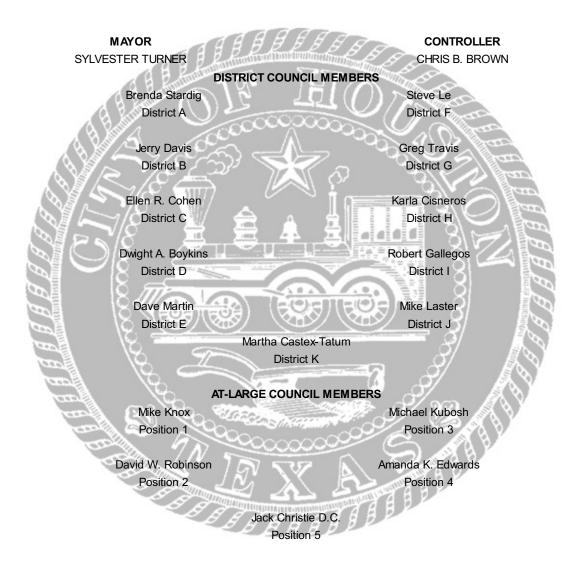

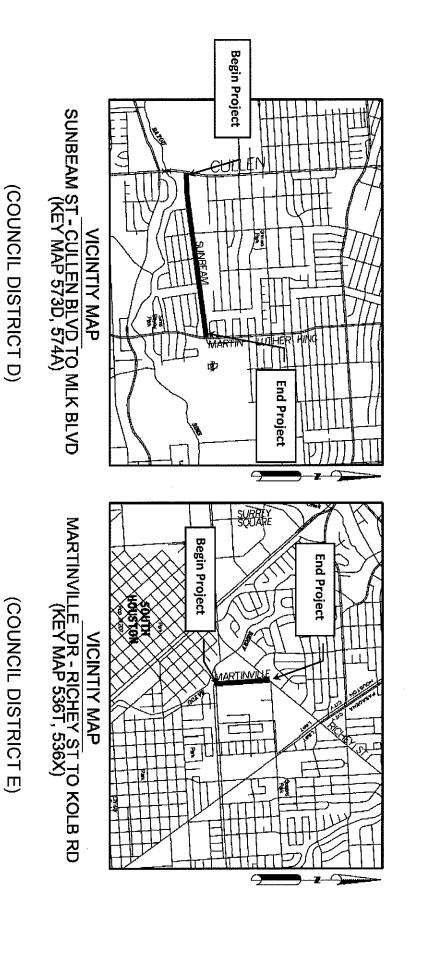

JUSTIFICATION:

The design documents do not account for use of borrow/select fill for the subgrade stabilization of the proposed pavement for Sunbeam St. During Martinville Dr. construction, Alliance Laboratories prepared the soil boring logs for Martinville Dr. and Sunbeam St. as there were issues on the subgrade stabilization of Martinville Dr. The boring log shows that some areas of Sunbeam St. have existing unsuitable soil up to 26 inches. The existing unsuitable soil needs replacement with select fill/borrow.

Based on the soil boring information, Engineer of Record (EOR) recommended four different options for the pavement design changes in Sunbeam St. One of the options using borrow/select fill for the entire limit is found economical and suitable for this pavement work. In this method, the proposed 8 inches stabilized subgrade would begin at depth of 10 inches from the existing grade. The contractor will remove an average 12 inches of additional base (Excavation range can be lower or higher than 12 inches) depending on each location) and replace with borrow/select fill. The pavement will still be 8 inches lime stabilization, 6 inches flexbase and 4 inches Hot Mix Asphalt Concrete (HMAC).

The overall pricing was determined by using pricing on WCD#4 and other bid items. The contractor agreed on the price used on this WCD for the new added item Borrow and other items are already on the contract.

The City recommends adding this change in the scope of contract. Thirty (30) additional calendar days were requested to be added to the contract. The City Project manager evaluated the project schedule and determined that twenty-four(24) days impacted the critical path of the project schedule.

