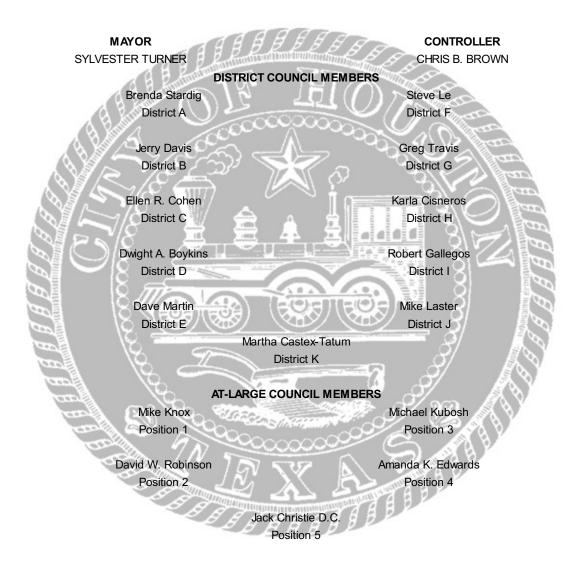

Through the 9-1-1 system, emergency calls from citizens are referred to the appropriate emergency response agency such as police, fire and ambulance services, as well as other agencies including Crisis Hotline, Poison Control and emergency management operations.

Due to its intergovernmental functions and pursuant to State Law, the Greater Harris County 9-1-1 Emergency Network annual budget must be approved by the Greater Harris County 9-1-1 Emergency Network Board of Managers, Harris County Commissioners' Court, and the City of Houston City Council.

A copy of the budget was delivered to each Council Member during the month of November 2018. Additionally, a copy of the budget is available for review in the City Secretary's office and copies are available from the Houston Emergency Center. In summary, Greater Harris County 9-1-1 will reimburse the City of Houston approximately \$16.4 million for 178.5 positions associated with HEC 9-1-1 call taking.

