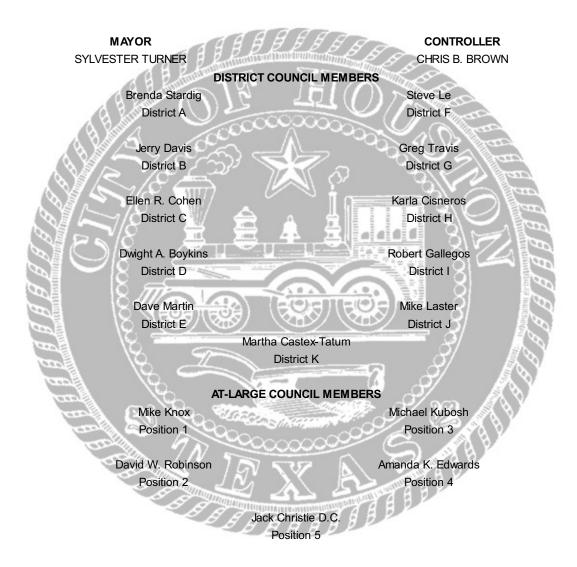

Background:

RECOMMENDATION: The General Services Department recommends approval of final contract amount of \$1,544,883.35 and acceptance of work on the contract with Gadberry Construction Company, Inc., for Central Library Plaza Improvements - 9.86 % over the original contract amount and under the approved 10% contingency.

SPECIFIC EXPLANATION: On August 24, 2016, by Ordinance No. 2016-0624, City Council awarded a construction contract to Gadberry Construction Company, Inc. for the Central Library Plaza Improvements, and authorized the director to approve change orders up to 10% of the original contract amount. The General Services Department recommends that City Council approve the final contract amount of \$1,544,883.35, or 9.86% over the original contract amount, accept the work and authorize final payment to Gadberry Construction Company, Inc.

PROJECT LOCATION: 500 McKinney Street, Houston, Texas

PROJECT DESCRIPTION: The project scope consisted of selected demolition, new stage with steel and glass canopy, surrounding decks, hardscape, adjacent landscaping, ornamental fencing and gates, and associated electrical and lighting.

Lauren Griffith, Inc. was the design consultant for the project.

CONTRACT COMPLETION AND COST: The contractor completed the project within 246 days: the original contract time of 150 days, plus 96 days approved by Change Orders. The final cost of the project, including Change Orders, is \$1,544,883.35, an increase of \$138,714.35 over the original contract amount.

PREVIOUS CHANGE ORDERS: Change Orders No. 1-3 completed additional concrete demolition; redesigned and modified storm drainage systems; installed additional waterproofing;

completed steel handrail modifications; adjusted mounting heights for lighting; engraved pavers for inspection; completed electrical modifications; installed steel fasteners and brackets for grating; installed additional spacers at paving; and added compensable and non-compensable days to the contract duration.

M/WBE PARTICIPATION: The contract contained an 18% MBE goal and 10% WBE goal. The contractor submitted documentation of its Good Faith Effort to the Office of Business Opportunity (OBO). OBO reviewed the Good Faith Effort and determined that a reduced MBE goal of 17.18%, WBE goal of 4.71% and SBE goal of 0.25% were appropriate for this project, as described in the attached correspondence. According to OBO, the contractor achieved 18.66% MBE participation, 4.30% WBE participation and 0% SBE participation and was assigned a satisfactory rating.

Background:

H28785 – Approve spending authority in the amount not to exceed \$22,426,000.00 for the purchase of technology related products and services through Cooperative Purchasing Agreements with Texas Department of Information Resources (DIR), National Association of State Procurement Officials ValuePoint (NASPO ValuePoint), U.S. Communities, National Intergovernmental Purchasing Alliance (National IPA) and General Services Administration (GSA) for Various Departments.

Specific Explanation:

The Chief Information Officer and the Chief Procurement Officer recommend that City Council approve spending authority in an amount not to exceed \$22,426,000.00 for the purchase of technology related products and services through Texas Department of Information Resources (DIR), National Association of State Procurement Officials ValuePoint (NASPO ValuePoint), U.S. Communities, National Intergovernmental Purchasing Alliance (National IPA) and General Services Administration (GSA) for various departments; and that authorization be given to issue purchase orders, as needed to the contract holders/contractors of these cooperative purchasing programs. The spending authority is expected to sustain the various departments for approximately 12 months.

