DISTRICT E - MARTIN

Background:

SUBJECT: A resolution to nominate Kingwood Medical Center (KPH-CONSOLIDATION, INC) located at 22999 US Highway 59 North, Kingwood, TX 77339 as an Enterprise Project.

RECOMMENDATION: (Summary): Council approves a resolution to nominate Kingwood Medical Center I (KPH-CONSOLIDATION, INC) located at 22999 US Highway 59 North, Kingwood, TX 77339 as an Enterprise Project.

SPECIFIC EXPLANATION:

The Texas Enterprise Zone Program is an economic development tool for local communities to partner with the State of Texas to promote job creation and capital investment. A State Enterprise Zone is any census tract block group that has a 20% or higher poverty rate, as determined by the U.S. Census Bureau during each decennial census.

State law requires a municipality or county to nominate a project of a qualified business for designation as an Enterprise Project to participate in the Enterprise Zone Program. Legislation limits allocations to the state and local communities per biennium; the City is limited to a maximum of 9 project nominations. The current biennium cycle ends June 1, 2017 and the new cycle begins September 1, 2017. If the city does not use all 9 nominations, the unused nominations are forfeited and do not roll over to the next biennium cycle.

Enterprise Projects are eligible to apply for state sales and use tax refunds on qualified expenditures. The level and amount of a refund is based on the capital investment and jobs created or retained at the qualified business site. Depending on the investment amount, there is a maximum refund of a minimum of \$2,500 and up to \$7,500 per job to the company. The amount of the investment for this project will produce a maximum reimbursement of \$2,500 for up to 500

jobs or \$1,250,000 over a five year term, at an annual rate not to exceed \$250,000. The project site is not located within a Texas Enterprise Zone and therefore 35% of new jobs must be filled by residents of an enterprise zone or individuals who are economically disadvantaged. There is no city incentive offered with this nomination.

City Council adopted an ordinance authorizing the City to nominate projects for this state-funded incentive. This project was presented to the Economic Development committee on May 11, 2017. The City is nominating Kingwood Medical Center with a planned capital investment of \$30 million over the next five years, the creation of 100 new jobs, and the retention of 400 jobs. Of the \$30 million capital investment, \$19.5 million is associated with renovation/expansion costs, with \$9.3 million is associated with machinery and equipment.

Kingwood Medical Center is an acute care facility comprised of 24-hour emergency services, and an on-site minor emergency clinic. It is located in Northeast Houston along US Highway 59 North at Kingwood Drive. Kingwood Medical Center anticipates the addition of two floors to its existing South Tower and will provide an additional 22 ICU beds and 16 Intermediate care beds.

Summary:

ORDINANCE approving and authorizing Purchase and Sale Agreement between the City of Houston, Texas, Seller, and **AWAD INVESTMENT GROUP, INC**, **Purchaser**, for the sale of 5.033 acres of land located at 800 Dorsett Street, being a part of the John Brown Survey, Abstract Number 8, Houston, Harris County, Texas for \$863,000.00; approving and authorizing a Special Warranty Deed - **DISTRICT H-CISNEROS**

Background:

On July 9, 2014, Ordinance No. 2014-695, City Council declared **Parcel SY14-127** to be surplus property, appointed two independent appraisers to determine fair market value, and approved a Real Estate Listing Agreement with Cushman & Wakefield of Texas, Inc. (Cushman & Wakefield) to market the property for sale. The Real Estate Listing Agreement with Cushman & Wakefield was subsequently renewed on April 8, 2015 by Ordinance No. 2015-285. Thereafter, a proposed purchase agreement with Scrap Trading International was submitted to Council for consideration and was referred back to the Administration on April 12, 2017, by Motion No. 2017-0196.

The property's highest and best use is considered to be non-residential, commercial/industrial. Cushman & Wakefield actively marketed the property to developers, investors and builders through four commercial multiple-listing services, letters to the surrounding neighbors, and email blasts to industrial developers and brokers citywide. The results included strong offers from five quality purchasers. AWAD INVESTMENT GROUP, INC. submitted the highest offer and plans to hold the property for future investment.

Therefore, the General Services Department recommends that City Council approve and authorize a Purchase Agreement with AWAD INVESTMENT GROUP, INC. for the above-described property for a purchase price of \$863,000.00, which is above the appraised fair market value. It is further recommended that City Council authorize the Mayor to execute and the City Secretary to attest a Special Warranty Deed conveying the property to AWAD INVESTMENT GROUP, INC.

After payment of a 2% brokerage commission to Cushman & Wakefield, pursuant to the Real Estate Listing Agreement, the net sale proceeds will be directed to the General Fund.

PURCHASE AGREEMENT

This Purchase Agreement (this "<u>Agreement</u>") is between **THE CITY OF HOUSTON, TEXAS**, a municipal corporation situated in Harris, Fort Bend and Montgomery Counties, Texas (the "<u>City</u>"), and **AWAD INVESTMENT GROUP, INC.**, a Texas corporation ("<u>Buyer</u>"), to be effective as of the Effective Date (as hereinafter defined in Section 24 below).

RECITALS:

A. As of the Effective Date, the City is the fee title owner of that certain tract or parcel of land designated as:

Reid by deed dated September 17, 1923, of record in Volume 548, Page 353 Harris County Deed Records (H.C.D.R.), Harris County, Texas and also all of that called 5.03233 acre parcel of land conveyed from G.C.B.S., Inc. to the City of Houston by deed dated March 17, 1986, of record under Harris County Clerk's File Number (H.C.C.F. #) K473773, Film Code Number (F.C. #) 042-75-2263, Official Public Records of Real Property (O.P.R.R.P.), Harris County, Texas (the "Property").

