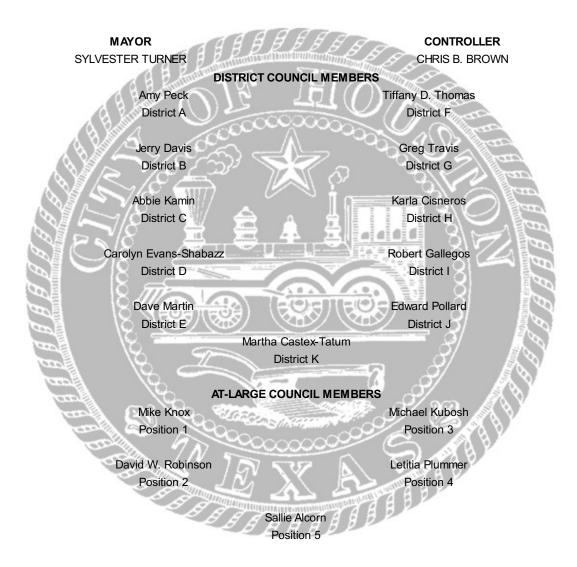

Summary:

MOTION awarding the Sale of \$230,000,000.00 Tax and Revenue Anticipation Notes, Series 2020, based on the lowest true interest cost, ratify and confirm the use of the Preliminary Official Statement provided to prospective bidders in connection with the offering for sale of the Notes, and authorize the distribution of the Official Statement

Background:

RECOMMENDATION:

Adopt a motion authorizing the Mayor and City Controller to award the sale of up to \$230,000,000 Tax and Revenue Anticipation Notes, Series 2020 (the "Notes") and take any other action required related to the issuance of the Notes, including ratification and confirmation of the use of the Preliminary Official Statement provided to prospective bidders in connection with the offering for sale of the Notes and approval of the preparation and distribution of the Official Statement.

SPECIFIC EXPLANATION:

On May 20, 2020, City Council passed two Ordinances No. 2020-0438; 2020-0439 (the "Ordinances") authorizing the issuance and sale of Tax and Revenue Anticipation Notes, Series 2020 (the "Notes"). As in prior years, the proceeds of the Notes will be used to fund General Fund operating expenditures in anticipation of the receipt of ad valorem tax revenues later in Fiscal Year 2021.

On or about June 24, 2020, a Notice of Sale and Preliminary Official Statement was made available to prospective purchasers relating to the offering of up to \$230,000,000 of Notes, and requesting the delivery of the bids on July 8, 2020. The bids are received through an auction format described below that allows a broker/dealer to bid for the total principal amount of the Notes or a lesser principal amount; therefore, the "winning bid" may be awarded to more than one firm.

As in prior years, electronic bids for the Notes will be received via Grant Street (a web based auction system) between 8:30 a.m. – 9:00 a.m. Central Daylight Time on July 8, 2020; however, to ensure that the City receives the most competitive bids, if any bid becomes a leading bid (i.e. lowest yield) within two minutes prior to the scheduled end of the bidding, then the time period for submission of bids will automatically extend by two minutes to allow other bidders to participate. At the close of the bidding period, the Office of the City Controller, Finance Department, and the City's financial advisors will verify interest rate calculations of bids received and provide the results to the City Council. Upon receiving the results, City Council is requested to adopt a motion to award the sale to one or more purchasers based on the lowest true interest cost, ratify and confirm

the use of the Preliminary Official Statement and authorize the distribution of the Official Statement. It is expected that the proceeds from the sale of the Notes will be available on Friday, July 21, 2020.

SPECIFIC EXPLANATION:

On May 20, 2020, City Council passed two Ordinances No. 2020-0438; 2020-0439 (the "Ordinances") authorizing the issuance and sale of Tax and Revenue Anticipation Notes, Series 2020 (the "Notes"). As in prior years, the proceeds of the Notes will be used to fund General Fund operating expenditures in anticipation of the receipt of ad valorem tax revenues later in Fiscal Year 2021.

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As in prior years, electronic bids for the Notes will be received via Grant Street (a web based auction system) between 8:30 a.m. – 9:00 a.m. Central Daylight Time on July 8, 2020; however, to ensure that the City receives the most competitive bids, if any bid becomes a leading bid (i.e. lowest yield) within two minutes prior to the scheduled end of the bidding, then the time period for submission of bids will automatically extend by two minutes to allow other bidders to participate. At the close of the bidding period, the Office of the City Controller, Finance Department, and the City's financial advisors will verify interest rate calculations of bids received and provide the results to the City Council. Upon receiving the results, City Council is requested to adopt a motion to award the sale to one or more purchasers based on the lowest true interest cost, ratify and confirm the use of the Preliminary Official Statement and authorize the distribution of the Official Statement. It is expected that the proceeds from the sale of the Notes will be available on Friday, July 21, 2020.

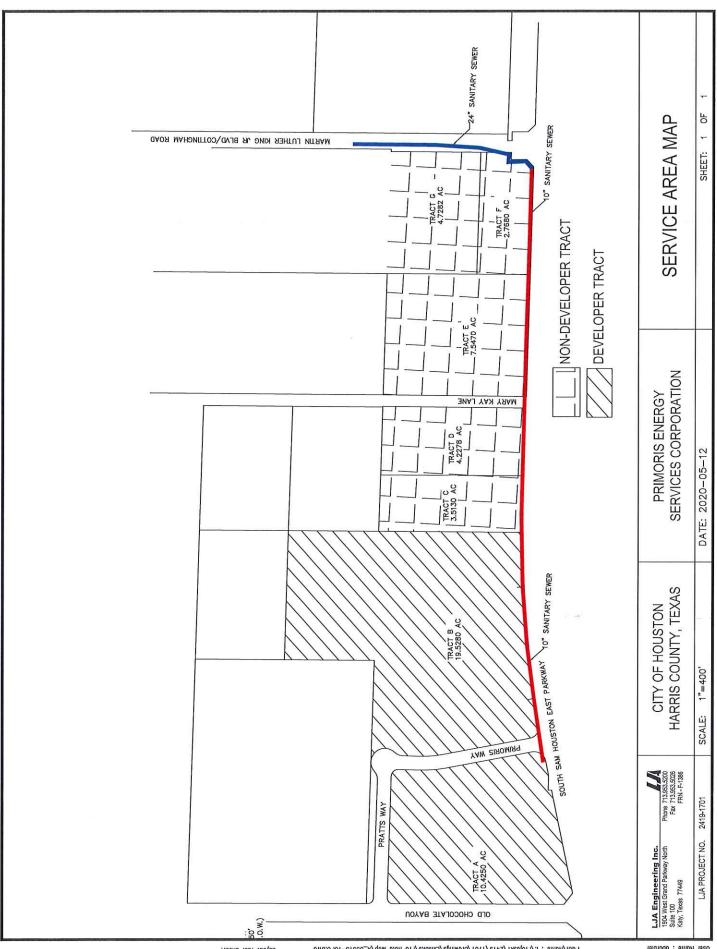

SUBJECT: Accept Work for Pump and Lift Station Renewal and Replacement – Consolidation of Post Oak, Stablewood and Buckingham Lift Station.

RECOMMENDATION: (SUMMARY) Pass a motion to approve the final Contract Amount of \$19,485,843.93 or 0.20% under the revised Contract Amount, accept the Work and authorize final payment.

PROJECT NOTICE/JUSTIFICATION: This project was part of the City's ongoing program for lift station renewal and replacement.

<u>DESCRIPTION/SCOPE</u>: This project consisted of consolidation of Post Oak, Stablewood, and Buckingham lift stations into a gravity system. ARCADIS U.S., Inc. designed the project with 495 calendar days allowed for construction. The project was awarded to BRH-Garver Construction, L. P. with an original Contract Amount of \$14,594,955.72 and an additional appropriation of \$4,930,392.75 for a revised Contract amount of \$19,525,348.47.

LOCATION: This project was developed along East Friar Tuck Lane, Sandringham Drive, Buckingham Drive, Memorial Drive, Stable Lane, Stable Crest Boulevard, Stablewood Boulevard, North Post Oak Lane, and Woodway Drive.

<u>CONTRACT COMPLETION AND COST:</u> The Contractor, BRH-Garver Construction, L.P., has completed the work under the subject Contract. The project was completed beyond the established completion date with an additional 788 days approved by Change Order Nos. 2,3, and 5. The final cost of the project, including overrun and underrun of estimated unit price quantities and previously approved Change Order Nos. 1,2,4, and 5 is \$19,485,843.93, a decrease of \$39,504.54 or 0.20% under the revised Contract Amount. The decreased cost is a result of the

difference between planned and measured quantities.

M/WSBE PARTICIPATION: The advertised M/WBE contract goal for this project was 20.00%. The M/WBE plan established for this project was 20.00%. According to Office of Business Opportunity, the participation was 12.12%. Contractor's M/WBE performance evaluation was rated Satisfactory due to Good Faith Efforts. The shortfall in the MWSBE participation was due to the amount of time that elapsed from the bid date until the firm received the Notice to Proceed, site conditions that were different from those anticipated - consisting of sandstone and contaminated ground water, and a change order that substantively changed the contract. Seventy percent of the project was different from the initial contract documents, which neither the firm nor the subcontractors listed on the RCA had the ability to perform. The firm later added additional MWSBE subcontractors and suppliers to meet the MWSBE goal. The firm's efforts on this project allowed it to replace much of the MWSBE participation lost due to reasons beyond the firm's control, which greatly impacted their ability to meet the MBE and WBE participation goals.

RESOLUTION amending Resolution No. 2020-0024 to correct the designation of the area where **POWELL ELECTRICAL SYSTEMS, INC**, will be conducting business as a qualified enterprise zone - **DISTRICT I - GALLEGOS**

Background:

The Texas Enterprise Zone Program is an economic development tool for local communities to partner with the State of Texas to promote job creation and capital investment. A State Enterprise Zone is any census tract block group that has a 20% or higher poverty rate, as determined by the U.S. Census Bureau during each decennial census.

State law requires a municipality or county to nominate a project of a qualified business for designation as an Enterprise Project to participate in the Enterprise Zone Program. Legislation limits allocations to the state and local communities per biennium; the City is limited to a maximum of 9 project designations. Chapter 2303 of the Texas Government Code grants municipalities the authority to nominate projects located within their extraterritorial jurisdiction (ETJ).

Enterprise Projects are eligible to apply for state sales and use tax refunds on qualified expenditures. The level and amount of a refund is based on the capital investment and jobs created or retained at the qualified business site. Depending on the investment amount, there is a refund to the company of \$2,500 and up to \$7,500 per job.

On May 13, 2020, City Council adopted resolution 2020-0024 authorizing the City to nominate Powell Electrical Systems for consideration for the state incentive. The City is seeking an amendment to this resolution that will change the language in the sixth paragraph, first numbering from "the active conduct of a trade or business in an area of the state that does not qualify as an enterprise zone, and at least 35 percent of the Company's new permanent jobs" to "the active conduct of a trade or business in an enterprise zone, and at least 25 percent of the Company's new permanent jobs" due to the fact that Powell Electrical Systems' projects are located within enterprise zones.

The State of Texas requests that this amendment be made in order for Powell Electrical Systems to be considered for the Texas Enterprise Zone incentive.

State law requires a municipality or county to nominate a project of a qualified business for designation as an Enterprise Project to participate in the Enterprise Zone Program. Legislation limits allocations to the state and local communities per biennium; the City is limited to a maximum of 9 project designations. Chapter 2303 of the Texas Government Code grants municipalities the authority to nominate projects located within their extraterritorial jurisdiction (ETJ).

Enterprise Projects are eligible to apply for state sales and use tax refunds on qualified expenditures. The level and amount of a refund is based on the capital investment and jobs created or retained at the qualified business site. Depending on the investment amount, there is a refund to the company of \$2,500 and up to \$7,500 per job.

City Council adopted an ordinance authorizing the City to nominate projects for this state-funded incentive. This project was presented to the District Councilmember. The City is nominating Powell Electrical Systems, Inc. as its third TEZ project in the FY29 – FY21 biennium with a planned capital investment of \$8 million, creation of 100 jobs and retention of 1369 jobs. The amount of the investment for this project will produce a maximum reimbursement of \$2,500 for up to 500 jobs or \$1,250,000 over a five-year term, at an annual rate not to exceed \$250,000. The project site is located within a Texas Enterprise Zone and therefore 25% of new jobs must be filled by residents of an enterprise zone or individuals who are economically disadvantaged.

Powell Electrical Systems is a provider of packaged solutions for the control, monitoring, and distribution of electrical power and other critical processes with headquarters in Houston, Texas. Powell Industries manufactures electrical equipment and computer systems that monitor the flow of electricity in industrial facilities. Over the next 5 years, Powell plans to spend over \$5 million in upgrades to Powell's electrical division manufacturing components, IT server refreshes and to purchase computers, a roof replacement for the manufacturing

building and to spend additional capitalized expenditures at its two sites

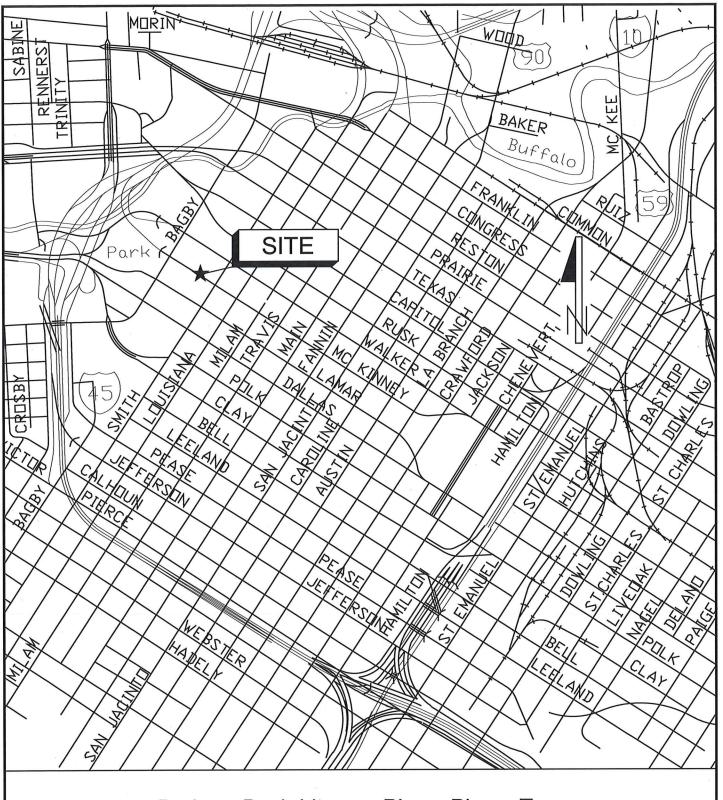

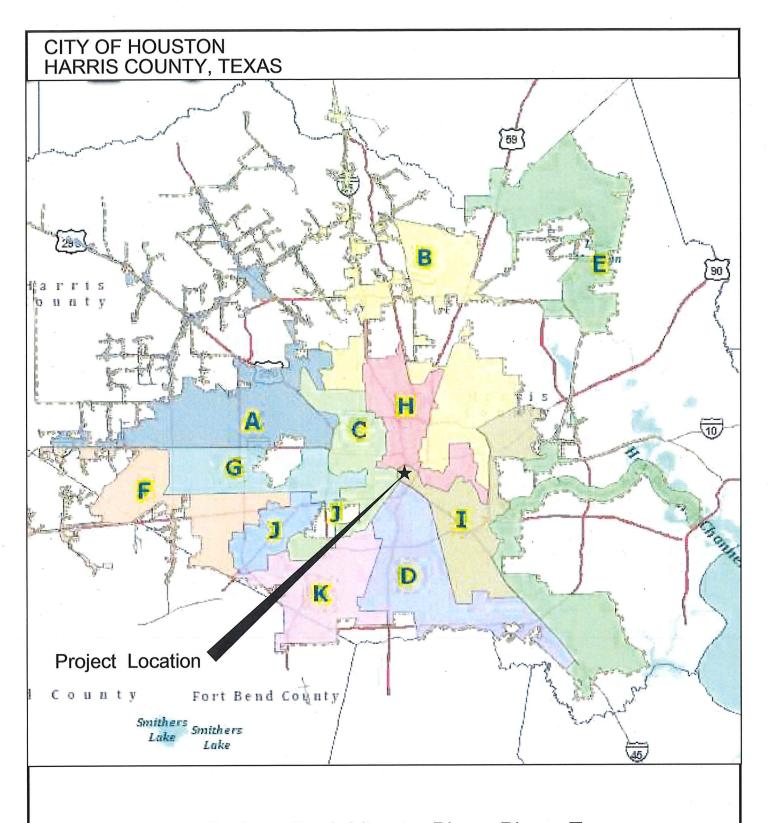

Background:

The Chief of Police for the Houston Police Department (HPD) recommends that City Council approve an ordinance authorizing the electronic application for and acceptance of grant funds through the Texas Department of Transportation (TXDOT) for the FY2021 Selective Traffic Enforcement Program (STEP) Comprehensive Motor Vehicle Traffic Safety Grant. If awarded, TXDOT will provide \$999,999.92 in grant funding. No cash match is required by the City, but an inkind contribution is required. The grant period becomes effective October 1, 2020 and ends on September 30, 2021.

HPD will utilize the grant to fund overtime for personnel over the 12 month-period to reduce the number of crashes, injuries and fatalities by increasing and sustaining high visibility enforcement of DWI laws, occupant protection laws, speed-related laws, intersection traffic control laws, and state and local ordinances on cellular and texting devices. The City's in-kind contribution consists of the associate costs for using HPD vehicles for the grant program (maintenance, gas, mileage) and the fringe benefit costs of HPD classified personnel working under the grant program.

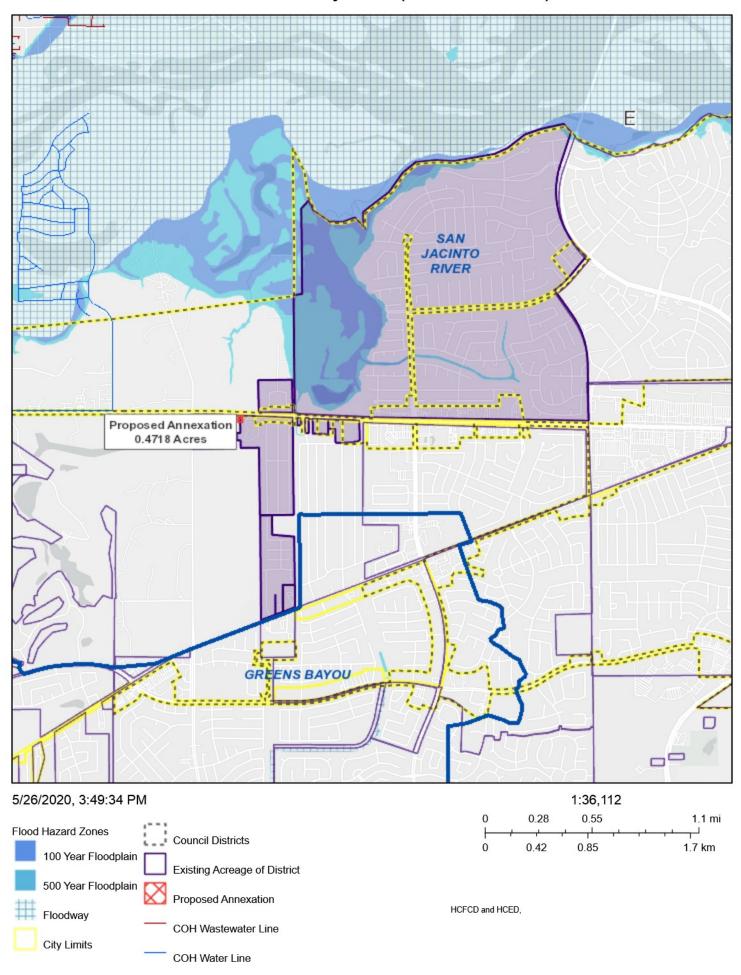

Background:

The Housing and Community Development Department (HCDD) recommends Council approve an additional \$900,000.00 in previously appropriated TIRZ Affordable Housing Funds to fund the remainder of a contract between the City of Houston (City) and I&I Software to design, build, maintain and support an Information Management System (IMS) to manage HCDD's Hurricane Harvey Disaster Recovery operations.

This contract was approved by Council on October 24, 2018, by Ordinance No. 2018-863, for a total amount of \$1,640,000.00. This Ordinance was issued with initial funding from TIRZ Affordable Housing funds of \$945,000.00, with the expectation that the TIRZ Affordable Housing funds would be reimbursed, and the remainder of the contract funded, with Community Development Block Grant-Disaster Recovery 2017 (CDBG-DR17) funds when those funds became available. On December 3, 2019, by Ordinance No. 2019-965, the FY2020 TIRZ Affordable Housing Funds budget was adopted, which appropriated funding for single family activity. On February 19, 2020, by Ordinance No. 2020-114, an additional \$695,000.00 in TIRZ Affordable Housing funds was added to the contract to bring the total amount to \$1,640,000.00. This request will add \$900,000.00 to bring the new total to \$2,540.000.00.

During a monitoring review, it was determined that while the contract was issued in accordance with the City's purchase of products and services from the Contractor under the Contractor's General Services Administration (GSA) Contract, the procurement did not adhere to federal procurement standards as prescribed by 2 CFR 200. Therefore, costs incurred under this contract not eligible for reimbursement under CDBG-DR17. The contract will soon be re-procured, but it is not expected to be finalized before initial funds may expire. This request adds additional time and funding to continue to maintain, enhance, and add more functionality to the Harvey IMS.

Completion of the IMS is critical for successful implementation and administration of CDBG-DR17 programs. Additional funding will be used by the City and its contractors to continue to record all program information, perform financial grant management and drive work processes. It will also be used to continue to track applicant progress, develop and provide milestone reporting, while satisfying all US Department of Housing and Urban Development, Texas General Land Office and City requirements for the program.
