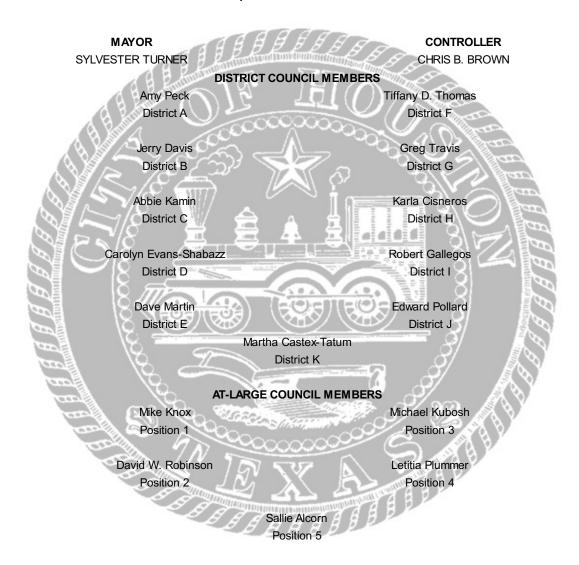

PROJECT NOTICE/JUSTIFICATION: This project is part of the Bridge Rehabilitation/Replacement 2017-2021 CIP Program. This is a Work Order bridge related repair project, primarily for miscellaneous type of bridge repair work throughout the City of Houston. The scope of the work includes mobilization, traffic control, and removal and replacement of bridge approach slabs, expansion joints and other structural members that are in need of repair, rehabilitation or reconstruction.

LOCATION: Bridge repair work is located on West Side Houston Pkwy between Kingwood Greens Drive on the north and Kings River Drive on the South.

The contract duration for this project is 600 calendar days. This project was designed in-house by Houston Public Works. The Project was awarded to ISI Contracting, Inc., with an original Contract amount of \$700,000.00.

SCOPE AND ADDITIONAL APPROPRIATION COSTS: Under the scope of the First Amendment, the work authorization is required for the additional scope of work as described in Change Order #2 to incorporate beams design lifting modification, replacing bearing pads, remove and replace of traffic rail,

preparation of wooden platform for workforce and traffic control measures. The requirement of the work was discovered during performance of the work authorization. This scope of work was necessary to complete execution of emergency repair on West Lake Houston Parkway northbound bridge at Bent #25. This amendment is required due to the amount exceeding 25% threshold of the contract amount. Therefore, the City recommends adding this scope of work with an additional 160 days to the contract. The total cost of this additional appropriation is \$232,068.97.

