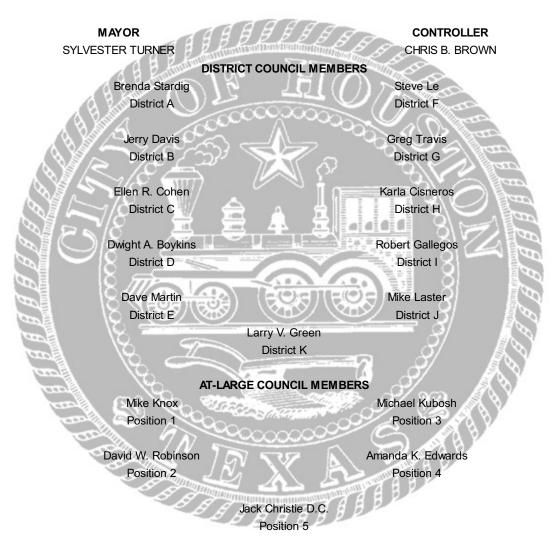

Background:

Subject: Motion approving payment to the Greater Houston Partnership for corporate membership at the managing partnership level.

RECOMMENDATION:

Approve a motion authorizing payment to the Greater Houston Partnership for premium corporate membership at the managing partner level.

SPECIFIC EXPLANATION:

Historically the City of Houston had a contract with the Greater Houston Partnership (GHP) to promote economic development and other specified services, which renewed annually at a cost of \$376,125.00. In November 2014, GHP requested that the Mayor's Office not renew the contract moving forward but rather obtain GHP services through membership. In 2016, the City of Houston negotiated an enhanced membership package with GHP, consisting of managing partner membership, research services and event attendance for a total amount of \$80,000.00. This membership option was in lieu of a contractual relationship. The City renewed membership in calendar year 2017.

For calendar year 2018, the City of Houston Chief Development Officer recommends that City Council approve an expenditure of \$80,000.00, which covers the expanded managing partner membership level at GHP and key services prioritized by the City of Houston, but that are available to all GHP's membership. Expanded membership encompasses the opportunity to make custom research requests for economic development purposes, in addition to other benefits. Enhanced membership does not include membership on the Board of Directors or the Executive Committee of the GHP.

GHP has worked since 1989 to promote Houston as the location of choice for conducting business, with a focus on increasing Houston's economic prosperity. The GHP will continue to make its research capabilities available on a systematic basis to the City of Houston, Houston First and the Greater Houston Convention and Visitors Bureau to facilitate the creation of professional,

sophisticated marketing reports that include economic and demographic data to sell the benefits and capabilities of the City to various convention, corporate meeting and sports related groups.

In addition, GHP will continue to host major business and community events that help market the City of Houston and specific assets, such as the State of the City and State of the Airports events. As part of its membership, the City of Houston is given opportunities to participate in additional events with high promotional value.

Summary:

Background:

SPD-CMH-08282017-002 - Approve payment to Yellow Cab of Houston, Inc., to address emergency disaster recovery activities as a result of Hurricane Harvey for transportation services in the amount of \$23,262.46 for Administration and Regulatory Affairs Department.

Specific Explanation:

The Director of Administration and Regulatory Affairs Department and the Chief Procurement Officer recommend that City Council approve payment to **Yellow Cab of Houston, Inc.**, for transportation services in the amount of **\$23,262.46** to address emergency disaster recovery activities because of Hurricane Harvey.

During FY2018, the Houston Health Department previously issued a purchase order to Yellow Cab totaling \$45,030.00. With the issuance of this purchase order of \$23,262.46, the aggregate total will be \$68,292.46 and therefore, requires City Council approval.

Hurricane Harvey flooded many homes throughout Houston and displaced many residents to shelters until more permanent housing was available. The taxi voucher program with Yellow Cab of Houston, Inc., assisted people in shelters with transportation to and from transitional housing in the aftermath of the hurricane. This program was necessary to regulate the shelter population and increased public health and safety which could be jeopardized by overcrowding. Yellow Cab of Houston, Inc., completed this project on November 30, 2017.

Yellow Cab of Houston, Inc., was selected for best quality of service as the firm could provide immediate mobilization of licensed and qualified professionals to coordinate with City personnel to restore City facilities as soon as possible.

This recommendation was made pursuant to Chapter 252, Section 252.022 (a) (2) "a procurement necessary to preserve or protect the public health or safety of the municipality's residents" of the Texas Local Government Code for exempted procurements.

M/WBE Participation:

OBO approves the waiver of an M/WBE goal on this procurement because, as per Chapter 15 of the Code of Ordinance, a waiver is appropriate when a public or administrative emergency exists which requires the goods or services to be provided with unusual immediacy.

Hire Houston First:

The proposed procurement may be funded by a federal grant; therefore, exempt from "Hire Houston First" (HHF) ordinance that promotes economic opportunity for Houston Business and support job creation.

Disaster Recovery Note:

This item is related to the impact of Hurricane Harvey DR4332 and it is the City's intent to seek reimbursement from the Federal Emergency Management Agency ("FEMA") and other eligible sources for such expenditures.