The Property is more particularly described by metes and bounds on **Exhibit A** attached hereto.

AGREEMENTS:

NOW THEREFORE, in consideration of the promises set forth in this Agreement and other good and valuable consideration, the receipt and sufficiency of which is hereby acknowledged, the City and Buyer (the "Parties" or a "Party") hereby agree as follows:

1. <u>BINDING AGREEMENT</u>

This Agreement constitutes a binding agreement between the City and Buyer for the sale and purchase of the Property subject to the terms set forth in this Agreement. Subject to the limitations set forth in this Agreement, this Agreement shall bind and inure to the benefit of the Parties and their respective successors and assigns. This Agreement supersedes all other written or verbal agreements between the Parties concerning the transaction embodied in this Agreement. No claim of waiver or modification concerning the provisions of this Agreement shall be made against a Party unless based upon a written instrument signed by such Party.

2. THE TRANSFER DOCUMENTS

The Property shall be transferred and conveyed by execution by the City, and delivery by the City to Buyer, of a special warranty deed, a specimen of which is attached hereto as **Exhibit B** (the "<u>Deed</u>"). The Deed and all other documents to be executed and delivered at the Closing (defined below) by a Party are hereinafter collectively referred to as the "<u>Transfer Documents</u>."

3. PURCHASE PRICE

The price to be paid by Buyer to the City for the Property is Eight Hundred Sixty-Three Thousand and 00/100 Dollars (\$863,000.00) (the "Purchase Price"), which shall be payable by Buyer, at the Closing.

4. FEASIBILITY PERIOD, TITLE COMMITMENT AND SURVEY

(a) Within three (3) days of the Effective Date, Buyer shall deposit Twenty-Five Thousand and 00/100 DOLLARS (\$25,000.00) in the form of cash, check or wire transfer ("Earnest Money") with Charter Title Company, Attn: Lesley Mann, Closer, 800 Town and Country Blvd., Suite 210, Houston, Texas 77024 (the "Title Company"). The Title Company shall hold the Earnest Money as escrow agent. At Closing, or upon the occurrence of a default under this Agreement, the Title Company shall deliver the Earnest Money to the Party entitled to it by the other terms of this Agreement.

Provided, however, that One Thousand and No/100 Dollars (\$1,000.00) of the Earnest Money will be held in escrow by the Title Company as the "Independent Consideration" for the unrestricted right of Buyer to terminate during the Feasibility Period. At Closing, the Independent Consideration shall be applied to the Purchase Price. In the event the Closing does not occur, for any reason, the Independent Consideration shall be non-refundable to Buyer.

(b) Commencing at the Effective Date and ending at 11:59 p.m. local time, at the expiration of thirty (30) days from the Effective Date, Buyer shall have a period (the "Feasibility Period") during which Buyer may (1) examine any records regarding the Property in the City's custody, control, or possession, (2) examine and investigate the Property, and (3) conduct such tests and studies as Buyer may desire, including but not limited to environmental and asbestos testing, in order to determine if the Property is suitable for Buyer's purposes. Buyer shall indemnify, defend and hold harmless Seller, its elected officials, officers, directors, agents and employees from any injury or damage incurred in connection with any physical entry onto the Property to perform such testing. Buyer may terminate this Agreement for any reason, or for no reason, during the Feasibility Period. At the end of the Feasibility Period, Buyer shall notify Seller in writing if Buyer desires to terminate this Agreement. If Buyer does not so notify Seller, Buyer shall be deemed to have elected to proceed to Closing, subject to the terms hereof.

5. SURVEY AND TITLE COMMITMENT

- (a) Within ten (10) days from the Effective Date, the City will provide Buyer with a survey of the Property (the "Survey"). Within ten (10) days from the Effectve date, the City will provide Buyer with a Commitment for Title Insurance covering the Real Property (the "Title Commitment") prepared by the Title Company. Within ten (10) days from the Effective Date, the City will provide Buyer with copies of any environmental site assessments of the Property in the City's possession. If it desires, Buyer may, at its expense, cause to be prepared (and, if so, delivered to the City, Buyer and the Title Company) an updated Survey certified to the City, Buyer and the Title Company. In addition, Seller may, at its sole cost and expense, cause the Title Company to update the Title Commitment and have a copy delivered to the City and Buyer.
- (b) Following the receipt by Buyer of the Survey and Title Commitment, Buyer shall have until the end of the Feasibility Period to examine such items and to specify to Seller those items affecting the Property that Buyer finds objectionable (the "<u>Title Objections</u>"). Items shown in the Title Commitment or Survey and not objected to by Buyer in its written objections within the Feasibility Period shall be deemed items subject to which Buyer will accept title to the Property (the "<u>Permitted Encumbrances</u>"). Notwithstanding the foregoing, Buyer understands and agrees that, if it proceeds to Closing, it shall take title to the Property subject to billboard restrictions set forth in the Deed.
- (c) If Seller fails or is unwilling to cause any or all of the Title Objections to be removed or cured by the Closing Date to Buyer's reasonable satisfaction, or if the Title Commitment or Survey indicates that Seller does not own indefeasible fee simple title to the Property, Buyer shall have the following rights, as its sole and exclusive remedies:
- 1) Buyer may terminate this Agreement by giving Seller written notice thereof, in which event the Independent Consideration paid to the City shall be non-refundable, with the remainder of the Earnest Money released back to the Buyer, and neither Party shall thereafter have any further rights, duties, or obligations hereunder; or
- 2) Buyer may elect to waive the Title Objections not so removed or cured and close the purchase and sale contemplated by this Agreement without any reduction in the Purchase Price in accordance with the remaining terms and provisions, whereupon the Title Objections not so removed or cured shall become Permitted Encumbrances, to be treated in the manner provided herein for Permitted Encumbrances.

