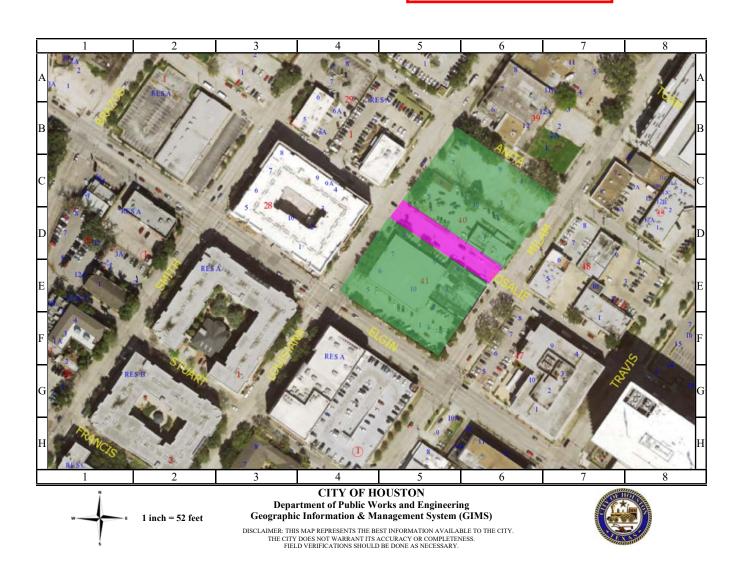

On April 17, 2019 City Council adopted Ordinance 2019-283 which authorized an Interlocal Agreement with Texas A&M Engineering Experiment Station for Project Design, Construction, and Program Implementation of the State Energy Conservation Office (SECO) Loan Funded Energy Initiatives, Project No. 912, and appropriated \$28,370,167.00 from the HAS Airports Improvement Fund (8011).

Also on April 17, 2019 City Council adopted Ordinance 2019-282 authorizing Loan Agreements with the State Comptroller of Public Accounts through its State Energy Conservation Office (SECO), Project No. 912. One loan is for the installation of new chilled water production and distribution equipment in the amount of \$7,991,463.00. Another loan is for the installation of lighting retrofits at IAH and HOU, the installation of new HVAC System components at IAH, and the construction of a solar photovoltaic roofing system above a parking garage at HOU for a total of

\$7,531,679.00. Both loans have a rate of 2% interest. HAS is required to fund all project costs as they are incurred and then will seek reimbursement from SECO for the amounts eligible though the LoanSTAR Revolving Loan Program. As the amounts are disbursed to HAS from SECO, they will then form the basis of the SECO Loans.

Based on additional information received from the State Comptroller of Public Accounts, HAS determined that it will be necessary to completely segregate by loan all reimbursement deposits received from the State, all construction disbursements supporting those reimbursements, and all SECO loan repayments. Two new funds, HAS State Energy Conservation Loan CL311 Fund (8051) and HAS State Energy Conservation Loan CL312 Fund (8052), have been created for this required transparency. Since HAS is required to fund all project costs as they are incurred and then seek reimbursement from SECO, it will be necessary to do the following:

- 1) De-appropriate \$15,523,142.00 that was appropriated from the HAS Airports Improvement Fund (8011) pursuant to Ordinance 2019-283:
- 2) Transfer \$7,991,463.00 to the HAS State Energy Conservation Loan CL311 Fund (8051) from Fund 8011;

(Project No. 912)

SPECIFIC EXPLANATION:

On April 17, 2019 City Council adopted Ordinance 2019-283 which authorized an Interlocal Agreement with Texas A&M Engineering Experiment Station for Project Design, Construction, and Program Implementation of the State Energy Conservation Office (SECO) Loan Funded Energy Initiatives, Project No. 912, and appropriated \$28,370,167.00 from the HAS Airports Improvement Fund (8011).

Also on April 17, 2019 City Council adopted Ordinance 2019-282 authorizing Loan Agreements with the State Comptroller of Public Accounts through its State Energy Conservation Office (SECO), Project No. 912. One loan is for the installation of new chilled water production and distribution equipment in the amount of \$7,991,463.00. Another loan is for the installation of lighting retrofits at IAH and HOU, the installation of new HVAC System components at IAH, and the construction of a solar photovoltaic roofing system above a parking garage at HOU for a total of \$7,531,679.00. Both loans have a rate of 2% interest. HAS is required to fund all project costs as they are incurred and then will seek reimbursement from SECO for the amounts eligible though the LoanSTAR Revolving Loan Program. As the amounts are disbursed to HAS from SECO, they will then form the basis of the SECO Loans.