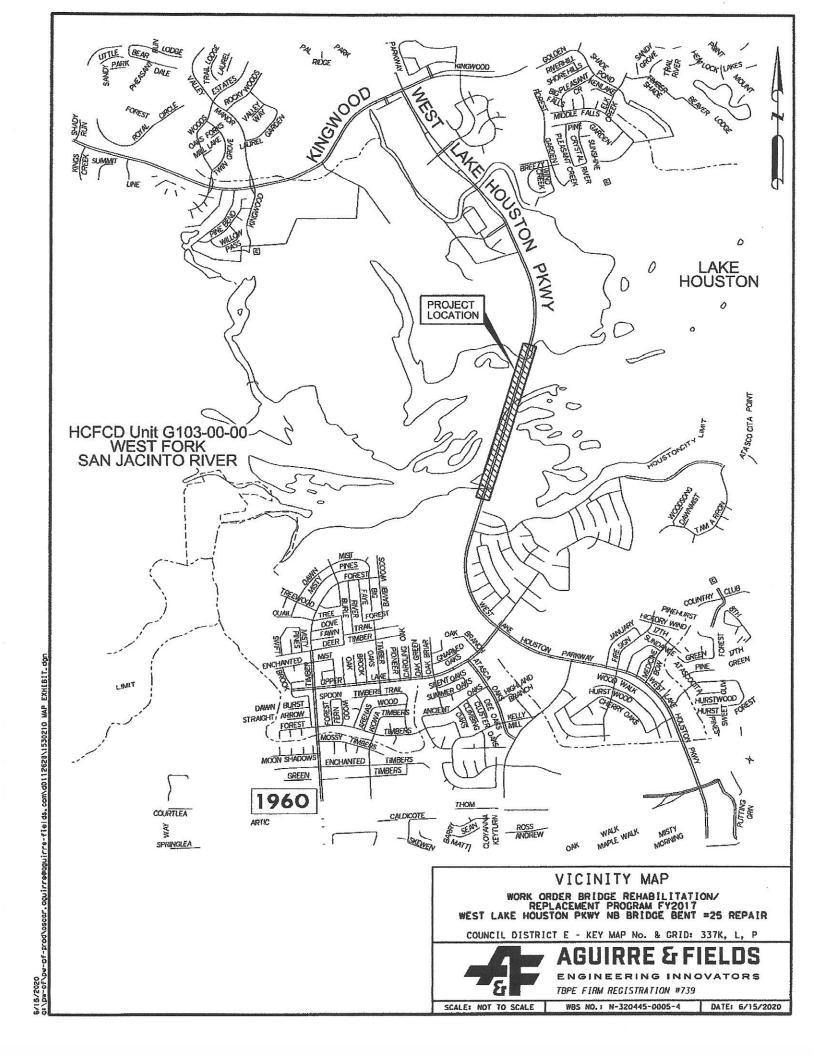

Background:

RECOMMENDATION:

Enact an ordinance appropriating \$19,520,000.00 out of the HAS Consolidated ITRP AMT Construction Fund (8207) and \$341,600.00 for Civic Art out of the HAS Airports Improvement Fund (8011) for the Professional Services Agreement with Fentress Architects, Ltd. for the completion of Stages 3-6 of Architectural and Engineering (A/E) Design Services for the Mickey Leland International Terminal (MLIT) Project (Project No. 826) at George Bush Intercontinental Airport/Houston (IAH).

SPECIFIC EXPLANATION:

In November 2016, City Council approved Ordinance 2016-919, approving and authorizing a Professional Services contract with Fentress Architects, Ltd. for Architectural and Engineering (A/E) Design Services for the Mickey Leland International Terminal (MLIT) Project and appropriating an initial \$54,177,500.00.

Under the authorization granted by Council in 2016, Terminal D, also known at the Mickey Leland International Terminal, was due to be replaced by a new modern terminal. During the conclusion of Schematic Design phase, the Houston Airport System (HAS) reviewed the functional and operational inter-connections between the MLIT design and the proposed project scope for the Federal Inspection Services (FIS) facility. The core objectives of a modified approach were then set to maximize efficiency by making better use of existing assets, develop demand-based construction, and minimize the impact on Cost per Enplaned Passenger (CPE) to the air carriers utilizing the facilities. As a result, the Mickey Leland terminal was converted to a gate concourse (the North Concourse) serving the foreign flag carriers, and a new structure, the International

Central Processor, to be built as an extension of the FIS facility in the space currently occupied by the Terminal D parking garage, was included for passenger processing.

Under the revised scope of services to be provided by Fentress, the existing Old Terminal C North (OCN) Pier will be replaced, and the Terminal D and C-D Connector facilities will be refurbished. The North Concourse will provide between 15 and 22 contact gates, with a minimum of 13 gates able to accommodate wide-body aircraft. The existing Terminal D ticketing and curb facilities will be closed once the Terminal D carriers have relocated to the New International Central Processor.

In October 2018, City Council enacted Ordinance 2018-877, approving and authorizing Amendment No. 1 to the Agreement with Fentress Architects, Ltd., for the revised approach reallocating the existing design services to provide Program Validation and an overall Concept Design for both the North Concourse and the International Central Processor. Per Amendment No. 1, the approved approach was to utilize the current remaining fee to commence the required Program Validation and revised Concept Design, and once a better understanding for the cost to do the more difficult work of determining what improvements to the North Concourse must be accomplished, as well as the additional work to produce an overarching conceptual design integrating the new International Central Processor with the North Gate Concourse, a revised fee with Fentress would be negotiated.