6. <u>IRS SECTION 1445</u>

The City shall furnish to the Title Company on or before the Closing Date a sworn affidavit (the "Non-Foreign Affidavit") stating under penalty of perjury that the City is not a "foreign person" as such term is defined in Section 1445 of the Internal Revenue Code of 1986, as amended (the "Code").

7. DELIVERY OF POSSESSION

Provided that Buyer has satisfied its obligations hereunder, the City shall deliver possession of the Property to Buyer at Closing, subject to the Permitted Encumbrances.

8. CONDITIONS PRECEDENT

- (a) In addition to all other conditions precedent set forth in this Agreement, Buyer's obligations to perform under this Agreement and to close the transaction contemplated by this Agreement are expressly subject to the following:
- 1) The delivery by the City to Buyer at Closing of executed originals of the Transfer Documents to be executed by the City (properly notarized where required).
- 2) The issuance to Buyer of an owner policy of title insurance (the "Owner Title Policy") (or a written commitment therefor) in the amount of the Purchase Price showing Buyer as owner in fee simple of the Property and subject only to the standard printed exceptions contained therein and to the Permitted Encumberances.
- 3) The delivery by the City to Buyer and the Title Company at Closing of any additional documents as may be reasonably required for the proper consummation of the transaction contemplated by this Agreement or that may be usual and customary in closing similar transactions.

If the foregoing conditions have not been satisfied by Closing, then Buyer shall have the right, as Buyer's sole and exclusive remedy, by giving written notice to the City and Title Company, to exercise the remedies available to Buyer in Section 12 of this Agreement.

- (b) In addition to all other conditions precedent set forth in this Agreement, the City's obligations to perform under this Agreement and to close the transaction contemplated by this Agreement are expressly subject to the following:
 - 1) Payment by Buyer of the Purchase Price;
- 2) The delivery by Buyer to the City at Closing of executed originals of the Transfer Documents to be executed by Buyer (properly notarized where required).
- 3) The delivery by Buyer to the City and the Title Company at Closing of any additional documents as may be reasonably required for the proper consummation of the transaction contemplated by this Agreement or that may be usual and customary in closing similar transactions.

If the foregoing conditions have not been satisfied by Closing, then the City shall have the right, as the City's sole and exclusive remedy, by giving written notice to Buyer and Title Company to exercise the remedies available to the City in Section 12 of this Agreement.

9. BROKERAGE

The City shall pay a 4% commission based on the Purchase Price to Cushman & Wakefield of Texas, Inc. (the "City's Broker"), which commission shall be equally split 50/50 between the City's Broker and the broker for the Buyer, in accordance with the terms of Section 7 of that certain Real Estate Listing Agreement by and between the City and the City's Broker made effective on April 17, 2015. Other than the preceding, the Parties warrant to one another that they have not dealt with any other finder, broker or Realtor in connection with this Agreement.

10. CLOSING

The consummation of the transactions contemplated by this Agreement (the "Closing") shall occur upon a date (the "Closing Date") that is on or before seven (7) days after the expiration of the Feasibility Period, unless postponed by mutual written agreement of the Parties.

11. <u>ASSIGNMENT</u>

Buyer may assign this Agreement or any right or interest hereunder only with the prior written consent of the City, which consent will not be unreasonably withheld conditioned, or delayed. Subject to the foregoing, this Agreement shall inure to the benefit of and be binding on the Parties hereto and their respective heirs, legal representatives, successors and permitted assigns. Any attempted assignment in violation hereof shall, at the election of the City, be of no force or effect and shall constitute a default by Buyer.

12. REMEDIES

- (a) The City's Breach. If the City fails or refuses to consummate the transaction in accordance with the terms of this Agreement (and Buyer is not in breach hereof), Buyer may, at Buyer's sole option and as Buyer's exclusive remedy, by written notice to the City and the Title Company, terminate this Agreement, and the Title Company shall release to Buyer the Earnest Money, less the Independent Consideration, with all accrued interest, whereupon, except as otherwise provided in this Agreement, neither of the Parties shall have any further liability or obligation hereunder. Buyer specifically waives any and all right to seek any other equitable relief and any and all right to seek actual, consequential, speculative, punitive or other damages.
- (b) <u>Buyer's Breach</u>. If Buyer fails or refuses to consummate the transaction in accordance with the terms of this Agreement (and the City is not in breach hereof), the City may, at the City's sole option and as the City's exclusive remedy, by written notice to Buyer and the Title Company, terminate this Agreement whereupon the Title Company shall release to the City the Earnest Money, with all accrued interest, and except as otherwise provided in this Agreement, neither of the Parties shall have any further liability or obligation hereunder. The City specifically waives any and all right to seek any other equitable relief and any and all right to seek actual, consequential, speculative, punitive or other damages.

(c) <u>Exclusive Remedies</u>. The City and Buyer agree that, except with respect to the breach of any obligations hereunder that expressly survive the termination of this Agreement or the Closing, the remedies provided in this Section 12 are the exclusive remedies to which the Parties shall be entitled, and the City and Buyer expressly waive and release any other remedies to which they may otherwise be entitled, at law or in equity.