Based on additional information received from the State Comptroller of Public Accounts, HAS determined that it will be necessary to completely segregate by loan all reimbursement deposits received from the State, all construction disbursements supporting those reimbursements, and all SECO loan repayments. Two new funds, HAS State Energy Conservation Loan CL311 Fund (8051) and HAS State Energy Conservation Loan CL312 Fund (8052), have been created for this required transparency. Since HAS is required to fund all project costs as they are incurred and then seek reimbursement from SECO, it will be necessary to do the following:

- 1) De-appropriate \$15,523,142.00 that was appropriated from the HAS Airports Improvement Fund (8011) pursuant to Ordinance 2019-283:
- 2) Transfer \$7,991,463.00 to the HAS State Energy Conservation Loan CL311 Fund (8051) from Fund 8011;
- 3) Transfer \$7,531,679.00 to the HAS State Energy Conservation Loan CL312 Fund (8052) from Fund 8011;
- 4) Appropriate \$7,991,463.00 from the HAS State Energy Conservation Loan CL311 Fund (8051); and
- 5) Appropriate \$7,531,679.00 from the HAS State Energy Conservation Loan CL312 Fund (8052).

The remaining dollars appropriated for Project No. 912 in the amount of \$12,847,025.00 (\$28,370,167.00 appropriated under Ordinance 2019-283 less the de-appropriation amount of \$15,523,142.00) must remain in the HAS Airports Improvement Fund (8011) as originally approved by City Council; only disbursements, loan payments, etc. associated with the SECO Loans are to be segregated for reporting/tracking purposes. Reimbursements received from SECO will be transferred to the HAS Airports Improvement Fund (8011).

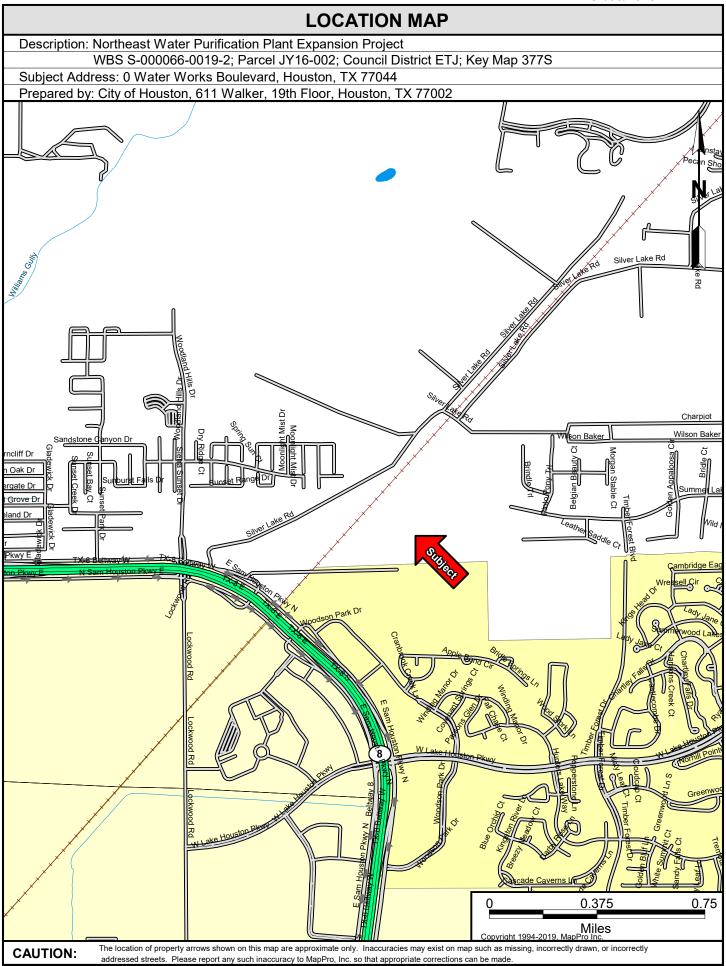

Background:

<u>SUBJECT:</u> Homeowner Agreement for Flood Mitigation Assistance Home Elevation Project between the City of Houston and the property owner at 7515 Wanda Lane, Houston, Texas 77074 for the disbursement of funds from the Texas Water Development Board under the FEMA Flood Mitigation Assistance Grant.

RECOMMENDATION: (SUMMARY) Adopt an ordinance approving and authorizing a Homeowner Agreement for the 2016 Flood Mitigation Assistance Home Elevation Project between the City of Houston and the property owner at 7515 Wanda Lane, Houston, Texas 77074 and disburse funds.