With the completion of 60% of design for the Modified Approach, it is now requested Council authorize an additional appropriation of \$19,861,600.00 to complete the design of the MLIT North Concourse, including design administration during construction.

RECOMMENDATION:

Enact an ordinance appropriating \$19,520,000.00 out of the HAS Consolidated ITRP AMT Construction Fund (8207) and \$341,600.00 for Civic Art out of the HAS Airports Improvement Fund (8011) for the Professional Services Agreement with Fentress Architects, Ltd. for the completion of Stages 3-6 of Architectural and Engineering (A/E) Design Services for the Mickey Leland International Terminal (MLIT) Project (Project No. 826) at George Bush Intercontinental Airport/Houston (IAH).

SPECIFIC EXPLANATION:

In November 2016, City Council approved Ordinance 2016-919, approving and authorizing a Professional Services contract with Fentress Architects, Ltd. for Architectural and Engineering (A/E) Design Services for the Mickey Leland International Terminal (MLIT) Project and appropriating an initial \$54,177,500.00.

Under the authorization granted by Council in 2016, Terminal D, also known at the Mickey Leland International Terminal, was due to be replaced by a new modern terminal. During the conclusion of Schematic Design phase, the Houston Airport System (HAS) reviewed the functional and operational inter-connections between the MLIT design and the proposed project scope for the Federal Inspection Services (FIS) facility. The core objectives of a modified approach were then set to maximize efficiency by making better use of existing assets, develop demand-based construction, and minimize the impact on Cost per Enplaned Passenger (CPE) to the air carriers utilizing the facilities. As a result, the Mickey Leland terminal was converted to a gate concourse (the North Concourse) serving the foreign flag carriers, and a new structure, the International Central Processor, to be built as an extension of the FIS facility in the space currently occupied by the Terminal D parking garage, was included for passenger processing.

Under the revised scope of services to be provided by Fentress, the existing Old Terminal C North (OCN) Pier will be replaced, and the Terminal D and C-D Connector facilities will be refurbished. The North Concourse will provide between 15 and 22 contact gates, with a minimum of 13 gates able to accommodate wide-body aircraft. The existing Terminal D ticketing and curb facilities will be closed once the Terminal D carriers have relocated to the New International Central Processor.

In October 2018, City Council enacted Ordinance 2018-877, approving and authorizing Amendment No. 1 to the Agreement with Fentress Architects, Ltd., for the revised approach reallocating the existing design services to provide Program Validation and an overall Concept Design for both the North Concourse and the International Central Processor. Per Amendment No. 1, the approved approach was to utilize the current remaining fee to commence the required Program Validation and revised Concept Design, and once a better understanding for the cost to do the more difficult work of determining what improvements to the North Concourse must be accomplished, as well as the additional work to produce an overarching conceptual design integrating the new International Central Processor with the North Gate Concourse, a revised fee with Fentress would be negotiated.

With the completion of 60% of design for the Modified Approach, it is now requested Council authorize an additional appropriation of \$19,861,600.00 to complete the design of the MLIT North Concourse, including design administration during construction.