13. NOTICES

(a) Addresses. Except as otherwise required by law, any notice required or permitted hereunder shall be in writing and shall be given by personal delivery, or by deposit in the U.S. Mail, certified or registered, return receipt requested, postage prepaid, addressed to the Parties at the addresses set forth below, or at such other address as a Party may designate in writing pursuant hereto, or tested fax number (with a copy to follow by overnight courier) or email address (with a copy to follow by overnight courier), or any express or overnight delivery service (e.g., Federal Express), delivery charges prepaid:

(b) Effective Date of Notices. Notice shall be deemed to have been given on the date on which notice is delivered, if notice is given by personal delivery, facsimile (with a copy to follow by overnight courier) or email (with a copy to follow by overnight courier), and on the date of deposit in the mail, if mailed or deposited with an overnight carrier. If notice is given by personal delivery, it will be deemed to have been received on the date on which the notice is received. If notice is given by mail, it will be deemed to have been received on the third (3rd) day following deposit in the U.S. Mail.

14. CLOSING COSTS

(a) <u>Prorations</u>. All normal and customarily proratable items, including but not limited to real estate and personal property taxes, rents, and utility bills, if any, shall be

prorated as of the Closing Date, Seller being charged and credited for all of the same up to such date and Buyer being charged and credited for all of same on and after such date. If the actual amounts to be prorated are not known at the Closing Date, the prorations shall be made on the basis of the best evidence available, and thereafter, when actual figures are received, a cash settlement will be made between Seller and Buyer. Seller hereby acknowledges that Buyer is not subject to ad valorem taxes.

(b) <u>Closing Costs</u>. The City and Buyer agree to pay closing costs as indicated in this Section and in the other Sections of this Agreement. At Closing, the City shall pay (i) the costs of releasing any encumbrances that the City elects to release, (ii) the cost of the issuance of the Owner Title Policy, and (iii) any other costs to be paid by the City under this Agreement. At Closing, Buyer shall pay (i) recording fees related to the Transfer Documents, and (ii) any other costs to be paid by Buyer under this Agreement. Except as otherwise provided for in this Agreement, the City and Buyer will each be solely responsible for and bear all of their own respective expenses, including, without limitation, expenses of legal counsel, accountants, and other advisors incurred at any time in connection with pursuing or consummating the transaction contemplated herein. Any other closing costs not specifically designated as the responsibility of either Party in this Agreement shall be paid by the City and Buyer according to the usual and customary allocation of the same by Title Company.

15. <u>APPROVALS</u>

Concerning all matters in this Agreement requiring the consent or approval of any Party, the Parties agree that any such consent or approval shall not be unreasonably withheld unless otherwise provided in this Agreement. Buyer acknowledges that the City is not bound to any agreement until an ordinance has been passed by the City Council of the City of Houston.

16. ADDITIONAL ACTS

The Parties agree to execute promptly such other documents and to perform such other acts as may be reasonably necessary to carry out the terms and provisions of this Agreement.

17. GOVERNING LAW; JURISDICTION; VENUE

This Agreement shall be construed and the rights and obligations of the City and Buyer hereunder determined in accordance with the internal laws of the state in which the Property is located without regard to the principles of choice of law or conflicts of law. In recognition of the benefits of having any disputes with respect to this Agreement resolved by an experienced and expert person, the City and Buyer hereby agree that any suit, action, or proceeding, whether claim or counterclaim, brought or instituted by any Party on or with respect to this Agreement or which in any way relates, directly or indirectly, to this Agreement or any event, transaction, or occurrence arising out of or in any way connected with this Agreement or the Property, or the dealings of the Parties

with respect thereto, shall be tried only by a court and not by a jury in any competent court in Harris County, Texas. EACH PARTY HEREBY EXPRESSLY WAIVES ANY RIGHT TO A TRIAL BY JURY IN ANY SUCH SUIT, ACTION, OR PROCEEDING.

18. CONSTRUCTION

The terms and provisions of this Agreement represent the results of negotiations among the Parties, each of which has been represented by counsel of its own choosing, and neither of which has acted under any duress or compulsion, whether legal, economic or otherwise. Consequently, the terms and provisions of this Agreement shall be interpreted and construed in accordance with their usual and customary meanings. The Parties each hereby waive the application of any rule of law which would otherwise be applicable in connection with the interpretation and construction of this Agreement and agree that ambiguous or conflicting terms or provisions contained in this Agreement shall be interpreted or construed against the Party whose attorney prepared the executed Agreement or any earlier draft of the same.

19. TIME OF ESSENCE

Time is of the essence in this Agreement. However, if this Agreement requires any act to be done or action to be taken on a date which is a Saturday, Sunday or legal holiday, such act or action shall be deemed to have been validly done or taken if done or taken on the next day which is not a Saturday, Sunday or legal holiday, and the successive period shall be deemed extended accordingly.

20. INTERPRETATION

If there is any specific and direct conflict between, or any ambiguity resulting from, the terms and provisions of this Agreement and the terms and provisions of any document, instrument or other agreement executed in connection herewith or in furtherance hereof, including any Exhibits hereto, the same shall be consistently interpreted in such manner as to give effect to the general purposes and intention as expressed in this Agreement, which shall be deemed to prevail and control.