All purchases citywide will require approval from Houston Information Technology Services (HITS). Strategic Procurement Division (SPD) will be responsible for processing all purchase orders citywide. Individual purchases over \$300,000.00 will continue to require separate Council approval. Houston Information Technology Services will continue to monitor detailed spending under each agreement and provide monthly reports.

The contractors will provide technology products and services for all City Departments; this will significantly decrease the amount of staff time required to develop specifications and bid items for IT related software, hardware, equipment and services. The City is eligible to participate in these programs as set out in Chapter 2054 of the Texas Government Code.

Background:

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Beginning in the 1980s, the Texas Legislation began to recognize the potential benefits of information and communication technology to reduce the cost of state and local governments. As a result, acts of the Legislature since that time have streamlined the procurement processes and provided cooperative purchasing programs between the state and political subdivisions, i.e., counties, cities, school districts, etc. Additional changes made by the 2007 Legislature have delegated State contracts to be administered by DIR. This change allows the City to leverage numerous existing State contracts, which has increased the utilization of the DIR program.

Plaintiff claimed that his civil and constitutional rights were violated by City Defendants due to the alleged use of excessive force to detain him during a burglary of habitation investigation on or about August 6, 2013.

The parties participated in court-ordered mediation. The City Attorney recommends that City Council adopt an ordinance approving and authorizing the compromise, settlement and release of Plaintiff's claims against the City Defendants by issuing a check to Nicolas Watson and his attorneys, Randall L. Kallinen and Jeralynn Manor, in the amount of \$200,000 in exchange for full and final release, settlement and indemnify agreement.

The amendment will add one additional one-year automatic renewal term, additional services to the Scope of Work, update the price list for the additional year and increase the maximum contract amount of each contract by \$850,000.00, making the new maximum contract amount for each contract \$3,350,000.00. The amendment will extend the term of the agreements from November 30, 2018 through December 1, 2019.

These amendments enable HHD to continue to perform lead-based paint hazard reduction in low income private housing units, to conduct community outreach, education and blood lead screening, and to relocate families during hazard reduction, when needed. The services include painting, floor replacement, cabinet remediation/replacement, overlav window remediation/replacement, vinyl siding and soil remediation. Pricing for these services were standardized by HHD and accepted by the contractors. 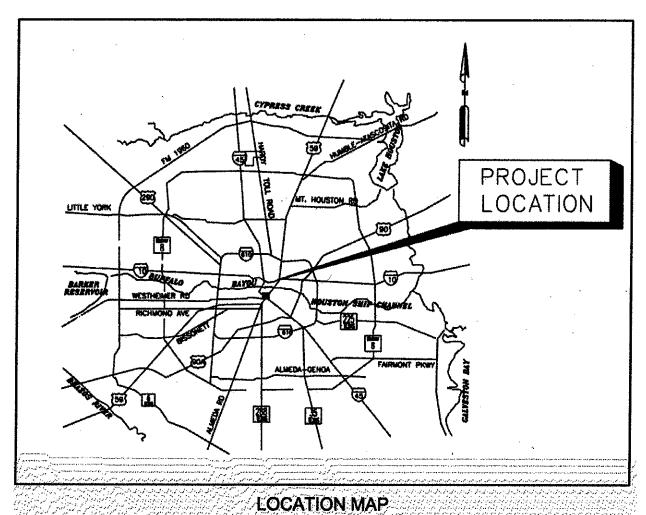

Northside Sewer Relief Tunnel (NSRT#4)