CHANGE ORDER No. 2

JUSTIFICATION:

Contract documents do not account for timber and storm sewer pipe leakage underneath the subgrade. Contractor discovered the timbers underneath the subgrade between Station 14+80 to 21+22 during proof rolling. While excavating the subgrade to expose the timbers, the contractor found a storm pipe leakage at approximate station 17+50.

The Contractor submitted RFI No.15A ,15B and 17 requesting clarification for stabilization of subgrade. Engineer of Record (EOR) and the project team discussed this issue with the Technical Service Team, Testing and Lab Geotest Engineering, recommended to excavate 1.5 ft the entire limit between 14+80 to 21+22 and remove the horizontal timbers and cut the vertical timbers at the excavated level of 1.5ft and backfill using suitable on site soils and remainder of the backfill using borrow/select fill. EOR also recommended to use a concrete collar to bridge the gap between pipes using TXDOT specification item 464 and its standard detail. During this time, contractor was delayed and incurred for additional cost.

WCD #2 and WCD #3 were executed to expedite the work. The contractor's pricing was evaluated by the parallel estimate, analysis of existing bid data, and prices on WCD #2 and 3.

The City recommends adding this change in the scope of contract. Thirty-seven (37) additional calendar days were requested to be added to the contract. The City Project manager evaluated the project schedule and determined that thirty (30) days impacted the critical path of the project schedule. (RFI #15A, 15B and 17; WCD #2 and 3 and Contractor's request letter).

JUSTIFICATION:

The subgrade soil condition in Martinville Dr. was found different from the contract documents. During construction, the contractor discovered inconsistent base material containing limestone, asphalt, brick and shell fragments along the entire length of Martinville Dr.

The contractor submitted RFI No. 008,008A,009 and 009B requesting clarification for the method of stabilizing subgrade of inconsistent material. Engineer of Record (EOR) and the project team discussed the issue with Technical Services Team, Testing Lab and Geotest Engineering. Finally, after additional soil tests and some meetings on this issue, EOR recommended additional 4 inches of base thickness on the pavement. The cost of the design change has already been addressed in the change order no.1. Contractor incurred additional cost due to delay in evaluating and analyzing the soil samples and providing the new design for different site condition.

The contractor's pricing was evaluated by parallel estimate and analysis of differing site condition.

The City recommends adding the scope of this work to the contract. Fifty-three (53) additional calendar days were requested to be added to the contract. The City Project manager evaluated the project schedule and determined that forty-three (43) days impacted the critical path of the project schedule. (RFI No. 8, 8A, 9 and 9B, WCD 1 and Contractor's request letter)

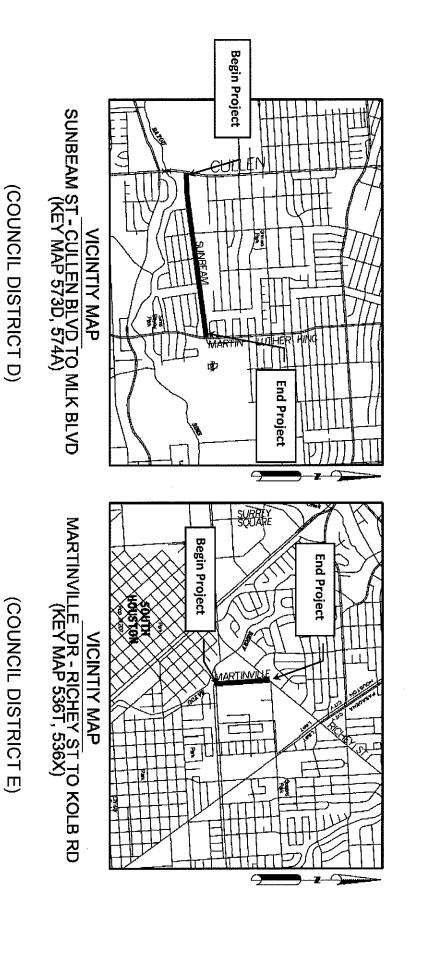

Background:

SUBJECT: Settlement of Claim of Noemi Amaya

RECOMMENDATION: (Summary)

That council adopt a Motion approving and authorizing a Settlement of the Claim of Noemi Amaya.