21. HEADINGS AND COUNTERPARTS

The headings of this Agreement are for reference only and shall not limit or define the meaning of any provision of this Agreement. This Agreement may be executed in any number of counterparts, each of which shall be an original but all of which shall constitute one and the same instrument.

22. MISCELLANEOUS

All exhibits to this Agreement are fully incorporated herein as though set forth at length herein. "Include", "includes" and "including" as used in this Agreement shall be deemed to be followed by ", but not limited to," whether or not they are in fact followed by such words or words of like import. "Hereof", "herein", "hereunder" and comparable terms refer, unless otherwise expressly indicated, to the entire agreement or instrument

in which such terms are used and not to any particular article, section or other subdivision thereof or attachment thereto. References in an instrument to "Article", "Section", "Subsection" or another subdivision or to an attachment are, unless the context otherwise requires, to an article, section, subsection or subdivision of or an attachment to such agreement or instrument.

23. SEVERABILITY

If any provision of this Agreement is unenforceable, the remaining provisions shall nevertheless be kept in effect.

24. EFFECTIVE DATE

The date this Agreement is signed by the Buyer and Seller, countersigned by the City Controller of the City of Houston, and received by the Title Company's signature on the Contract and Earnest Money Receipt attached hereto, shall be the "Effective Date" of this Agreement.

25. ENTIRE AGREEMENT

This Agreement contains the entire agreement between the Parties and supersedes all prior agreements, oral or written, with respect to the subject matter hereof. The provisions of this Agreement shall be construed as a whole and not strictly for or against any Party.

26. AS-IS; DISCLAIMER

THE CITY HAS NOT MADE, DOES NOT MAKE AND SPECIFICALLY DISCLAIMS ANY REPRESENTATIONS, WARRANTIES, PROMISES, COVENANTS. AGREEMENTS OR GUARANTEES OF ANY KIND OR CHARACTER WHATSOEVER, WHETHER EXPRESS OR IMPLIED, ORAL OR WRITTEN, PAST, PRESENT OR FUTURE, OF, AS TO, CONCERNING OR WITH RESPECT TO: (A) THE NATURE, QUALITY OR CONDITION OF THE PROPERTY, INCLUDING, WITHOUT LIMITATION, THE WATER, SOIL AND GEOLOGY; (B) THE SUITABILITY OF THE PROPERTY FOR ANY AND ALL ACTIVITIES AND USES WHICH BUYER MAY CONDUCT THEREON; (C) THE COMPLIANCE OF OR BY THE PROPERTY OR ITS OPERATION WITH ANY LAWS, RULES, ORDINANCES OR REGULATIONS OF ANY APPLICABLE GOVERNMENTAL AUTHORITY OR BODY; (D) THE HABITABILITY, MERCHANTABILITY OR FITNESS FOR A PARTICULAR PURPOSE OF THE PROPERTY; (E) THE PRESENCE OF ANY ENDANGERED OR THREATENED SPECIES ON THE PROPERTY, AS WELL AS THE SUITABILITY OF THE PROPERTY AS HABITAT FOR ANY OF THOSE SPECIES; (F) THE ACCURACY OR COMPLETENESS OF ANY MATERIALS GENERATED BY THIRD PARTIES FOR THE CITY WHICH ARE PROVIDED TO BUYER UNDER THE PROVISIONS OF THIS AGREEMENT OR OTHERWISE; (G) THE ENFORCEABILITY OR EFFECT OF ANY LEGAL, CONTRACTUAL OR OTHER RIGHTS OR OBLIGATIONS PERTAINING TO THE PROPERTY; OR (H) ANY OTHER MATTER WITH RESPECT TO THE PROPERTY.

