Background:

RECOMMENDATION: The General Services Department recommends approval of the final contract amount of \$2,192,273.00 and acceptance of work on a contract with Times Construction, Inc. for Brock Adventure Park – 4.89% over the original contract amount.

SPECIFIC EXPLANATION: The General Services Department recommends that City Council approve the final contract amount of \$2,192,273.00, accept the work and authorize final payment to Times Construction, Inc. for construction services in connection with Brock Adventure Park, for the Houston Parks and Recreation Department.

PROJECT LOCATION: 8201 John Ralston, Houston, TX 77044

PROJECT DESCRIPTION: The scope of work repurposed a portion of the golf course into an adventure park which includes a new playground, an obstacle course, disc and foot golf courses, putting green, fishing pier, and walking trails. Improvements were also made to the existing parking lot, lights and sidewalks along with tree plantings and irrigation.

Clark Condon Associates, Inc. was the design consultant for this project.

CONTRACT COMPLETION AND COST: The contractor completed the project within 352 days: the original contract time of 180 days, plus 172 days approved by Change Orders. The final cost of the project, including Change Orders is \$2,192,273.00, an increase of \$102,273.00 over the original contract amount.



Background:

<u>SUBJECT: PROPERTY:</u> Purchase of Parcel DY19-015 located at 9333 Main Street, Houston, TX 77025 for the WESTRIDGE REGIONAL LIFT STATION CONSTRUCTION PROJECT.

RECOMMENDATION: (Summary) Authority be given through Council Motion to PURCHASE Parcel DY19-015.

SPECIFIC EXPLANATION:

The Westridge Regional Lift Station Construction Project is part of the City's ongoing program to improve its wastewater infrastructure through rehabilitation, replacement, consolidation, or diversion of wastewater lift stations throughout the City. The project provides for the design and construction of the required improvements; structural, mechanical, and electrical components at the lift stations. The project is needed for reliable and efficient collection of wastewater throughout the City and to ensure compliance with regulatory requirements and to protect public health.

The City's offer was based on an appraisal by Michael Miggins, MAI, R/W-AC. Efforts by Houston Public Works to negotiate the purchase proved unsuccessful, and the matter was referred to the Legal Department to initiate condemnation proceedings. Before the Special Commissioners Hearing, the parties entered negotiations and were able to reconcile their differences. The agreement is subject to the City's council's approval and in lieu of further condemnation actions by the City. The breakdown of the negotiated compensation is as follows:

Parcel DY19-015 (Easement)

It is recommended that authority be given through Council Motion to PURCHASE the land and improvements thereon for Parcel DY19-015 located at 9333 Main Street, Houston, TX 77025.

Parcel DY19-015 is a 7,517 square feet parcel of land situated in the D. White Survey, Abstract No. 887, Harris County, Texas, being, a portion of a called 10.3296-acre tract as described in deed to Prime Storage L.C., as recorded on June 18, 1999, in Harris County Clerk's File (HCCF) No. T794916 and also described as a portion of Prime Storage Partial Replat No. 1, an addition to the City of Houston as recorded on February 14, 2003 in Harris County Film Code (FC) No. 529285, of the Harris County map Records (HCMR), Harris County, Texas, according to City of Houston approved field notes.

Summary:

STRYKER SALES, LLC for sole source purchase of Power-PRO XT Ambulance Cots and Stair Chairs for Houston Fire Department - \$259,380.64 - Equipment Acquisition Consolidated Fund

Background:

Sole Source for S78-E31175 – Approve a purchase from Stryker Sales, LLC in an amount not to exceed \$259,380.64 for Power-PRO XT ambulance cots and stair chairs for Houston Fire Department.

SPECIFIC EXPLANATION:

The Chief of the Houston Fire Department (HFD) and the Chief Procurement Officer recommend that City Council approve a purchase from **Stryker Sales**, **LLC** in an amount not to exceed **\$259,380.64** for Power-Pro XT ambulance cots and stair chairs that authorization be given to issue a purchase.