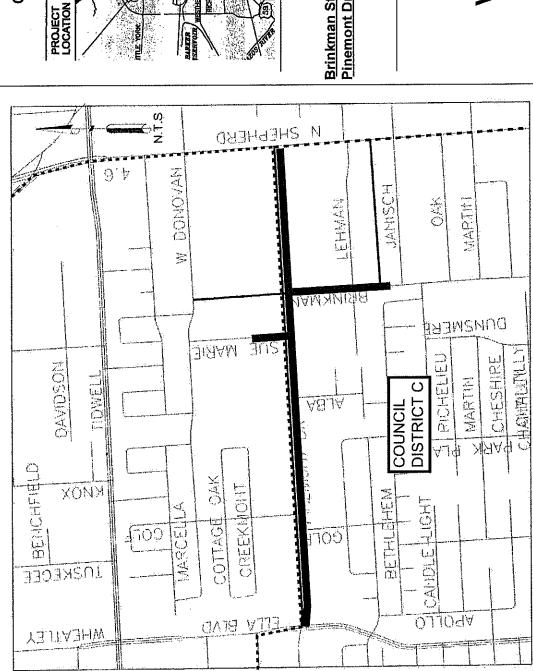

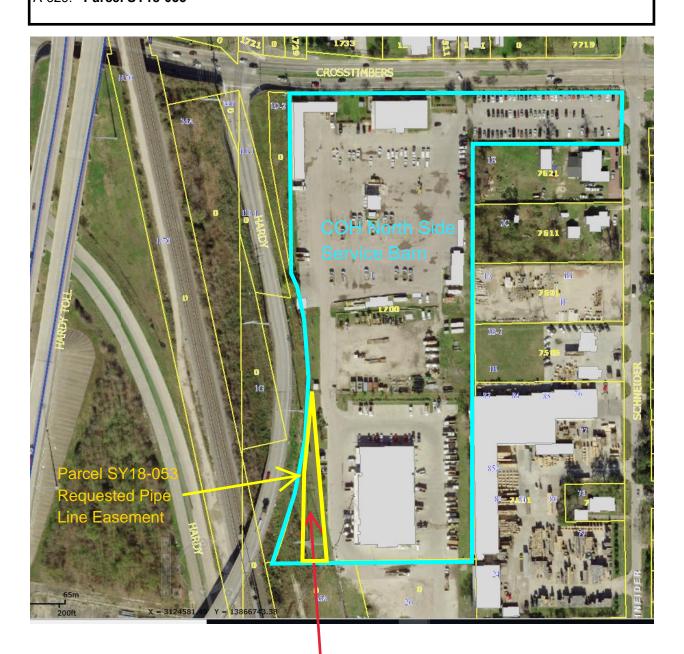

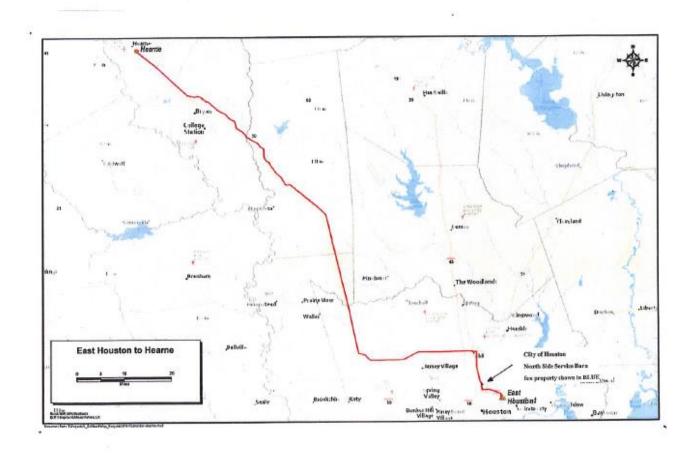

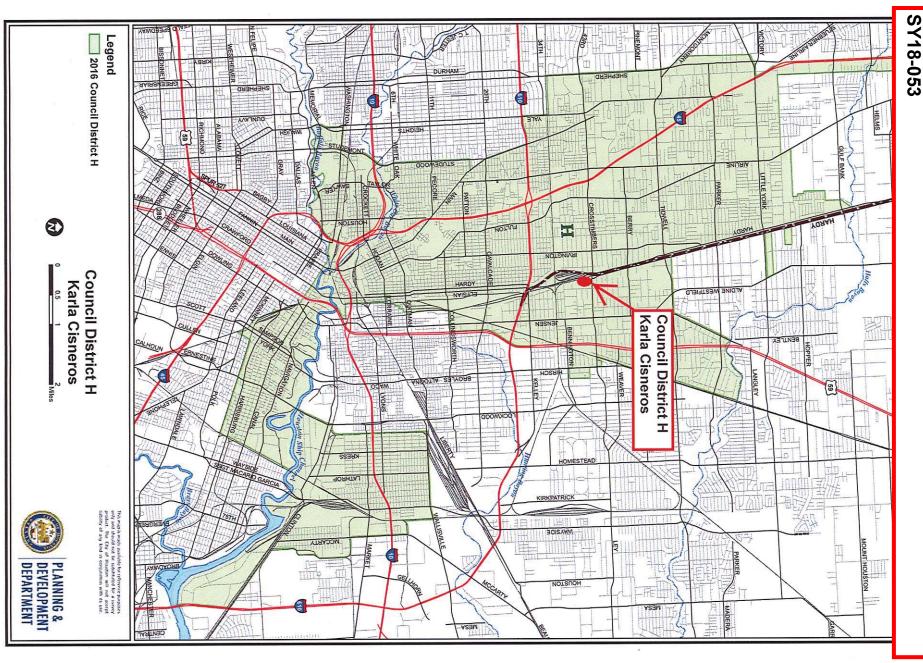

Section 1251 et seq., 40 C.F.R. Part 403, and 30 T.A.C. 315.1. To enforce its pretreatment program within the Districts, which are located outside City limits, the City must

amend the Agreement to add multijurisdictional pretreatment program requirements.

The First Amendment establishes the City's multijurisdictional pretreatment program requirements and states the terms and conditions under which industrial customers within the Districts may discharge into the Districts' sanitary sewer system. In addition, the First Amendment requires the Districts to reimburse the City for all costs incurred by the City in implementing and enforcing the Districts' industrial waste requirements, and establishes a rate to treat the industrial discharge. Finally, the First Amendment requires the Districts to reimburse the City for costs incurred by the City to treat discharges of industrial waste into the sanitary sewer system within 30 days of the effective date of this First Amendment, and to pay a 10% penalty on top of those costs.

The First Amendment will be in effect until it is superseded by a new sanitary sewer service agreement, the form of which is being updated to include the City's multijurisdictional pretreatment program requirements.