- BUYER HEREBY ACKNOWLEDGES AND AGREES THAT. BEING GIVEN THE OPPORTUNITY TO INSPECT THE PROPERTY, IF THIS TRANSACTION IS CONSUMMATED, BUYER WILL BE PURCHASING THE PROPERTY PURSUANT BUYER'S INDEPENDENT EXAMINATION. STUDY. INSPECTION AND KNOWLEDGE OF THE PROPERTY AND BUYER IS RELYING UPON ITS OWN DETERMINATION OF THE VALUE AND CONDITION OF THE PROPERTY AND NOT ON ANY INFORMATION PROVIDED OR TO BE PROVIDED BY THE CITY, BUYER FURTHER ACKNOWLEDGES AND AGREES THAT ANY INFORMATION PROVIDED OR TO BE PROVIDED WITH RESPECT TO THE PROPERTY WAS OR WILL BE OBTAINED FROM A VARIETY OF SOURCES AND THAT THE CITY HAS NOT MADE AND WILL NOT BE OBLIGATED TO MAKE ANY INDEPENDENT INVESTIGATION OR VERIFICATION OF SUCH INFORMATION AND THE CITY MAKES NO REPRESENTATIONS OR WARRANTIES OF ANY KIND AS TO THE ACCURACY OR COMPLETENESS OF SUCH INFORMATION TO THE EXTENT GENERATED BY THIRD PARTIES FOR THE CITY. BUYER IS RELYING UPON ITS OWN INSPECTIONS, INVESTIGATIONS, RESEARCH AND ANALYSES IN ENTERING INTO THIS AGREEMENT AND IS NOT RELYING IN ANY WAY UPON ANY REPRESENTATIONS, WARRANTIES, STATEMENTS, PLANS, SPECIFICATIONS, COST ESTIMATES, STUDIES, REPORTS, DESCRIPTIONS, GUIDELINES OR OTHER INFORMATION OR MATERIAL FURNISHED BY THE CITY OR ITS REPRESENTATIVES TO BUYER OR ITS REPRESENTATIVES, WHETHER ORAL OR WRITTEN, EXPRESS OR IMPLIED, OF ANY NATURE WHATSOEVER REGARDING ANY SUCH MATTERS. THE CITY SHALL HAVE NO LIABILITY WITH RESPECT TO THE ACCURACY OR COMPLETENESS OF SUCH DELIVERED INFORMATION.
- (c) THE OCCURRENCE OF CLOSING WILL CONSTITUTE AN ACKNOWLEDGEMENT BY BUYER THAT THE PROPERTY WAS ACCEPTED WITHOUT REPRESENTATION OR WARRANTY, STATUTORY, EXPRESS OR IMPLIED, AND OTHERWISE IN AN "AS IS, WHERE IS, AND WITH ALL FAULTS" CONDITION BASED ON BUYER'S OWN INSPECTION THEREOF. BUYER FURTHER ACKNOWLEDGES AND AGREES THAT THERE ARE NO ORAL AGREEMENTS, WARRANTIES OR REPRESENTATIONS COLLATERAL TO OR AFFECTING THE PROPERTY BY THE CITY, ANY AGENT OF THE CITY OR ANY THIRD PARTY. THE CITY IS FURTHER NOT LIABLE OR BOUND IN ANY MANNER BY ANY ORAL OR WRITTEN STATEMENTS, REPRESENTATIONS, OR INFORMATION PERTAINING TO THE PROPERTY FURNISHED BY ANY REAL ESTATE BROKER, AGENT, EMPLOYEE, SERVANT OR OTHER PERSON, UNLESS THE SAME ARE EXPRESSLY SET FORTH OR REFERRED TO HEREIN.
- (d) BUYER RELEASES THE CITY AND ITS ELECTED OFFICIALS, OFFICERS, AGENTS, REPRESENTATIVES AND EMPLOYEES (TOGETHER WITH THE CITY, THE "CITY RELATED PARTIES") FROM ANY AND ALL CLAIMS, LOSSES, DAMAGES, LIABILITIES, COSTS AND EXPENSES WHICH BUYER OR ANY PARTY RELATED TO OR AFFILIATED WITH BUYER HAS OR MAY HAVE ARISING FROM OR RELATED TO ANY MATTER OR THING RELATED TO THE PROPERTY OR THE PHYSICAL CONDITION OF THE PROPERTY, ANY CONSTRUCTION DEFECTS, ANY ERRORS OR OMISSIONS IN THE DESIGN OR

CONSTRUCTION OF THE PROPERTY AND ANY ENVIRONMENTAL CONDITIONS AT, IN, ON OR UNDER THE PROPERTY, AND BUYER WILL NOT LOOK TO ANY OF THE CITY RELATED PARTIES IN CONNECTION WITH THE FOREGOING FOR ANY REDRESS OR RELIEF. THIS RELEASE INCLUDES CLAIMS OF WHICH BUYER IS PRESENTLY UNAWARE OR WHICH BUYER DOES NOT PRESENTLY SUSPECT TO EXIST WHICH, IF KNOWN BY BUYER, WOULD MATERIALLY AFFECT BUYER'S RELEASE TO THE CITY. THIS RELEASE WILL BE GIVEN FULL FORCE AND EFFECT ACCORDING TO EACH OF ITS EXPRESS TERMS AND PROVISIONS, INCLUDING THOSE RELATING TO UNKNOWN AND UNSUSPECTED CLAIMS, DAMAGES AND CAUSES OF ACTION.

- (e) TO THE EXTENT REQUIRED TO BE OPERATIVE, THE DISCLAIMERS, RELEASES AND/OR WARRANTIES CONTAINED IN THIS SECTION ARE "CONSPICUOUS" FOR PURPOSES OF ANY APPLICABLE LAW, RULE, REGULATION OR ORDER.
- (f) The terms set forth in the foregoing Sections 26(a) through (e) will survive the Closing and will not merge into the Transfer Documents.

Summary:

ORDINANCE approving and authorizing contract between the City of Houston and DEAN'S NUTRITIONAL FOOD SERVICE INC for Houston Parks and Recreation Department's Summer Food Service Program, subject to the receipt of sufficient grant funds from the Texas Department of Agriculture; providing a maximum contract amount - 5 Years -\$7,695,324.00 - Grant Fund

Background:

The Houston Parks and Recreation Department (HPARD) recommends City Council approve an ordinance awarding a contract in the amount of \$1,516,320 for the first year with four one-year extension option terms in the amount of \$ 6,179,004 for a total of five (5) years and \$7,695,324 to Dean's Nutritional Food Service Inc. for HPARD's Summer Food Service Program (SFSP). Dean Nutritional Food Service Inc. submitted the best offer for lunches and snacks on serving approximately 8,000 daily lunches and snacks between June 5, 2017 and may continue through August 17, 2018. For each renewal period after 2018, the (SFSP) shall begin and end on the dates as may be set by HPARD's Director in conjunction with the academic school calendar year.

In the first year and in all option years, the contract amount is limited to the grant amount awarded by the Texas Department of Agriculture (TDA). The total amount of the project for the five-year contract term period shall not exceed \$7,695,324. The contract term may be terminated at any time during the term of the contract if the TDA grant is not approved by City Council or if the State of Texas cancels or does not approve funding for the food service. The SFSP is projected to increase in size over the option years, and this contract will assist HPARD with the advanced planning and preparation of this increase. The free lunch(es) and snack(s) will be served to participants of the HPARD's Summer Food Service Program at approximately 350 feeding sites. A complete list of sites with their Council Districts is attached.