HFD's Emergency Medical Services (EMS) division is purchasing (12) Stryker Power-Pro XT ambulance cots (Model 6506) and (20) stair chairs (Model 6252) to replace old stretchers that require replacement per their annual maintenance preventive schedule and to address the increased use in response to COVID-19. HFD's ambulances are outfitted with a crash-rated locking system that is compatible with proprietary sensor mechanisms and is designed to secure Stryker manufactured models. Stryker Sales, LLC is the sole manufacturer of the Stryker Power-Pro XT. This purchase includes a two (2)-year warranty on the cot and a three (3)-year warranty on frames. A one (1)-year warranty on the stair chairs parts and labor is also included. The manufacturer's production lead time is four (4) to six (6) weeks from receipt of a purchase order.

Stryker Sales, LLC is the only approved manufacturer, designer, and distributor of these transport products and remains the exclusive service and equipment provider for the hospital equipment, emergency response services, and emergency response training markets in the US and Canada.

This recommendation is made pursuant to subsection 252.022(a)(7) of the Texas Local Government Code, which provides that "a procurement of items that are available from only one source." is exempt from the competitive requirements for purchases.

Chapter 6 Code of Ordinances Proposed Changes Frequently Asked Questions

1. Why is BARC proposing changes to Chapter 6?

Chapter 6 of the City of Houston Code of Ordinances ("Code") applies to animals or property found or located within the corporate limits of the city. Chapter 6 was last amended in May 2014. Since that time, substantial changes in State law have been passed—most recently Senate Bill 5 in the 87th legislative session, third special session—as well as improvements in animal licensing and tracking technology have been developed. The new State laws include revisions to aggressive and dangerous dog procedures, dog restraint standards for sheltering outside animals, and mandated access to clean drinking water and adequate shelter always for outside animals.

The Chapter 6 ordinance changes bring Houston into compliance with state law as well as incorporate technological changes, such as microchip solutions, and correct ordinance scrivener's errors from previous amendments.

2. How will these new changes impact Houston pet owners?

The proposed amendments include mandatory microchipping for all owned animals which would eliminate the traditional rabies tag, replacing it with a microchip. A City pet license will still be required; however, rather than issuing a physical metal tag for the pet's collar – which can easily be lost or damaged – BARC will use the microchip number as the proof of licensing. The microchips will expedite the return of lost animals to their owners. Mandatory microchipping will not be required for non-residents who are staying less than 30 days or for temporary caretakers of lost or abandoned animals.

3. Do these changes incorporate proposals from animal advocates regarding pet stores?

Yes, currently there are no prohibitions on pet stores in Houston. The proposed amendments would require all pet stores located within the city limits to sell only dogs and cats sourced from a humane organization or a municipal/county animal shelter. A humane organization is a not-for-profit organization that does not breed animals or does not obtain a dog or cat from a person or organization that breeds or sells animals.

4. How will this amendment affect existing pet stores in Houston?

Although this provision will be effective immediately for any *new* entrant to the Houston market, existing pet stores will be given one year to come into compliance.

5. How do the proposed amendments address animal enforcement and the City's stray population?

Mandatory microchipping will allow BARC – or any other humane organization that finds a stray animal or lost pet – to scan the animal and return it to its owner immediately, eliminating the need to bring the animal to the shelter for intake and care.

Additionally, the proposed changes streamline and strengthen the process for dangerous dog designations and rabies evaluations

The amendment would also reduce the stray hold from 72 to 48 hours for animals without a microchip and would require that all animals be sterilized before leaving BARC.

6. What changes are being proposed for the standards for animals that are kept outdoors?

BARC proposes amending Chapter 6 to incorporate the new standards established by Senate Bill 5, which was approved by the Texas Legislature during the third special session of the 87th legislative session. The bill requires that the animal must always have access to clean drinking water and "adequate shelter." The amendment more clearly defines "adequate shelter" as a structure that is:

- Clean
- Of sturdy construction
- Large enough for the animal to stand, sit, turn around, and lie down normally.

In addition, adequate shelter:

- Provides protection from wind, rain, snow, sleet, and subfreezing temperatures
- Provides protection from direct sunlight
- Allows the animal to avoid standing water
- Provides sufficient shelter for each animal appropriate to the species.