SPECIFIC EXPLANATION:

Noemi Amaya, the subject claimant, has filed a claim against the City of Houston for property damages occurring on August 7, 2018. The claimant alleges that an employee in the Houston Public Works Department, negligently used motor driven equipment and while clearing a sewer line, pumped sewage into the claimant's home resulting in damage.

The claimant seeks to recovery for alleged damages to her home and personal items.

Aerial Map - SY18-061

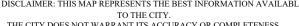

Each individual is State certified in accordance with their job responsibilities within the department. Based on current numbers of certified employees and projected trainees to be certified this fiscal year, HFD budgeted a total expenditure of no more than \$392,300 in FY19.

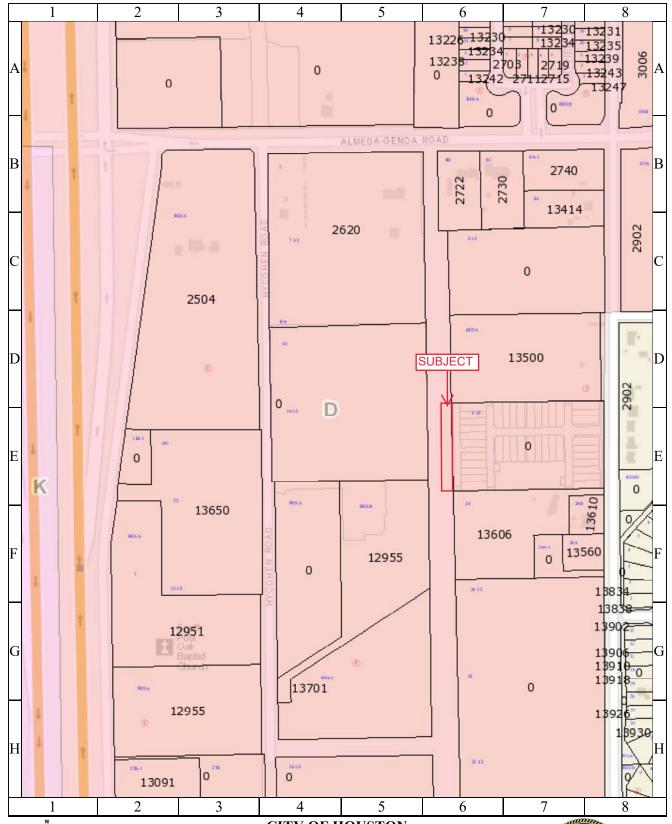

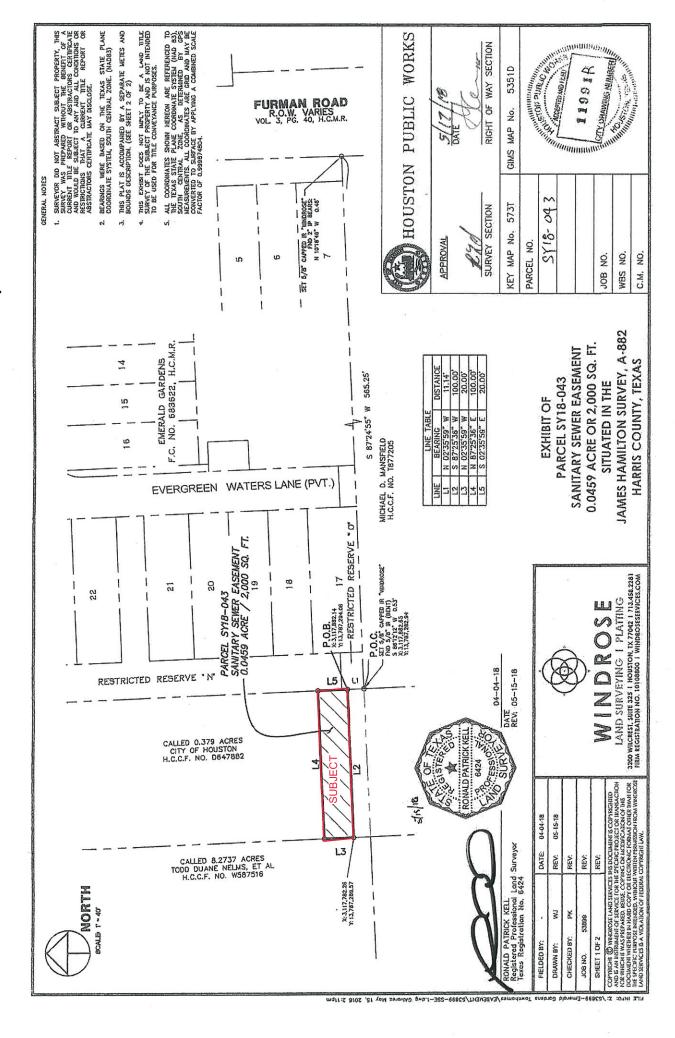

The M&O Rate is \$0.419242 on each \$100 of taxable value and the I&S Rate is \$0.169068 on each \$100 of taxable value which, when combined, equal the total Tax Rate of \$0.588310 on each \$100 of taxable value.

Therefore, it is recommended that City Council adopt an overall tax rate, based on the FY2019 Estimate. TIRZ budgets to be presented to City Council for consideration and approval on October 10, 2018 are listed below:

TIRZ #1 – ST. GEORGE PLACE (DISTRICT G, J) was created to stabilize property values, address deteriorated buildings and incompatible land uses and provide for the design and construction of roadway and streets, public utility systems, sidewalks, landscaping and land acquisition in a district of the City known as St. George Place (formerly known as Lamar Terrace). The projected incremental property tax revenue is \$4.8M, which comprises \$2.9M from City revenue and \$1.9M from HISD. The FY19 budget is \$11.4M and allocates \$8.6M for project costs. Projects include reconstruction of Chimney Rock from Westheimer to US 59 (\$2.8M) and construction of basins related to sub-regional detention strategy (\$2.8M). The budget also includes \$2.8M in transfers, the majority of which being for affordable housing (\$1.6M) and educational facilities (\$774K).