This solicitation was advertised in the Houston Chronicle, Houston Business Journal and in the City of Houston's Strategic Purchasing e-bid Web site. Thirty Nine (39) vendors viewed the solicitation. Three (3) vendors downloaded the bid package along with the following responses:

- Dean's Nutritional Food Service Inc.
- Revolution Foods Inc.

No Bid – Vendors:

Houston Independent School District/Aramark

HPARD staff contacted the vendors who downloaded the ITB but did not respond. The primary reason given for not responding was that the number of meals exceeds their capacity. Both responsive vendors. Dean's Nutritional Food Service Inc., and Revolution Foods Inc., submitted their bid proposal and were reviewed by HPARD staff and evaluated on the following criteria with the listed maximum point values:

- Company Information, Background and Key Personnel (10 Points)
- Overall Level of Company Expertise/Knowledge of Related Services (15 Points)
 - Demonstrated experience on projects similar in size and scope to this ITB
 - · Company track record
 - Quality of proposed plan of action to meet City's Car-Share program
 - Level of quality of a detailed portfolio.

- Loter or quality or a actalica persione
- Confirmation to ITB Requirements
- Adequacy of plant facilities for food preparation, with approved license(s) certification that facilities meet all applicable State and Local health, safety and sanitation standards.
- Other factors such as transportation capability, sanitation and packaging
- Degree of Thoroughness and Quality Responses on Client References (5 Points)
- M/WBE Subcontracting Participation (5 Points)
 - Ability to meet the required 18% level of subcontracting participation, or a demonstrative Good Faith Efforts presented by Bidder.
- Financial Strength (25 Points)
 - Audited financial statements for past five (5) years, and Federal Tax Forms filed to the Internal Revenue Service (IRS) for the past two fiscal years (or) Dunn & Bradstreet Report.
- o Cost Meals (Lunches) and Supplements (Snacks) (40 Points)

The vendor contract was approved by the State of Texas and supports a federally funded program that provides lunches and supplements (snacks) that meet the Federally Regulated Child Nutritional Standards required by the grant program. HPARD applied for a SFSP grant from the Texas Department of Agriculture to cover the cost of offering free lunches and snacks to approximately 8,000 daily participants.

Dean's Nutritional Food Service Inc., proposal is in compliance with the solicitation and State grant requirements, which include the following:

- 1. The unit cost ensures sufficient residual from per unit grant allocation to cover program administration and operating costs.
- 2. Business license, referrals, Bid Bond, and confirmed prices were inclusive of milk, juice, packaging, transportation and condiments.
- 3. MWBE documentation
- 4. Appropriate evidence that corrective actions of any and all Health Department violations are in compliance with the City of Houston's inspection guidelines.

Item Title: PRD - Dean's Nutritional Food Service Inc., Summer Food Service Program

Background:

The Houston Parks and Recreation Department (HPARD) recommends City Council approve an ordinance awarding a contract in the amount of \$1,516,320 for the first year with four one-year extension option terms in the amount of \$6,179,004 for a total of five (5) years and \$7,695,324 to Dean's Nutritional Food Service Inc. for HPARD's Summer Food Service Program (SFSP). Dean Nutritional Food Service Inc. submitted the best offer for lunches and snacks on serving approximately 8,000 daily lunches and snacks between June 5, 2017 and may continue through August 17, 2018. For each renewal period after 2018, the (SFSP) shall begin and end on the dates as may be set by HPARD's Director in conjunction with the academic school calendar year.

In the first year and in all option years, the contract amount is limited to the grant amount awarded by the Texas Department of Agriculture (TDA). The total amount of the project for the five-year contract term period shall not exceed \$7,695,324. The contract term may be terminated at any time during the term of the contract if the TDA grant is not approved by City Council or if the State of Texas cancels or does not approve funding for the food service. The SFSP is projected to increase in size over the option years, and this contract will assist HPARD with the advanced planning and preparation of this increase. The free lunch(es) and snack(s) will be served to participants of the HPARD's Summer Food Service Program at approximately 350 feeding sites. A complete list of sites with their Council Districts is attached.

This solicitation was advertised in the Houston Chronicle, Houston Business Journal and in the City of Houston's Strategic Purchasing e-bid Web site. Thirty Nine (39) vendors viewed the solicitation, Three (3) vendors downloaded the bid package along with the following responses:

Solicited Responsive Vendors:

- Dean's Nutritional Food Service Inc.
- Revolution Foods Inc.

No Bid – Vendors:

Houston independent School District/Aramark

HPARD staff contacted the vendors who downloaded the ITB but did not respond. The primary reason given for not responding was that the number of meals exceeds their capacity. Both responsive vendors, Dean's Nutritional Food Service Inc., and Revolution Foods Inc., submitted their bid proposal and were reviewed by HPARD staff and evaluated on the following criteria with the listed maximum point values:

- Company Information, Background and Key Personnel (10 Points)
- Overall Level of Company Expertise/Knowledge of Related Services (15 Points)

- Demonstrated experience on projects similar in size and scope to this ITB
- Company track record
- Quality of proposed plan of action to meet City's Car-Share program
- Level of quality of a detailed portfolio
- Confirmation to ITB Requirements
- Adequacy of plant facilities for food preparation, with approved license(s) certification that facilities meet all applicable State and Local health, safety and sanitation standards.
- Other factors such as transportation capability, sanitation and packaging
- Degree of Thoroughness and Quality Responses on Client References (5 Points)
- o M/WBE Subcontracting Participation (5 Points)
 - Ability to meet the required 18% level of subcontracting participation, or a demonstrative Good Faith Efforts presented by Bidder.
- o Financial Strength (25 Points)
 - Audited financial statements for past five (5) years, and Federal Tax Forms filed to the Internal Revenue Service (IRS) for the past two fiscal years (or) Dunn & Bradstreet Report.