Summary:

ORDINANCE approving and authorizing Professional Services Agreement between **BRACEWELL LLP** and City of Houston relating to Contamination of Property and Groundwater in the vicinity of Kashmere Gardens, the Fifth Ward, Denver Harbor and Trinity Gardens; establishing a maximum contract amount - \$900,000.00 - Property and Casualty Fund

Background:

The City Attorney recommends City Council approve an Ordinance authorizing an agreement between the City of Houston ("City") and Bracewell LLP ("Firm") for professional legal services with a maximum contract amount of \$900,000.00.

This proposed agreement replaces a legal services agreement for the same purpose with another law firm approved by Council on October 27, 2021. This other law firm withdrew its representation stating a client conflict had developed. Funds were not expended under the contract with the prior firm. The contract amount is the same under both contracts.

This request relates to the contamination of property and groundwater in the vicinity of Kashmere Gardens, the Fifth Ward, Denver Harbor and Trinity Gardens, arising from a former creosote operation located on property owned by Union Pacific Railroad ("UPRR"). The site is in a Voluntary Cleanup Program administered by the Texas Commission on Environmental Quality ("TCEQ"), who issued a Hazardous Waste Permit to UPRR. The City of Houston anticipates that it will seek a Contested Case Hearing before the TCEQ regarding the current draft permit in order to effectively protect the health, safety, and environment of Houston residents. The City believes that TCEQ should require UPRR to more fully address the soil and groundwater for the benefit and well-being of Houston residents in the vicinity and for the protection of the City's property and infrastructure, including underground storm sewer pipes. The Texas Department of State Health Services has also identified elevated cancer rates in the vicinity of the UPRR property.

The City is concerned for the health, safety, environmental protection, and well-being of Houston residents and is committed to advancing environmental justice for the community.

The City would benefit from the expertise of lawyers who routinely handle matters before the TCEQ and have experience in federal environmental laws, including the Resource Conservation and Recovery Act ("RCRA") and the Comprehensive Environmental Response Compensation, and Liability Act ("CERCLA").

The Firm's attorneys include environmental law and litigation specialists who provide comprehensive environmental regulatory and litigation support. The lead attorneys bring their combined experience representing municipal government entities and private corporations in environmental enforcement and litigation, including RCRA and CERCLA actions.

The City Attorney recommends engaging the Firm to represent the City because the Firm and its attorneys are pre-eminent in their representation of governmental and corporate entities in environmental law and litigation matters.

<u>Hire Houston First</u>: This procurement is exempt from the City's Hire Houston First Ordinance based on the department's determination that compliance with the ordinance would unduly interfere with contract needs.

<u>Pay or Play</u>: The Agreement requires compliance with the City's Pay or Play ordinance regarding health benefits for employees of City contractors. The Firm provides health benefits to eligible employees in compliance with City policy.

MWBE Information: This professional services contract is being issued with a 24% MWBE goal. The Firm has designated the law firm of Rodney & Etter, LLC, as its certified MWBE subcontractor.

This request relates to the contamination of property and groundwater in the vicinity of Kashmere Gardens, the Fifth Ward, Denver Harbor and Trinity Gardens, arising from a former creosote operation located on property owned by Union Pacific Railroad ("UPRR"). The site is in a Voluntary Cleanup Program administered by the Texas Commission on Environmental Quality ("TCEQ"), who issued a Hazardous Waste Permit to UPRR. The City of Houston anticipates that it will seek a Contested Case Hearing before the TCEQ regarding the current draft permit in order to effectively protect the health, safety, and environment of Houston residents. The City believes that TCEQ should require UPRR to more fully address the soil and groundwater for the benefit and well-being of Houston residents in the vicinity and for the protection of the City's property and infrastructure, including underground storm sewer pipes. The Texas Department of State Health Services has also identified elevated cancer rates in the vicinity of the UPRR property.

The City is concerned for the health, safety, environmental protection, and well-being of Houston residents and is committed to advancing environmental justice for the community.