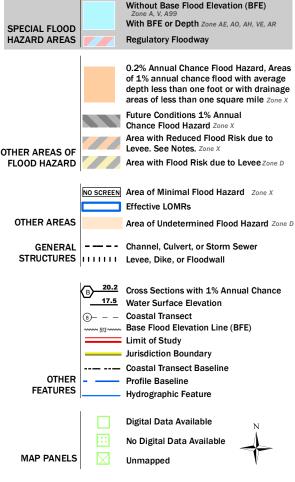


National Flood Hazard Layer FIRMette

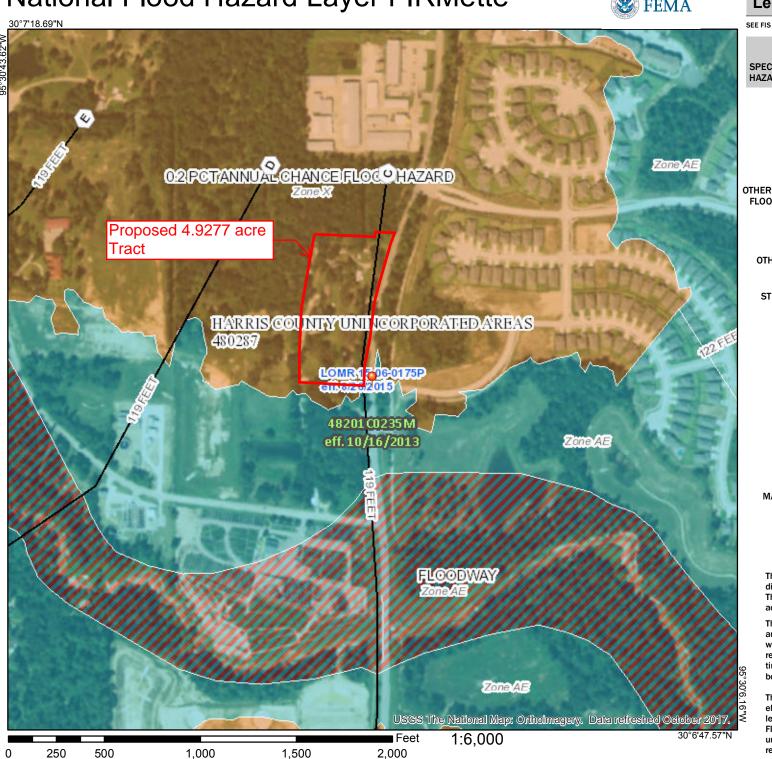


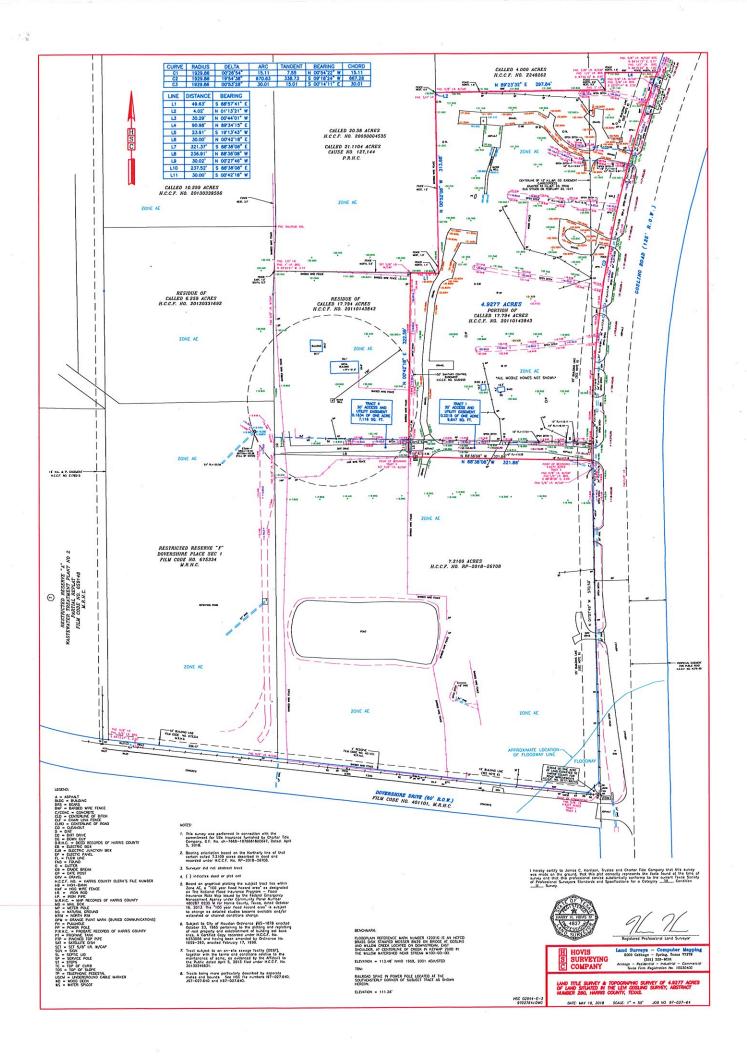

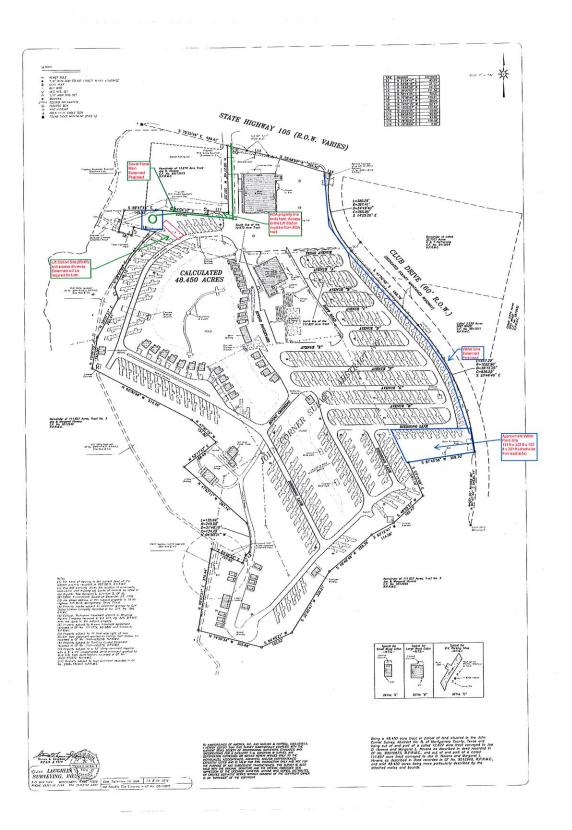
