, 2023, by Ordinance No. 2023-466, City Council authorized the appropriation of \$1,210,000.00 out of the Fire Consolidated Construction Fund for the project. GSD received the final Guaranteed Maximum Price (GMP) on March 17, 2023.

The first Amendment is necessary to include additional scope for the installation of bifold doors which will improve response time for emergency calls and provide funding for additional costs of the project improvements, which will exceed the original 10% contingency.

#### Background:

**RECOMMENDATION:** Approve and authorize a First Amendment to the Construction Management at Risk contract with Anslow Bryant Construction Ltd., and appropriate additional funds.

**SPECIFIC EXPLANATION:** On April 10, 2019, by Ordinance No. 2019-260, City Council appropriated the sum of \$3,595,845.00 out of the Fire Consolidated Construction Fund to the In-House Revolving Fund for the renovations during FY2019 of the Houston Fire Department (HFD) Fire Station No. 17 Renovation Project.

On September 15, 2021, by Ordinance No. 2021-794, City Council (i) awarded a Construction Manager at Risk (CMAR) contract to Anslow-Bryant Construction, Ltd.; (ii) de-appropriated the sum of \$1,646,224.89 out of the Fire Consolidated Construction Fund (previously appropriated by Ordinance No. 2019-260); and (iii) appropriated the sum of \$3,960,224.89 out of the Fire Consolidated Construction Fund for pre-construction and construction phase services for Fire Station No. 17 Renovation Project.

On June 21, 2023, by Ordinance No. 2023-466, City Council authorized the appropriation of \$1,210,000.00 out of the Fire Consolidated Construction Fund for the project. GSD received the final Guaranteed Maximum Price (GMP) on March 17, 2023.

The first Amendment is necessary to include additional scope for the installation of bifold doors which will improve response time for emergency calls and provide funding for additional costs of the project improvements, which will exceed the original 10% contingency.

Therefore, the General Services Department recommends that City Council appropriate an additional sum of \$529,000.00 to the CMAR contract with Anslow Bryant Construction, Ltd., for additional scope of work. It is further recommended that City Council approve a First Amendment to the construction contract with Anslow Bryant Construction, Ltd., to increase the director's authority to approve Change Orders up 17% of the original contract price.

#### PROJECT LOCATION: 2805 Navigation Blvd, Houston, TX 77003

**PROJECT DESCRIPTION:** The additional project scope includes replacing the existing overhead doors in the apparatus bay facing Navigation Blvd with bifold doors. The new doors are more reliable than the Overhead doors, open quicker, resulting in faster response times, and make clearing the path easier for trucks to pull out, which helps the trucks avoid hitting and damaging the doors.

The design consultant is English + Associates.

**CONSTRUCTION GOALS:** The original contract has a 20.91 MBE goal and 2.50% WBE goal. To date, Anslow Bryant Construction Ltd. has achieved 0% MBE and 0% WBE participation. It is anticipated that Anslow Bryant Construction Ltd. will achieve the goals by the completion of the contract.

Proposition A Council Member Item: Traffic Stops Quota Per Shift

<u>Ordinance:</u> Currently, Sec. 45-11. Obedience to traffic officers generally states: No person shall willfully fail or refuse to comply with any lawful order, direction or signal, visual or audible, of any police officer or officer of the fire department vested by law authority to direct, control or regulate traffic.

**<u>Proposal</u>:** This amendment attempts to add the following sentence to the above ordinance language: No police officer shall be directed or required to have a quota on the minimum amount of traffic stops during a normal working shift.

**Background:** In discussion with local law enforcement groups and advocacy groups, it has been expressed that having a minimum quota for police officers to conduct traffic stops disrupts the normal flow of their duties and can lead to unnecessary interactions with the public. As a matter of good public policy, quotas for traffic stops erode the trust between community and police. This amendment proposes to change that and give more flexibility and discretion to police officers.
