**Background:**

**SUBJECT:** Petition for the City's consent to the addition of 1.2330 acres to Harris County Municipal Utility District No. 358 (Key Map No. 326X).

**RECOMMENDATION:** Petition for the City's consent to the addition of 1.2330 acres to Harris County Municipal Utility District No. 358 be approved.

**SPECIFIC EXPLANATION:** Harris County Municipal Utility District No. 358 was created through the TCEQ in 1993, and currently consists of 257.3314 acres within Harris County. The district is within the extraterritorial jurisdiction of the City and has petitioned the City for consent to add 1.2330 acres of undeveloped land, proposed to be a commercial development, to the district. The proposed annexation tract is located in the vicinity of U.S Hwy 290, Mason Road, Cypresswood Drive, and Fairfield Meadows Drive. The addition of land to the district does not release it from the City's extraterritorial jurisdiction.

The Utility District Review Committee has evaluated the application with respect to wastewater collection and treatment, potable water distribution, storm water conveyance, and other public services.

The District has a wastewater collection system and treatment facility. The annexation tract will be provided with wastewater treatment by the Harris County Municipal Utility District No. 358 Wastewater Treatment Facility. This regional plant also provides wastewater treatment to Harris County Municipal Utility District No. 322, Harris County Municipal Utility District No. 354, Harris County Municipal Utility District No. 396, and Harris County Municipal Utility District No. 397. Potable water is provided by the district.

The nearest major drainage facility for Harris County Municipal Utility District No. 358 is Cypress Creek, which flows into Spring Creek, then to the San Jacinto River, and finally into Lake Houston. The proposed annexation tract is not within the 100 or 500-year floodplain.

By executing the Petition for Consent, the district has acknowledged that all plans for the construction of water conveyance, wastewater collection, and storm water collection systems within the district must be approved by the City of Houston prior to their construction.

The Utility District Review Committee recommends that the subject petition be approved.