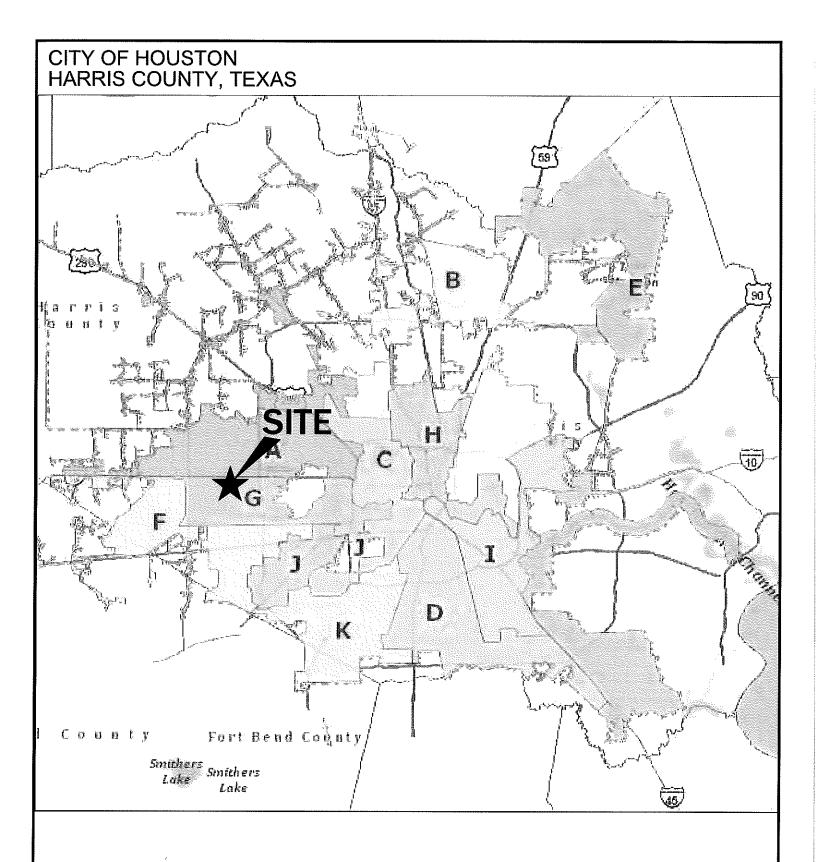

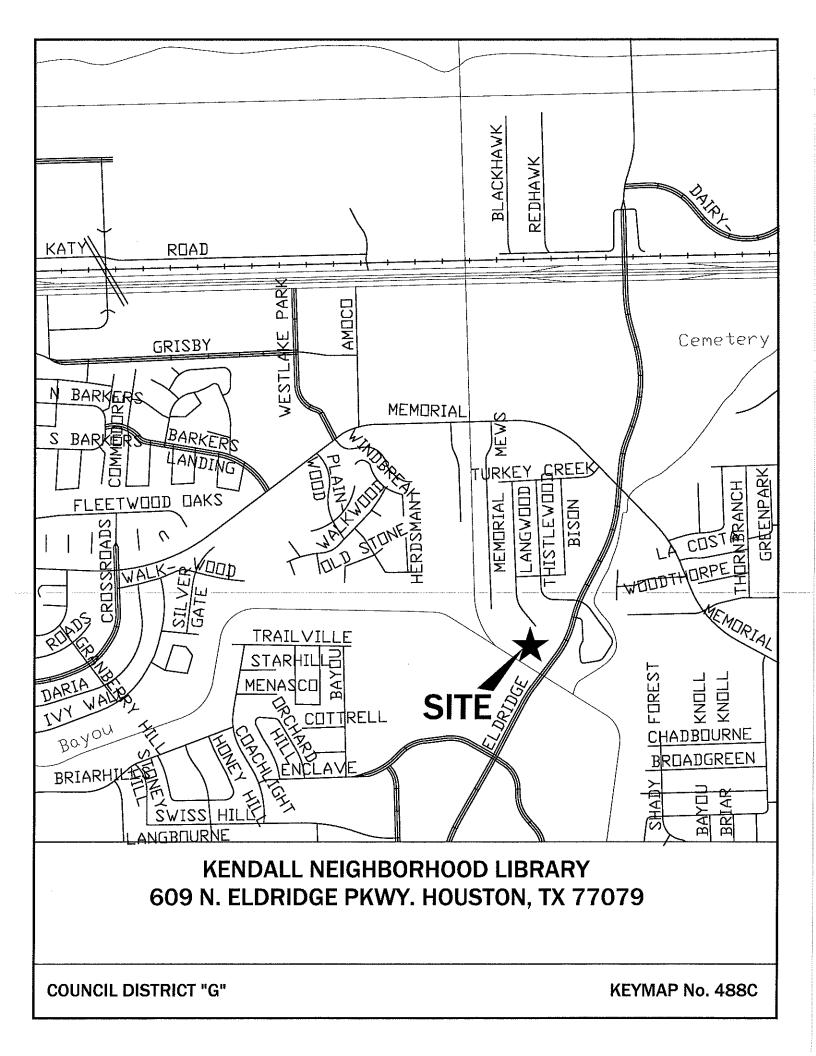

ARA's Franchise Administration Division collects franchise fees from commercial solid waste transporters, coordinates audits and compliance reviews and actively monitors state/federal legislation and administrative proceedings that impact these fees. The City currently has 303 solid waste operator franchises. For FY 2019, the total solid waste franchise revenue to the City is projected to be \$8,173,973.

The proposed ordinance grants the franchisee the right to use the City's public ways for the purpose of collecting, hauling or transporting solid or industrial waste from commercial properties located within the City of Houston. In consideration for this grant, each franchisee agrees to pay to the City an annual franchise fee equal to four percent of their annual gross revenue, payable quarterly. To verify franchisee compliance with the franchise, the franchisee company has the duty to maintain required customer records, which the City has the right to inspect during regular business hours. The franchise agreement contains the City's standard release and indemnification, default and termination, liquidated damages and force majeure provisions. The proposed franchise term is 10 years from the effective date.

Background:

SUBJECT: Accept Work for New Front Easement Reconnections.

RECOMMENDATION: (Summary) Pass a motion to approve the final contract amount of \$1,289,229.47, which is 0.94% under the original contract amount, accept the work, and authorize final payment.

PROJECT NOTICE/JUSTIFICATION: This project was part of the Neighborhood Back Lot New Front Easement Reconnections and was required to provide the relocation of sanitary sewer services to the existing front lot main.

DESCRIPTION/SCOPE: This project consisted of the relocation of sanitary sewer service lines for approximately 100 properties in various locations within the City of Houston. The relocations included the abandonment of the sanitary sewer services to the back lot main and the installation of new sewer services to the existing front lot main. The project was awarded to T Construction, LLC with an original contract amount of \$1,301,504.97. The Notice to Proceed date was 05/17/2017 and the project had 730 calendar days for completion.