The City would benefit from the expertise of lawyers who routinely handle matters before the TCEQ and have experience in federal environmental laws, including the Resource Conservation and Recovery Act ("RCRA") and the Comprehensive Environmental Response Compensation, and Liability Act ("CERCLA").

The Firm's attorneys include environmental law and litigation specialists who provide comprehensive environmental regulatory and litigation support. The lead attorneys bring their combined experience representing municipal government entities and private corporations in environmental enforcement and litigation, including RCRA and CERCLA actions.

The City Attorney recommends engaging the Firm to represent the City because the Firm and its attorneys are pre-eminent in their representation of governmental and corporate entities in environmental law and litigation matters.

Hire Houston First: This procurement is exempt from the City's Hire Houston First Ordinance based on the department's determination that compliance with the ordinance would unduly interfere with contract needs.

<u>Pay or Play</u>: The Agreement requires compliance with the City's Pay or Play ordinance regarding health benefits for employees of City contractors. The Firm provides health benefits to eligible employees in compliance with City policy.

MWBE Information: This professional services contract is being issued with a 24% MWBE goal. The Firm has designated the law firm of Rodney & Etter, LLC, as its certified MWBE subcontractor.






Aerial Location Map



Specific Explanation:

The Director of the Houston Health Department (HHD) and the Chief Procurement Officer recommend that City Council approve an amending ordinance to increase the maximum contract amount of a contract for financial management of employees for the Veteran Directed Home and Community Services (VD-HCBS) program from \$3,060,000.00 to \$8,378,279.00 between the City of Houston and Premier Financial Management Services for HHD.

This contract was awarded on May 16, 2018, by Ordinance No. 2018-0410 for the maximum contract original amount of \$660,000.00 for a twelve-month term with four (4) one-year options. On December 11, 2019 Ordinance No. 2019-0999 was approved to amend Ordinance No. 2018-0410 and increase the maximum contract amount from \$660,000.00 to \$3,060,000.00. The program started off with an average monthly client load of 10 veterans and has now exceeded an average of 35 veterans. Due to the additional monthly client load the increase is requested for the continuity of services.

Premier Financial Management Services is responsible for the financial management of

employees for the VD-HCBS program. Premier's financial management services includes payroll withholdings, employer contributions, depositing those funds with the appropriate agencies, complying with the applicable government regulations, preparing, and filing required tax forms and reports. The program was created and funded by the Administration and Aging (AoA) and the Department of Veterans Affairs (VA), that allows veterans to become more involved in their own care and remain in their homes while receiving services. The VA identifies veterans and their families who are eligible to enroll and receive program services. Many veterans need assistance to continue to live in their homes and communities. The assistance the program provides includes services such as cooking, cleaning, bathing, and lawn care. The VA considers the people providing the services employees of the veterans. This program is supervised within HHD by Harris County Area Agency on Aging and the Aging and Disability Resource Center.

This recommendation is made pursuant to subsection 252.022(a)(4) of the Texas Local Government Code, which provides that "a procurement for personal, professional, or planning services" is exempt from the competitive requirements for purchases.

The program started off with an average monthly client load of 10 veterans and has now exceeded an average of 35 veterans. Due to the additional monthly client load the increase is requested for the continuity of services.

Premier Financial Management Services is responsible for the financial management of employees for the VD-HCBS program. Premier's financial management services includes payroll withholdings, employer contributions, depositing those funds with the appropriate agencies, complying with the applicable government regulations, preparing, and filing required tax forms and reports. The program was created and funded by the Administration and Aging (AoA) and the Department of Veterans Affairs (VA), that allows veterans to become more involved in their own care and remain in their homes while receiving services. The VA identifies veterans and their families who are eligible to enroll and receive program services. Many veterans need assistance to continue to live in their homes and communities. The assistance the program provides includes services such as cooking, cleaning, bathing, and lawn care. The VA considers the people providing the services employees of the veterans. This program is supervised within HHD by Harris County Area Agency on Aging and the Aging and Disability Resource Center.

This recommendation is made pursuant to subsection 252.022(a)(4) of the Texas Local Government Code, which provides that "a procurement for personal, professional, or planning services" is exempt from the competitive requirements for purchases.