Summary:

RESOLUTION confirming support for the proposed development as affordable rental housing of certain properties, each located in the City of Houston, Texas, and the submittal of applications for Housing Tax Credits for such developments - <u>DISTRICTS A - STARDIG; B - DAVIS;</u> <u>C - COHEN; D - BOYKINS; F - LE; H - CISNEROS; I - GALLEGOS; J - LASTER and K - GREEN</u>

Background:

The Housing and Community Development Department (HCDD) recommends approval of a Resolution of Support for each of the 26 applications in the City of Houston for competitive 9% housing tax credits (HTCs) allocated by the Texas Department of Housing and Community Affairs (TDHCA). Numerous applications will be submitted to TDHCA and the amount of available 9% HTCs is limited. It will not be known which, if any, of these projects will receive HTCs until the end of July 2018 when awards are announced.

Only preliminary information is available regarding the applications and HCDD has not underwritten these projects for financial viability. HCDD reviewed the applications to determine they meet the community development policy objectives of the City and meet certain Minimum Standards. Applications were required to meet a total of <u>6 points</u> of the criteria outlined below to receive a Resolution of Support.

- Sites located within Houston city limits (this excludes sites located within the Houston ETJ). 2 points
- 2. Sites located within 4 miles of City Hall 1 point
- 3. Sites located within the boundaries of a Complete Community. 2 points
- 4. Sites located within 1 mile of a Complete Community 1 point
- 5. Sites located within a Concentrated Revitalization Area 2 points
- 6. Sites located within an underserved area described as the following:

i. Within a census tract that has no other affordable housing development funded with LIHTC – 1 point

ii. Within a census tract if the contiguous census tracts do not have any affordable housing developments funded with LIHTC – **2 points**

- 1. Sites that that promote access to mass transportation options described as the following:
 - i. Sites located within a ${}^{1\!\!/}_{4}$ mile of any public transportation stop 1 point

ii.Sites located within a $\frac{1}{4}$ mile to high frequency public transportation stop. High frequency transit service is defined as service arriving every 15 minutes on average from 6 am to 8 p.m. seven days a week – **2 points**

- Sites with reduced poverty concentration described as the following

 Site census tract is less than 15% 2 points

 Site census tract is less than 20% 1 point
- Sites zoned to and A or B rated school based on Children at Risk rankings

 Elementary School 2 points
 Middle School 2 points
 - iii.High School 2 points
- 1. Demonstration of community support that the applicant has sought, received and implemented views and recommendations from members of the community regarding the proposed development. **1 point**

Based on these criteria, the projects listed below have achieved the minimum of 6 point threshold and qualify for a Resolution of Support.

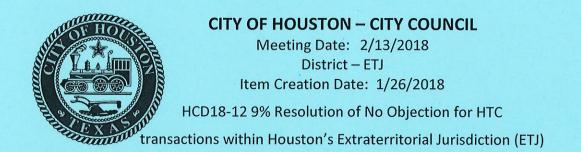

Background:

This request concerns resolution of an inverse condemnation lawsuit. In 2007, the City of Houston purchased 2.3 acres of real property located at 7277 Regency Square ("Property"). The Property is currently being used as the Houston Police Department's Midwest Station. The deed to the Property includes an obligation to pay certain semiannual assessments to Plaintiff Regency Square Improvement Association for the maintenance and upkeep of common areas with other property owners in the business district. This obligation was included in the original deed documents when the business district was originally developed in 1977.

The City did not pay the assessments when it purchased the property in 2007, or at any subsequent years, prompting the filing of a lawsuit styled *Regency Square Improvement Association v. City of Houston, a Municipal Corporation Situated in Harris, Fort Bend and Montgomery Counties, Texas*; Cause No. 2014-11660, in the 295th Judicial District Court of Harris County, Texas. The City is not immune from lawsuits seeking to compel payment of deed assessments that run with the land. To refuse to do so is akin to a "taking" of a property right. The measure of damages is the monetary value of the right to assess maintenance fees for the duration of the City's ownership of the Property.

This case was conditionally settled at mediation for \$73,000, subject to council approval. Based on historical assessments and future forecasts, \$73,000 is a fair and reasonable valuation of the assessment rights, both past and future. The proposed settlement would forever extinguish the City's obligation to pay the assessments on the Property.

After a thorough review, the Legal Department recommends that Council approve the Compromise and Settlement Agreement and issuance of warrant payable as follows:

\$73,000.00 to Regency Square Improvement Association

Background:

Prior to the initial term of the master agreements, a team of personnel from the Legal and Finance Departments was tasked to conduct a city-wide data and performance review of account receivables and the collections operations. This review included an assessment of the City's third-party collection contracts as well as a review of other collection contracts used in other municipalities. Part of the finding from this review concluded that various collection contracts were under-performing and that other collection models could help the City improve its collection recovery rate.

Each contract includes multiple vendors. The master agreements include the scope of services, maximum fees, term and other provisions such as the City's right to reassign accounts from one vendor to another. Each Department Director is authorized to issue specific Letters of Engagement to vendors assigning accounts, establishing fees and setting out metrics for achieving acceptable collection rates or reassignment of accounts to another vendor. The Letter of Engagement provides details of the work the Vendor will do, which may include all or a portion of the tasks set out in the Master Agreement. A Letter of Engagement may have a term of up to three years with two 1 year renewal options. The master agreements also allow the addition of other vendors who meet the minimum standard set out in Ordinance No. 2013-0131.

Fiscal Note

There is no impact to the FY18 Adopted Operating Budget for this item. Therefore, no fiscal note is required as stated in the Financial Policy Ord. 2014-1078 as an Operating Budget Item.