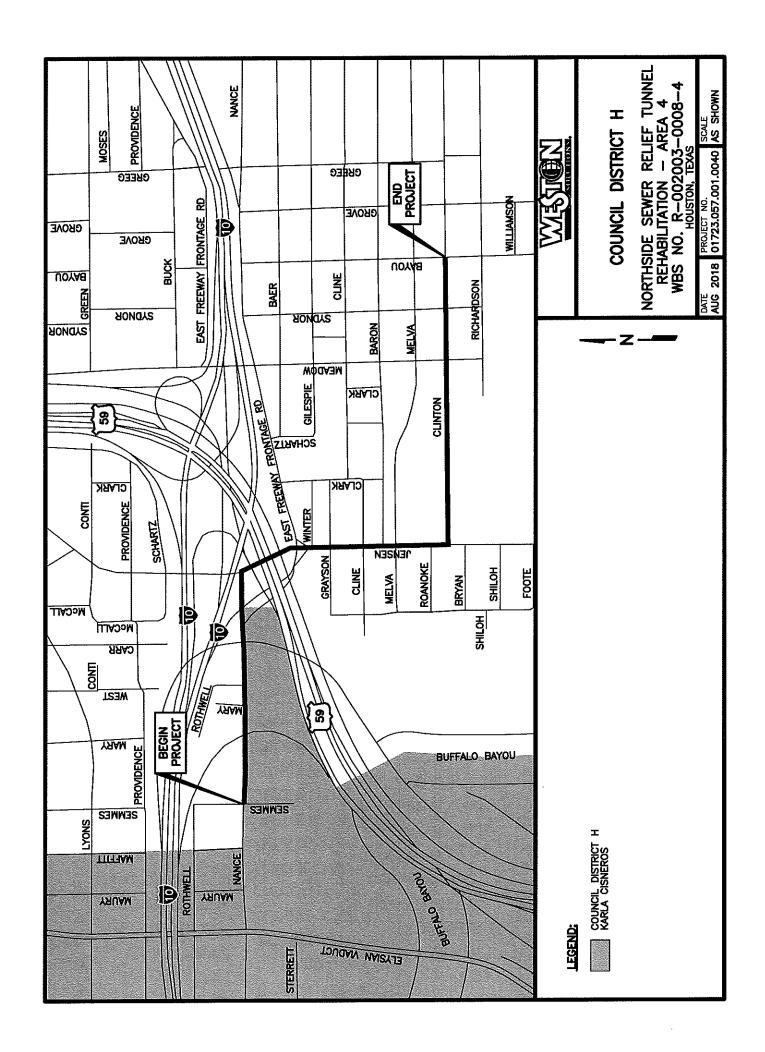

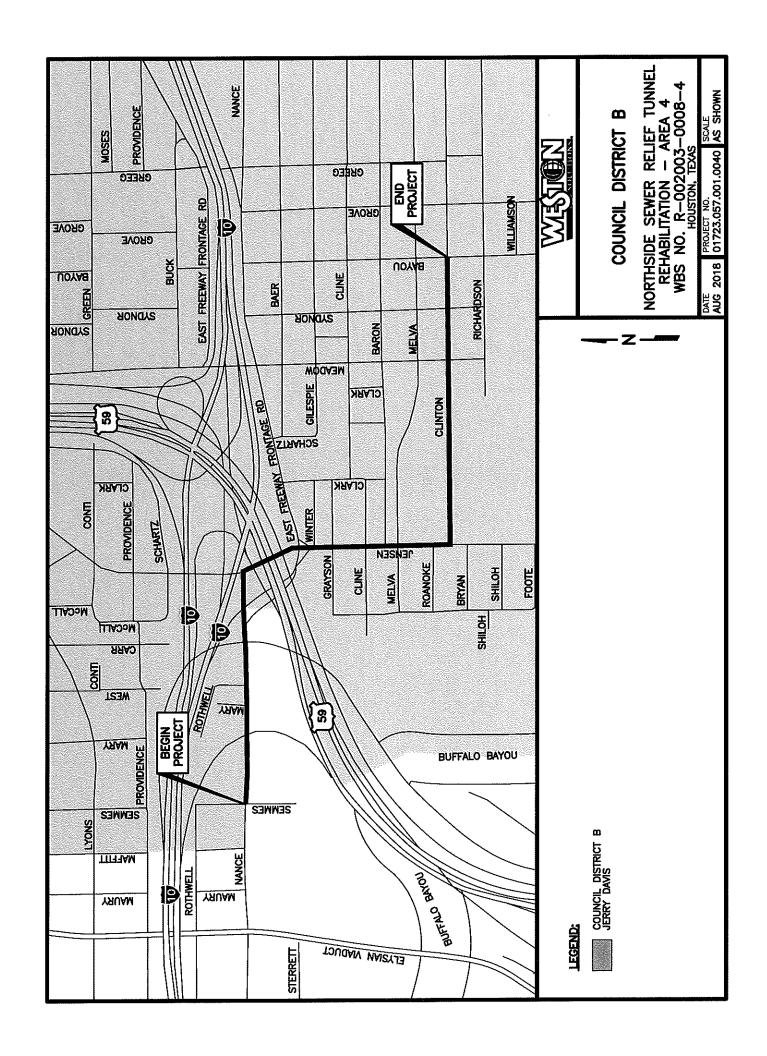

<u>SPECIFIC EXPLANATION:</u> Harris County Water Control and Improvement District No. 84 was created through the TCEQ in 1963, and currently consists of 1,166.445 acres within Harris County. The district is within the extraterritorial jurisdiction of the City and has petitioned the City for consent to add 1.125 acres of undeveloped property, proposed to be developed as part of an existing mobile home park, to the district. The proposed annexation tract is located in the vicinity of Woodforest Blvd., Del Dale Avenue, Ashland Blvd., and Sheldon Road. The addition of land to the district does not release it from the City's extraterritorial jurisdiction.

The Utility District Review Committee has evaluated the application with respect to wastewater collection and treatment, potable water distribution, storm water conveyance, and other public services.

The District has a wastewater collection system and treatment facility. The annexation tract will be provided with wastewater treatment by Harris County Water Control and Improvement District No. 84 Wastewater Treatment Plant. Potable water is provided by the district.

The nearest major drainage facility for Harris County Water Control and Improvement District No. 84 is the San Jacinto River, which flows into the Houston Ship Channel. The proposed annexation tract is within the 100-year floodplain (100%), and is not within the 500-year floodplain.

By executing the Petition for Consent, the district has acknowledged that all plans for the construction of water conveyance, wastewater collection, and storm water collection systems within the district must be approved by the City of Houston prior to their construction.