PROJECT NOTICE/JUSTIFICATION: The 2016 Flood Mitigation Assistance Grant for 40 flood-prone homes was awarded to the City of Houston on the behalf of the homeowners. On February 14, 2018, City Council passed Ordinance No. 2018-103 approving an agreement between the City of Houston and Texas Water Development Board for administering the Grant and to receive funds as sub-applicant from the Texas Water Development Board for reimbursement of the cost to complete the elevation of the flood-prone homes up to \$12,364,111.50 for 40 approved homes.

<u>DESCRIPTION:</u> This project consists of elevating the home in accordance with the City of Houston flood plain ordinance (Chapter 19).

LOCATION: The Property is located in Key Map Grid 531 R

SCOPE OF THIS AGREEMENT: The City entered into an Agreement with Texas Water Development Board to administer the Grant to complete the elevation of 40 flood-prone homes. The City is to enter into an Agreement with the Homeowner for the performance of the elevation work.

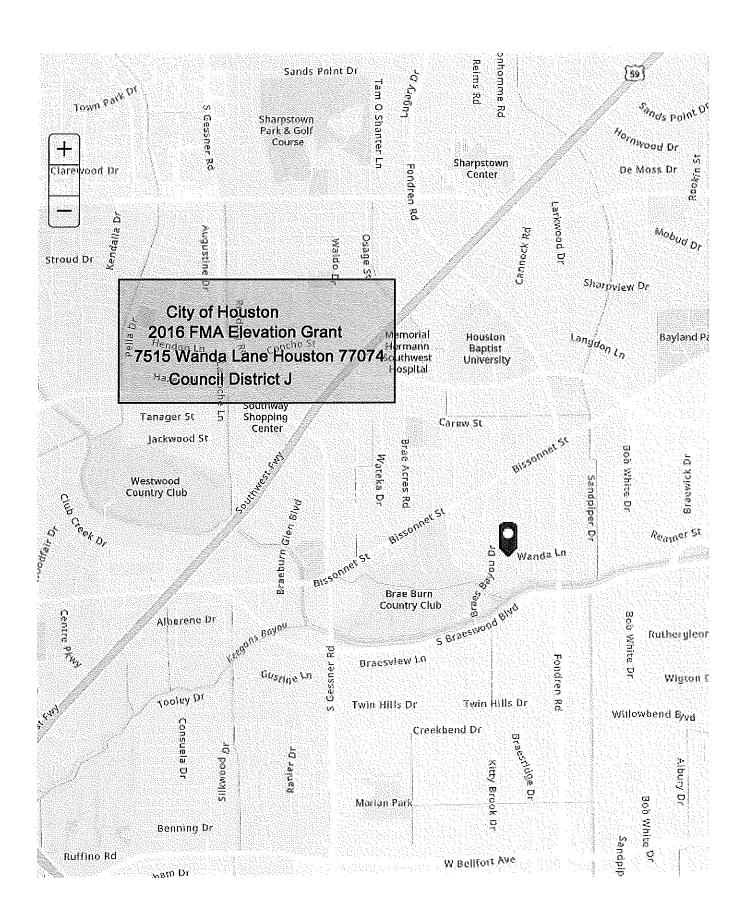

Specific Explanation:

The Director of Houston Public Works and the Chief Procurement Officer recommend that City Council approve an amending ordinance to increase the maximum contract amount from \$6,708,145.50 to \$8,385,181.87 for the contract between the City of Houston and Saber Power Services, LLC for on-call preventive maintenance and repair services of electric 138KV substations for Houston Public Works.

The contract was awarded on August 6, 2014 by Ordinance No. 2014-0753 for a three-year term, with two one-year options in the maximum contract amount of \$6,708,145.50. Pursuant to Contract No. 4600012794, Page 12, under Section IV "Term and Termination, 4.0 Time Extensions," the contract has been extended for an additional 180 days under the same terms and conditions. **The expiration date is now February 14, 2020**. Expenditures as of July 18, 2019 totaled \$6,485,101.10.

The purpose for the increase of this contract is due to the service lines repairing, replacing, and enhancing electrical reliability on critical electrical equipment and utilizing emergency services because of the City experiencing flooding throughout the life of this contract. This increase will allow the Wastewater and Drinking Water operation facilities to continue its water treatment and production, to avoid health and safety issues.

The scope of work requires the contractor to provide all labor, supervision, parts, material, equipment, tools and transportation necessary to carry out on-call electrical preventative maintenance, infrared

inspections, relay testing, calibrations, load flow and electrical grounding evaluations and power quality analyses of the 138KV substations and other medium/high voltage equipment at various Drinking Water

and Wastewater Facilities. The scope of work also includes Arc-Flash Studies, general electrical/mechanical work and unscheduled repairs of power transformers, oil and air circuit breakers, motor control centers, protective relays and other appurtenances necessary for optimum operation of the substations and high/medium voltage equipment.

The contract was awarded on August 6, 2014 by Ordinance No. 2014-0753 for a three-year term, with two one-year options in the maximum contract amount of \$6,708,145.50. Pursuant to Contract No. 4600012794, Page 12, under Section IV "Term and Termination, 4.0 Time Extensions," the contract has been extended for an additional 180 days under the same terms and conditions. **The expiration date is now February 14, 2020.** Expenditures as of July 18, 2019 totaled \$6,485,101.10.

The purpose for the increase of this contract is due to the service lines repairing, replacing, and enhancing electrical reliability on critical electrical equipment and utilizing emergency services because of the City experiencing flooding throughout the life of this contract. This increase will allow the Wastewater and Drinking Water operation facilities to continue its water treatment and production, to avoid health and safety issues.

The scope of work requires the contractor to provide all labor, supervision, parts, material, equipment, tools and transportation necessary to carry out on-call electrical preventative maintenance, infrared inspections, relay testing, calibrations, load flow and electrical grounding evaluations and power quality analyses of the 138KV substations and other medium/high voltage equipment at various Drinking Water and Wastewater Facilities. The scope of work also includes Arc-Flash Studies, general electrical/mechanical work and unscheduled repairs of power transformers, oil and air circuit breakers, motor control centers, protective relays and other appurtenances necessary for optimum operation of the substations and high/medium voltage equipment.

M/WBE Participation:

This contract was awarded with a 4% M/WBE participation level and the contractor is currently achieving 1.66%. Although the contractor is currently not meeting the MWBE goal as of today, but has provided sufficient documentation to demonstrate "Good Faith Efforts" to add two certified firms towards meeting the goal.

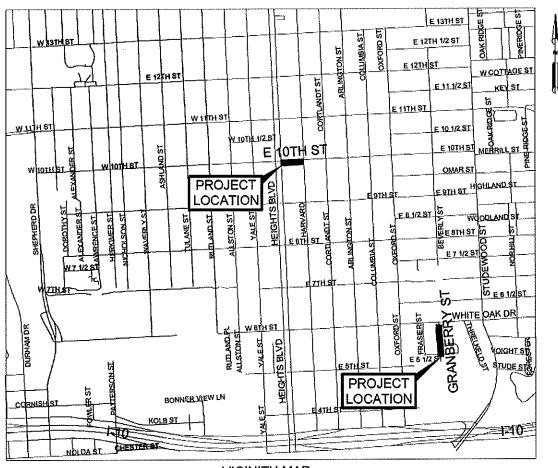

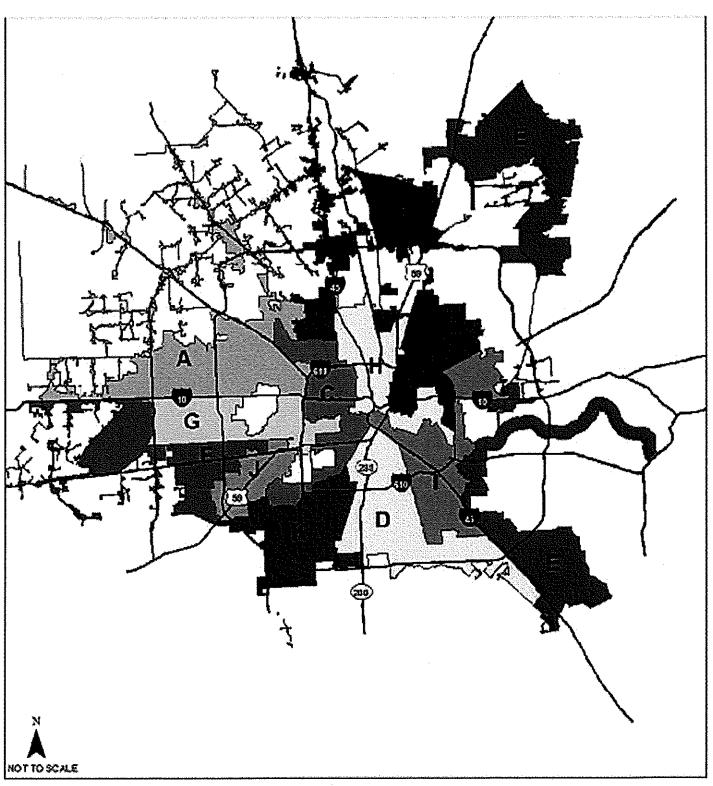