TIRZ #20 – Southwest Houston (DISTRICT F, J) was created to address failing infrastructure, lack of utility capacity, increased traffic congestion attributable to street network deficiencies, declining retail sales and significant social and economic stress along the Bellaire Corridor and the greater Sharpstown Mall area. Plans include provisions for the design and construction of roadways and streets, utility system upgrades, pedestrian safety improvements and parks. The projected tax revenue is \$9.4M, all of which is City increment. The FY19 budget is \$11.4M and allocates \$7.4M for project costs. Project costs include debt service payments (\$3.2M), mobility and drainage improvements along Harwin Drive (\$1.6M), as well as various concrete panel replacements throughout the zone (\$1.2M). The budget also includes \$4.0M in transfers, the majority of which being for municipal services (\$3.6M).

Accomplishments in FY17 (Projects Underway):

The TIRZ Board approved five new building permits within its boundary, a decrease from the previous year. The Board approved replats that affected 8 lots. The Board also ontinued its efforts enforcing the city's zoning ordinance with regard to blighted properties. The TIRZ Board worked with its engineering consultants and the City to finalize a neighborhood mobility construction plan. This plan was implemented in FY 2015 through its capital improvement budget. The TIRZ Board continues to effectively manage the Public Improvement District (PID) Budget and services. The TIRZ Board is under contract with the city to manage the PID services. The primary PID services include zoning enforcement, landscape maintenance and additional public safety efforts. The TIRZ Board utilize the PID Funds to market the area.