LOCATION: This work order project was located at various locations within Council Districts B, C, D, H and I.

CONTRACT COMPLETION AND COST: The contractor T Construction, LLC, has completed the work under the contract. The contract was completed within the contract time. The final cost of the project is \$1,289,229.47, a decrease of \$12,275.50 or 0.94% under the original contract amount. Fewer sanitary sewer service lines were needed than anticipated.

MWDBE PARTICIPATION: The MWBE goal for this project was 24%. According to the Office

of Business Opportunity, the actual participation was 13.44% and they awarded the contractor an Unsatisfactory rating. While the contactor utilized MWBE-certified subcontractors, they did not utilize the ones identified in their plans and did not follow the deviation process to adjust their original MWBE plan. T Construction appealed their unsatisfactory rating to The Office of Business Opportunity (OBO), but that appeal was denied. OBO did advise them how to perform better on future contracts and has assigned a high-level staff member to work with T Construction on understanding compliance.

Background:

Formal Bids Received April 2, 2020 for S10-L29316 – Approve an ordinance awarding a contract to Prime Trees Inc. in the maximum contract amount not to exceed \$4,435,365.00 for tree removal, trimming and pruning services for the Houston Parks & Recreation Department.

Specific Explanation:

The Director of the Houston Parks & Recreation Department and the Chief Procurement Officer recommend that City Council approve an ordinance awarding a **three-year contract with two one-year options** to **Prime Trees Inc.** on its low bid meeting specifications for tree removal, trimming and pruning services in the the maximum contract amount not to exceed **\$4,435,365.00** for Parks & Recreation Department.

This project was advertised in accordance with the requirements of the State of Texas bid laws. Thirty-seven prospective bidders downloaded the solicitation document from SPD's e-bidding website, and three bids were received as outlined below:
