**RECOMMENDATION: (Summary)**

The petition for the addition of 21.453 acres of land to Montgomery County Municipal Utility District No. 118 be approved.

**Amount and Source of Funding:**

**SPECIFIC EXPLANATION:**

Montgomery County Municipal Utility District No. 118 has petitioned the City of Houston for consent to add 21.453 acres of land to the district.

The Utility District Review Committee has evaluated the application with respect to wastewater collection and treatment, potable water distribution, storm water conveyance, and other public services.


The district is located in the vicinity of FM 1960, Cypresswood Drive, Spring Creek, and 59 Eastex Freeway. The district desires to add 21.453 acres, thus yielding a total of 881.979 acres. The district will be served by a regional plant, proposed Montgomery County Municipal Utility District No. 118 Regional Wastewater Treatment Plant. Other districts to be served by this proposed regional plant are Montgomery County Municipal Utility District Nos. 102, 103, 104, and 117. The nearest major drainage facility for Montgomery County Municipal Utility District No. 118 is Spring Creek which flows into the San Jacinto River and then into Lake Houston.

Potable water will be provided by the proposed Regional Water Plant Numbers 1, 2, and 3. By executing the Petition for Consent, the district has acknowledged that all plans for the construction of water conveyance, wastewater collection, and storm water collection systems within the district must be approved by the City of Houston prior to their construction.

The Utility District Review Committee recommends that the subject petition be approved.