The City Council approved a Fourth Amended Project Plan and Reinvestment Zone Financing Plan in the Fall of 2015. In doing so, the term of the zone was extended 30 years ending in 2045. The expansion and extension of the zone is intended to reconstruct and construct new north/south mobility projects, add additional drainage and storage capacity and provide park improvements. The purpose of these projects which total \$105.8 million is to enhance the redevelopment of the area located between Chimney Rock, Westheimer, Hillcroft and Westpark. The intended result is better mobility, increased development resulting in additional sales tax and increased property values over the long term.

TIRZ budgets to be presented to City Council for consideration and approval on October 10, 2018 are listed below:

TIRZ #1 – ST. GEORGE PLACE (DISTRICT G, J) was created to stabilize property values, address deteriorated buildings and incompatible land uses and provide for the design and construction of roadway and streets, public utility systems, sidewalks, landscaping and land acquisition in a district of the City known as St. George Place (formerly known as Lamar Terrace). The projected incremental property tax revenue is \$4.8M, which comprises \$2.9M from City revenue and \$1.9M from HISD. The FY19 budget is \$11.4M and allocates \$8.6M for project costs. Projects include reconstruction of Chimney Rock from Westheimer to US 59 (\$2.8M) and construction of basins related to sub-regional detention strategy (\$2.8M). The budget also includes \$2.8M in transfers, the majority of which being for affordable housing (\$1.6M) and educational facilities (\$774K).

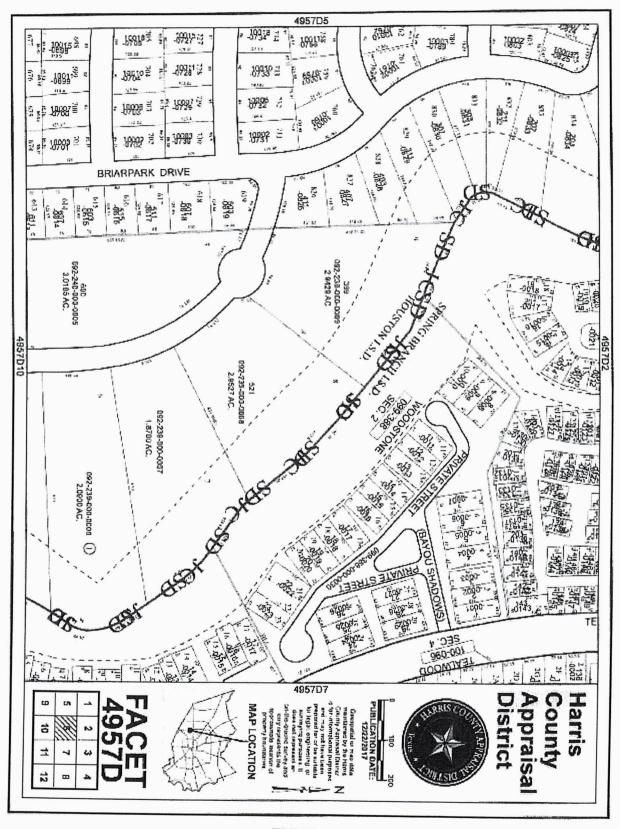
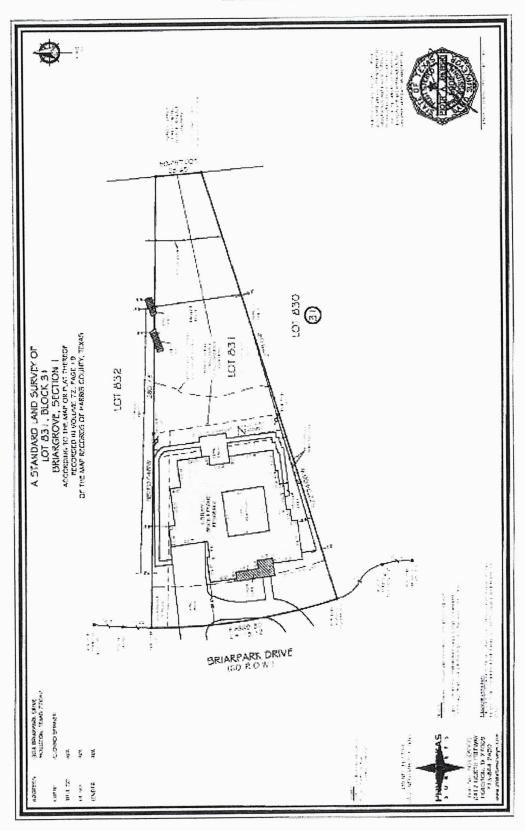