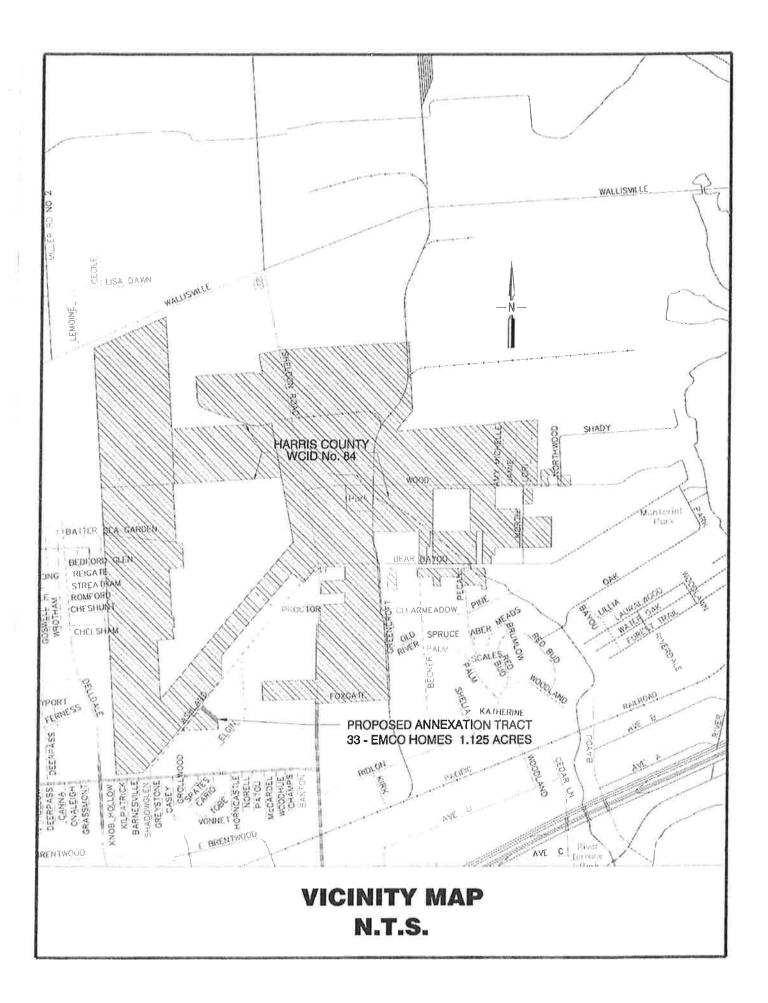

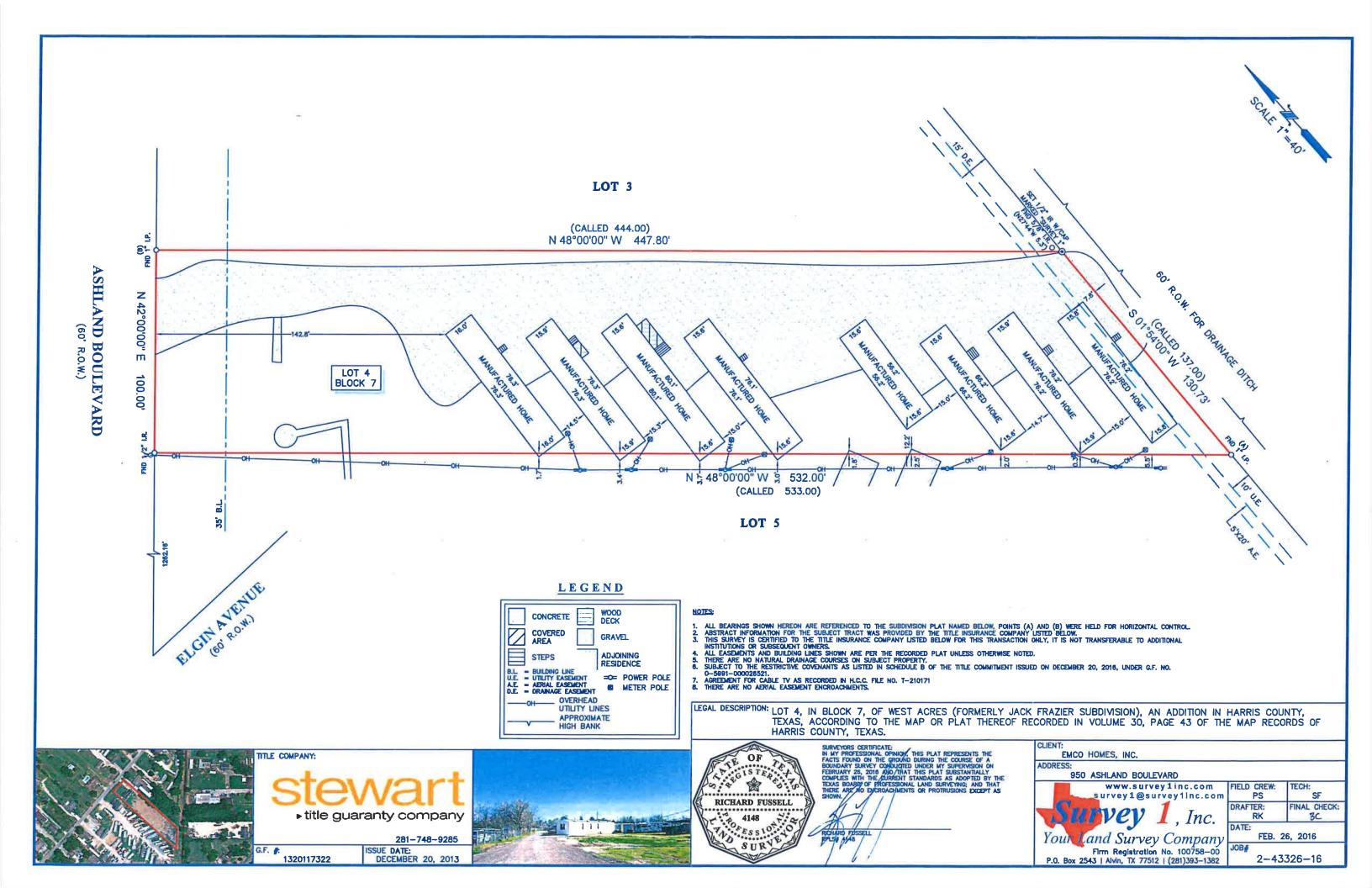

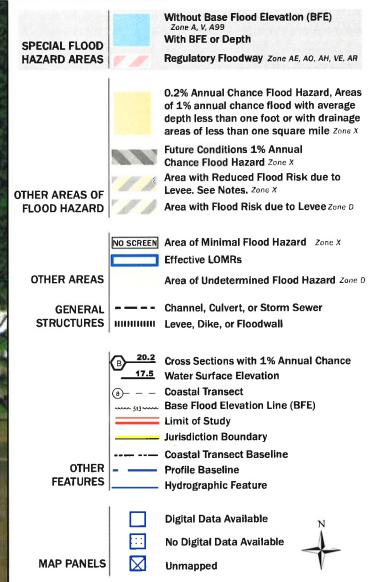


National Flood Hazard Layer FIRMette