Dean's Nutritional Food Service Inc., proposal is in compliance with the solicitation and State grant requirements, which include the following:

Summary:

ORDINANCE approving and authorizing Amendment No. 1 to an Airport Use and Lease Agreement by and between the City of Houston and **AMERICAN AIRLINES**, **INC**, for certain premises at George Bush Intercontinental Airport/Houston - **DISTRICT B - DAVIS**

Background:

RECOMMENDATION:

Enact an ordinance approving and authorizing Amendment No. 1 to the Airport Use and Lease Agreement with American Airlines, Inc., for space in Terminal A at George Bush Intercontinental Airport/Houston (IAH).

SPECIFIC EXPLANATION:

The Use and Lease Agreement (U&L) with American Airlines, Inc. was approved by City Council, Ordinance No. 01-0069, and countersigned by the City Controller on January 24, 2001. The U&L defines the terms and conditions by which American may use the airfield for aircraft operations, lease space in Terminal A, and use the common areas of Terminal A at George Bush Intercontinental Airport/Houston (IAH).

American Airlines parent company, AMR Corp., has merged and consolidated with US Airways Group, Inc., and the remaining airline, American Airlines (American), is consolidating the operations of both companies in Terminal A. As a consequence of its larger combined operations, American will open an Admirals Club Lounge in Terminal A.

Amendment No. 1 to the U&L consolidates the operations of American Airlines and US Airways and adds space to accommodate the opening of a new Admirals Club Lounge. American's consolidation requires moving into space currently occupied by HAS employees, which American will relocate elsewhere in Terminal A. Section 4. The City Attorney is hereby authorized to take all action necessary to enforce all legal obligations under said contract without further authorization from Council.

Section 5. 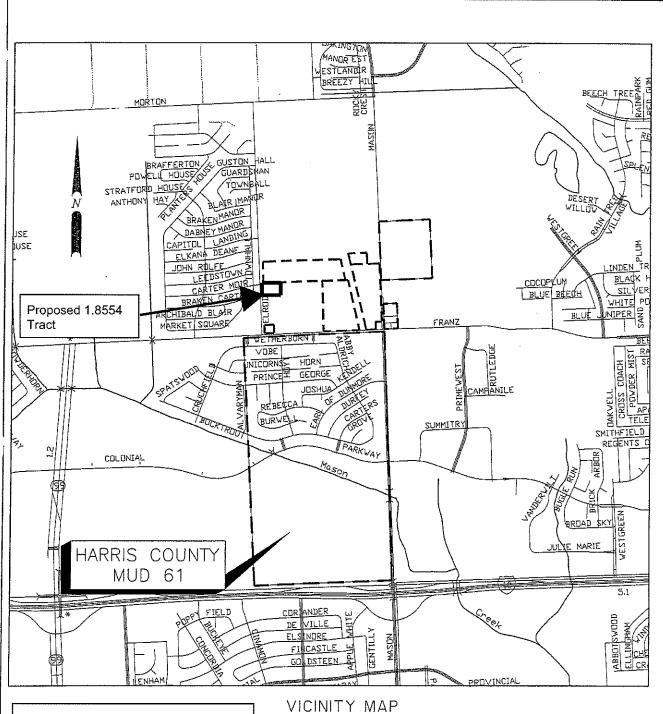

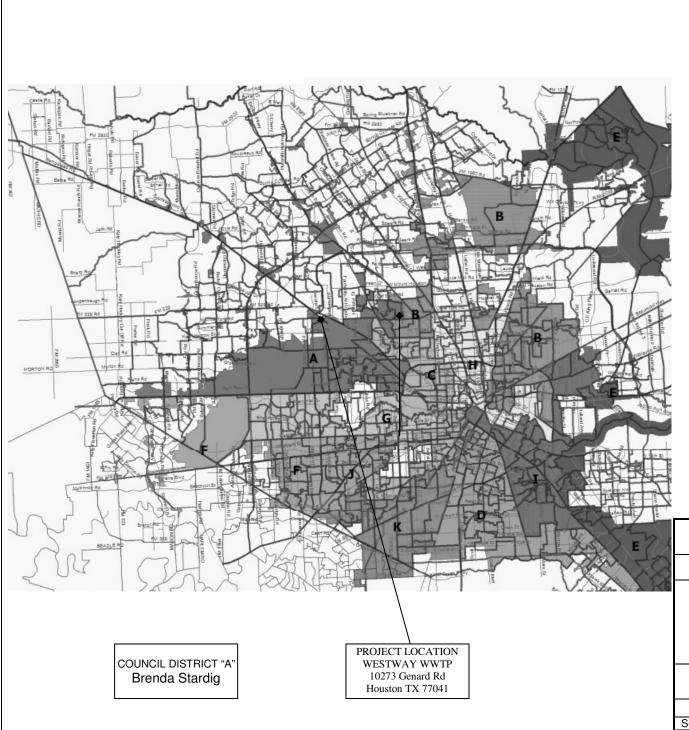