<u>SPECIFIC EXPLANATION:</u> Harris County Municipal Utility District No. 449 was created through the TCEQ in 2006, and currently consists of 736.48 acres within Harris County. The district is within the extraterritorial jurisdiction of the City and has petitioned the City for consent to add two (2) tracts of land totaling 489.21 acres of vacant land, proposed be developed as single family residential (34.06%), and commercial property (14.92%), and detention/floodplain (51.02%), to the district. The proposed annexation tracts are located in the vicinity of Clay Road, Peek Road, Stockdick School Road, and Mt. Whitney Way. The addition of land to the district does not release it from the City's extraterritorial jurisdiction.

The Utility District Review Committee has evaluated the application with respect to wastewater collection and treatment, potable water distribution, storm water conveyance, and other public services.

The District has a wastewater collection system and treatment facility. The annexation tracts will be provided with wastewater treatment by Harris County Municipal Utility District No. 449 Wastewater Treatment Plant. Potable water is provided by the district.

The nearest major drainage facility for Harris County Municipal Utility District No. 449 is South Mayde Creek, which flows into Buffalo Bayou, and finally into the Houston Ship Channel. The proposed annexation tract is partially within 100-year floodplain (47%), and is partially within the 500-year floodplain (26%). According to the proposed land plan, development will be constructed outside the 100-year and 500-year floodplains.

By executing the Petition for Consent, the district has acknowledged that all plans for the construction of water conveyance, wastewater collection, and storm water collection systems within the district must be approved by the City of Houston prior to their construction.

ORDINANCE authorizing the appropriation of \$2,997,500.00 out of the Water and Sewer System Consolidated Construction Fund (8500) and awarding a contract to **ACCURATE METER & BACKFLOW LLC**. in the amount not to exceed \$3,060,000.00 for commercial meter replacement services for Houston Public Works.

Background:

Formal bids received November 30, 2017 for S75-L26362 – Approve an ordinance authorizing the appropriation of \$2,997,500.00 out of the Water and Sewer System Consolidated Construction Fund (8500) and awarding a contract to Accurate Meter & Backflow LLC. in the amount not to exceed \$3,060,000.00 for commercial meter replacement services for Houston Public Works.

Specific Explanation

The Director of Houston Public Works and the Chief Procurement Officer recommend that City Council approve an ordinance authorizing the appropriation of \$2,997,500.00 out of the Water and Sewer System Consolidated Construction Fund (8500) and awarding a three-year contract, with two one-year options to Accurate Meter & Backflow LLC. on its low bid meeting specifications in an amount not to exceed \$3,060,000.00 for commercial meter replacement services for Houston Public Works.

The scope of work requires the contractor furnish all tools, supplies, fuel, transportation, equipment, labor, training and supervision necessary to provide on-demand meter and meter assembly change outs to the water system. The City of Houston has identified approximately 1600 site locations for the contractor to perform on-demand meter and meter assembly change outs.

M/WBE Participation

This invitation to bid was issued as a goal-oriented contract with an 11% M/WBE participation level. Accurate Meter & Backflow, LLC has designated the below-named company as its certified M/WBE subcontractor.
