Amount and Source of Funding: **Finance Budget:** Appropriate: \$ 587,000.00 Parks Consolidated Construction Fund (4502) Re-allocate: 281,743.00 Parks Consolidated Construction Fund (4502) \$ 868,743.00 Total Funding SPECIFIC EXPLANATION: The General Services Department recommends that City Council award a construction contract to Gadberry Construction Company Inc on its low bid amount of \$797,700.00 to provide construction services for Meadowcreek Village Park Pavilion for the Houston Parks and Recreation Department. On June 25, 2014, Ordinance No. 2014-0665, City Council appropriated \$1,155,000.00 out of the Parks Consolidated Construction Fund to the Task Order and Job Order (TOC/JOC) Contracting Program for park improvements. Of this amount, \$281,743.00 was allocated for improvements to the Meadowcreek Pavilion. After finalizing the scope of work for the project, the construction costs exceeded the TOC/JOC work order limit of \$450,000.00; therefore it was appropriate to solicit bids for this project and reallocate the funds to this contract. PROJECT LOCATION: 5333 Berry Creek Drive (Key Map No. 536-S) PROJECT DESCRIPTION: The scope of work consists of a new pavilion structure and slab which replaces the old structure that was deemed unsafe and demolished. It was important to the community that the new structure have a similar architectural style as the old one with barrel roof and arched beams. Lighting, basketball goals, associated drainage and landscaping improvements will also be included. The contract duration for this project is 150 calendar days.
