PROJECT DESCRIPTION: The scope of work consists of environmental abatement, underground tank removal, demolition of dangerous buildings, soil and groundwater remediation, loading, hauling and proper disposal of waste material generated because of all activities.

SCOPE OF CONTRACT AND FEE: Under the terms of each contract, task orders will be paid on a unit price basis. GSD negotiated the fees for all six contractors. Bids were obtained from the list of pre-qualified asbestos/lead, mold and soil remediation, demolition and petroleum storage tank removal contractors to act as the general contractor for the projects. All pre-qualified contractors were notified of the request for bids. The City Legal Department has previously determined that the formal bid process is not required for these types of contracts and that GSD may utilize the contractors on the pre-qualified list.

MBE/SBE PARTICIPATION: A 10.75% MBE goal and 5.38% WBE goal have been established for each contract. Each contractor will utilize the following certified firms to achieve the goals:
