Houston participates in Entergy proceedings, including rate proceedings, as a member of the Steering Committee of Cities (the Coalition), a group of similarly situated cities with Entergy customers within their city limits.

On September 1, 2021, Entergy filed an application to amend its DCRF rate rider within its service territory, including Houston. Entergy is requesting an approximate \$13.9 million incremental increase to current DCRF rates, for a total DCRF revenue requirement of \$40.2 million annually. Of the total amount requested, approximately \$24.8 million will be collected from residential customers. If Entergy's current request is approved, the average residential customer using 1,000 kWh per month would experience an approximate \$1.34 increase to the monthly electric bill (compared to existing DCRF rates). The proposed rate request will impact approximately 1,800 customers in the Kingwood area — 1,500 residential and 300 commercial customers. This is the fourth DCRF filed by Entergy since its last base rate case proceeding.

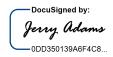

Summary:

ORDINANCE approving and authorizing Professional Services Agreement between **BUTLER SNOW LLP** and City of Houston relating to review of allegations relating to or arising from affordable housing matters; establishing a maximum contract amount - \$275,000.00 - Property and Casualty Fund

Background:

The City Attorney and the Chief Procurement Officer recommend City Council approve an Ordinance authorizing an agreement between the City of Houston ("City") and Butler Snow LLP ("Firm") for professional investigative and legal services with a maximum contract amount of \$275,000.00. The Legal Department has issued a \$50,000.00 purchase order to enable the Firm to begin work immediately. City Council is being asked to approve an additional \$275,000.00 in the contract before City Council.

The former HCDD Director has made allegations relating to affordable housing matters, and one particular project, resulting in potential loss of confidence in City processes for supporting affordable housing projects. The City Attorney recommends engaging the Firm to conduct a thorough internal investigation because the Firm has the necessary experience and ability to conduct such an investigation and to report on any potential illegality, fraud, conflicts of interest, and/or violations of procedures, practices, or policies.

The Firm's attorneys are experienced and highly capable of analyzing the documents and policies involved, conducting thorough witness interviews, and they have successfully handled similar complex internal investigations. The lead attorney is a former federal and state prosecutor as well as a civil litigator, and is highly qualified and experienced in the area of complex internal investigations. 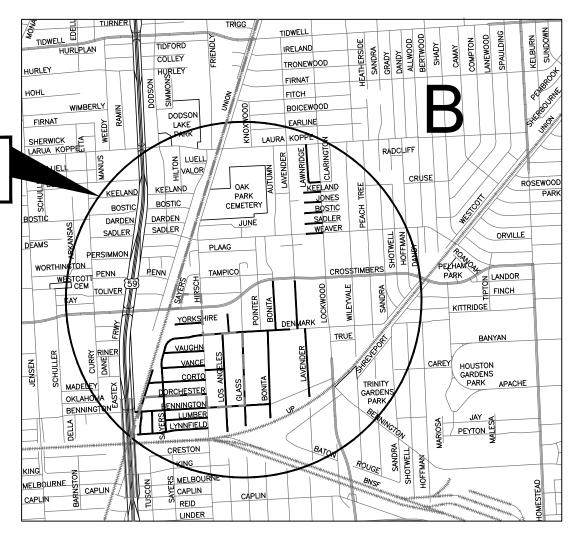

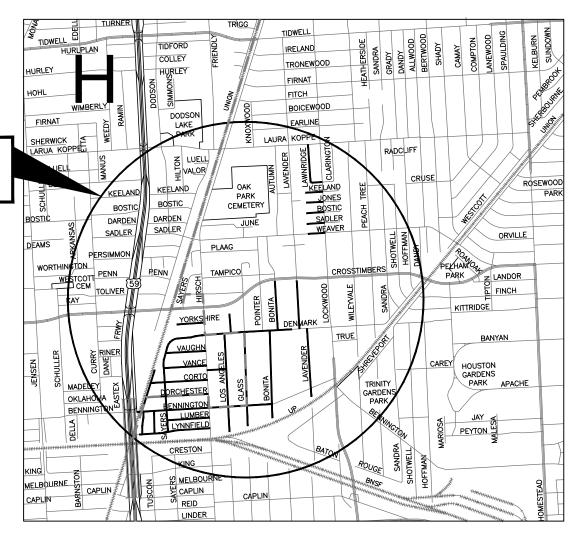
