The TDHCA administers the state's Housing Tax Credit program, which provides federal tax credits to spur the development of quality, affordable housing.

Per Texas Government Code Section 2306-67071, the governing body of the jurisdiction where a project is to be located (including the City's extraterritorial jurisdiction) must "hold a hearing ...to solicit public input concerning the Application or Development" before a developer can submit an application for noncompetitive 4% tax credits.

HCD has performed a threshold review and recommends a Resolution of No Objection for the following reasons:

• Enclave at Katy – Not located in floodway or 100-year floodplain

HCD recommends a Motion to hold a public hearing on July 9, 2025, on the 4% Housing Tax Credit Resolution of No Objection.

This item was reviewed by the joint Quality of Life/Housing and Affordability Committee on June 16, 2025.

DESCRIPTION/SCOPE: This project consisted of drainage and paving to construct sidewalks, driveways, curbs, storm sewer, water line, and wastewater line improvements. PGAL, Inc., designed the project with 835 calendar days allowed for construction. The project was awarded to Total Contracting Limited with an original Contract Amount of \$20,974,850.95.

LOCATION: The project area was generally bounded by Richelieu Lane on the north, Judiway Street on the south, Alba Road on the east, and Ella Boulevard on the west.

CONTRACT COMPLETION AND COST: The Contractor, Total Contracting Limited, has completed the work under the subject Contract. The project was completed beyond the established completion date with an additional 61 days approved by Change Order Nos. 1 and 7. The final cost of the project, including overrun and underrun of estimated unit price quantities and previously approved Change Order Nos 1 through 9 is \$21,134,038.85, an increase of \$159,187.90 or 0.76% over the original Contract Amount. The increased cost is a result of the difference between planned and measured quantities.

M/WSBE PARTICIPATION: The advertised M/WBE contract goals for this project were 11.00% MBE and 7.00% WBE. The M/W/SBE goals approved for this project were 11.00% MBE, 3.24% WBE, and 3.76% SBE. According to the Office of Business Opportunity, the actual participation achieved on this project was 14.99% MBE, 3.68% WBE, and 6.23% SBE. The MWSBE performance on this project was rated Outstanding for the following reasons: All goals were exceeded, and goal credit subcontractors were utilized. For the reasons listed, the MWSBE performance meets the good faith efforts requirements mandated by the City's MWSBE Program.

Summary:

ORDINANCE granting to **BEST TRASH, L.L.C.**, a Delaware Limited Liability Company, the right, privilege, and franchise to collect, haul, and transport solid waste and industrial waste from commercial properties located within the City of Houston, Texas, pursuant to Chapter 39, Code of Ordinances, Houston, Texas; providing for related terms and conditions; and making certain findings related thereto - **FIRST READING**

Background:

The Administration & Regulatory Affairs Department (ARA) recommends that City Council approve an ordinance granting a commercial solid waste operator franchise to Best Trash, L.L.C. Article VII of Chapter 39 of the City Code of Ordinances makes it unlawful for any commercial solid waste operator to collect, haul or transport solid waste or industrial waste from commercial properties located within the City without first having obtained a franchise for that purpose upon the consent of the City Council.

ARA's Franchise Administration Division collects franchise fees from commercial solid waste transporters, coordinates audits and compliance review and actively monitors state/federal legislation and administrative proceedings that impact these fees. The City currently has 256 solid waste operator franchises. For FY 2025, the total solid waste franchise revenue to the City is projected to be \$10,000,000.00.

The proposed ordinance grants the franchisee the right to use the City's public ways for the purpose of collecting, hauling, or transporting solid or industrial waste from commercial properties located within the City of Houston. In consideration for this grant, each franchisee agrees to pay to the City an annual franchise fee equal to four percent of their annual gross revenue, payable quarterly. To verify franchisee compliance with the franchise, the franchisee company has the duty to maintain required customer records, which the City has the right to inspect during regular business hours. The franchise agreement contains the City's standard release and indemnification, default and termination, liquidated damages, and force majeure provisions. Proposition A Council Member Item: Evening Public Session

Summary: ORDINANCE to allow evening Public Session hearings once a month.

Background: Currently, for the public to give input to their local government, they must come to City Council chambers on Tuesday afternoons. To improve access for residents who are unable to attend daytime Public Session hearings, these sessions need to be held in the evening.

Specific Explanation: This Ordinance is to allow the Public Session to occur in the evening at city council chambers the final scheduled hearing of each month at 6 pm instead of 2 pm.

Proposal:

Section 2-2

Rule 1 (a) shall be replaced with the following:

The city council shall conduct its regular weekly meeting in two daily sessions commencing at 1:30 p.m. on Tuesday and at 9:00 a.m. on Wednesday, respectively, of each calendar week. Each session shall be conducted in the city council chamber unless another place in the City Hall is designated by the city council. The final Tuesday session of each month shall take place at 5:30 p.m. Meetings shall recess at the times provided in Rule 7 and shall be subject to recess at other times as provided in subsection c, below. No notice shall be required to be given to any member of any recessed meeting. In the event that Tuesday or Wednesday, or both, of any calendar week falls on a holiday observed by the closure of city offices, then the regular weekly meeting sessions shall be rescheduled or consolidated as determined by the city council. The city council may consolidate daily sessions or reschedule any weekly meeting or daily session thereof to other days and times in the same calendar week and may for valid reasons postpone any regular weekly meeting or daily session to another week.

Rule 8 (a) shall be replaced with the following:

Any citizen of the city shall have a reasonable opportunity to be heard at all regular and special meetings of the city council in regard to any and all matters to be considered at such meetings that are germane and relevant to any subject matter of city affairs or business that is within the scope of the authority and legislative functions of the city council. Such appearances by members of the public shall be scheduled to begin at 2:00 p.m. at the Tuesday session of the regular meetings of city council. The last Tuesday session of each month shall be scheduled for 6:00 p.m. The mayor, mayor pro tem, or other presiding officer shall at all times be responsible for conducting the meeting and maintaining proper order and decorum. Any council member shall have the privilege of raising a point of order as to whether the subject matter to be heard and considered as presented by a citizen is germane and relevant to any subject matter of city affairs or business that is to be considered by city council.

Requests to appear shall be made to the office of the city secretary, and may be made in person or by mail, email, fax, or telephone, provided that the request is received before the scheduled time of commencement of the city council meeting session at which public appearances will be heard. Each speaker shall provide his or her name, street address, mailing address (if different), telephone number, and a brief description (not to exceed ten words) of the intended subject matter of the citizen's remarks. The speaker's street address, mailing address (if different), and telephone number is for internal, administrative use only by city council, the city secretary's office, and city departments, and shall not be disclosed publicly, except as required by law. Speakers who have not appeared at any of the four preceding regular city council meetings shall also state whether they wish to limit their remarks to one, two or three minutes.

Proposition A Council Member Item: Dress Code Ordinance

Ordinance: To amend Chapter 5 Article III. Dance Halls by adding to Sec. 5-46. – Definitions and Sec. 5-80. – Posting. See attached Exhibit A.

Background: For many club-goers and patrons of establishments in Houston, there is currently no ordinance that provides guidelines to clubs, restaurants, and other establishments, open to the public, how to notify individuals that they require a specific dress code for entry. This amendment will instruct all places open to the public that require a specific dress code, that the dress code policy must be posted at or near the entrance for the public to clearly see so anyone who wants to enter can be aware.

This ordinance is necessary to prevent operators of establishments from arbitrarily selecting who gains entry based on attire. It also gives operators the ability to demonstrate to individuals that a certain dress code is required, and it gives individuals clarity on what the expectations are for entry without any ambiguity.

Chapter 5 – AMUSEMENTS

Article III. - DANCE HALLS

Division 1. - GENERALLY

Sec. 5-46. Definitions.

The following words, terms and phrases, when used in this article, shall have the meanings provided below:

Alcoholic beverage means any beverage containing more than one-half of one percent of alcohol by volume that is capable of use for beverage purposes, either alone or when diluted.

Dance hall means any room, place, space or building where a public dance is authorized to be conducted, including but not limited to a nightclub.

Dance school means any room, place, space, building or academy in which dance instruction is provided for hire and used by an individual, group, or association for the purpose of educating and instructing its patrons in dance. The term does not include any room, place, space, building, or academy which functions, in whole or in part, as a nightclub.

Director means the director of the department of administration and regulatory affairs or the director's designee.

Licensee means any person who holds a license issued pursuant to this article.

Minor means a person under 18 years of age whose disabilities as a minor have not been removed by a court of competent jurisdiction.

Nightclub means any room, space, structure, or building open to the public where:

- (1) Food or any alcoholic beverage is served or consumed on the premises, including restaurants and cafes; and
- (2) Patrons are provided with a designated area for dancing or are permitted to dance.

Operator or *dance hall operator* means the on-site representative(s) who conducts, manages, maintains or controls, either directly or indirectly, any dance hall as defined and designated in this article.

Police chief means the chief of police or the police chief's designee.

Private dance means any dance to which admission is granted to members of a club, group, or similar organization, and their invited guests and from which the general public is excluded, including any dance held:

- (1) At any private residence;
- (2) At a members-only private club (i.e. country club, yacht club, etc.); or
- (3) At a facility that conducts private, invitation-only events where dancing may occur (i.e. wedding reception halls).

Public dance means any dance conducted in a dance hall to which the general public may gain admission by payment of a fee, purchase, possession or presentation of a ticket or token, or without payment of a fee, where dancing by the general public is conducted.

Security officer shall have the meaning ascribed in section 1702.002 of the Texas Occupations Code.

Teenage dance hall means any room, place, space or building where a public dance is conducted exclusively for persons under the legal age established by state law for purchase and consumption of alcoholic beverages and where the sale, consumption or possession of alcoholic beverages is prohibited.

Dress code means a set standard of rules specifying the required manner of dress an attendee must comply with for entry.

Division 2. LICENSE

Sec. 5-80. Posting.

A license issued under this division shall be posted by the licensee in a conspicuous place at or near the entrance to the dance hall so that it may be easily viewed by the public during the dance hall's hours of operation. Additionally, if owner, operator, or license requires a dress code for entry to a night club or dance hall, the complete dress code must be posted in a conspicuous place at or near the entrance of to the dance hall so that it may be easily viewed by the public during the dance hall so that it may be easily viewed by the public during the dance hall's hours of operation. If a dance hall or establishment does not have a dress code policy displayed near the entrance, it will be interpreted that there is no dress code, and no dress code policy shall be enforced.
