The FY2023-2027 Capital Improvement Plan (CIP) supports improved delivery of services and an improved quality of living for Houstonians, with an emphasis on drainage, transportation infrastructure, mobility, quality of life, affordable housing and public safety. The plan emphasizes the replacement and rehabilitation of existing facilities and the selective addition and expansion of facilities.

The FY2023-2027 CIP book contains vertical construction projects supported by the General Services Department for its clients (Fire, Health, Library, Parks, Police and Solid Waste), projects supported by Houston Public Works (Street & Traffic, Storm Drainage, Water and Wastewater) and the Houston Airport System. In addition, Information Technology, Fleet, and Component Units citywide capital programs are included. This year's CIP puts an emphasis on Harvey recovery projects.

The FY2023-2027 CIP calls for appropriations of approximately \$10.3 billion during the five-year period. Planned appropriations for the Public Improvement & Citywide Capital Programs total approximately \$799 million, Component Unit Programs \$958 million and \$8.6 billion for the Enterprise Programs.

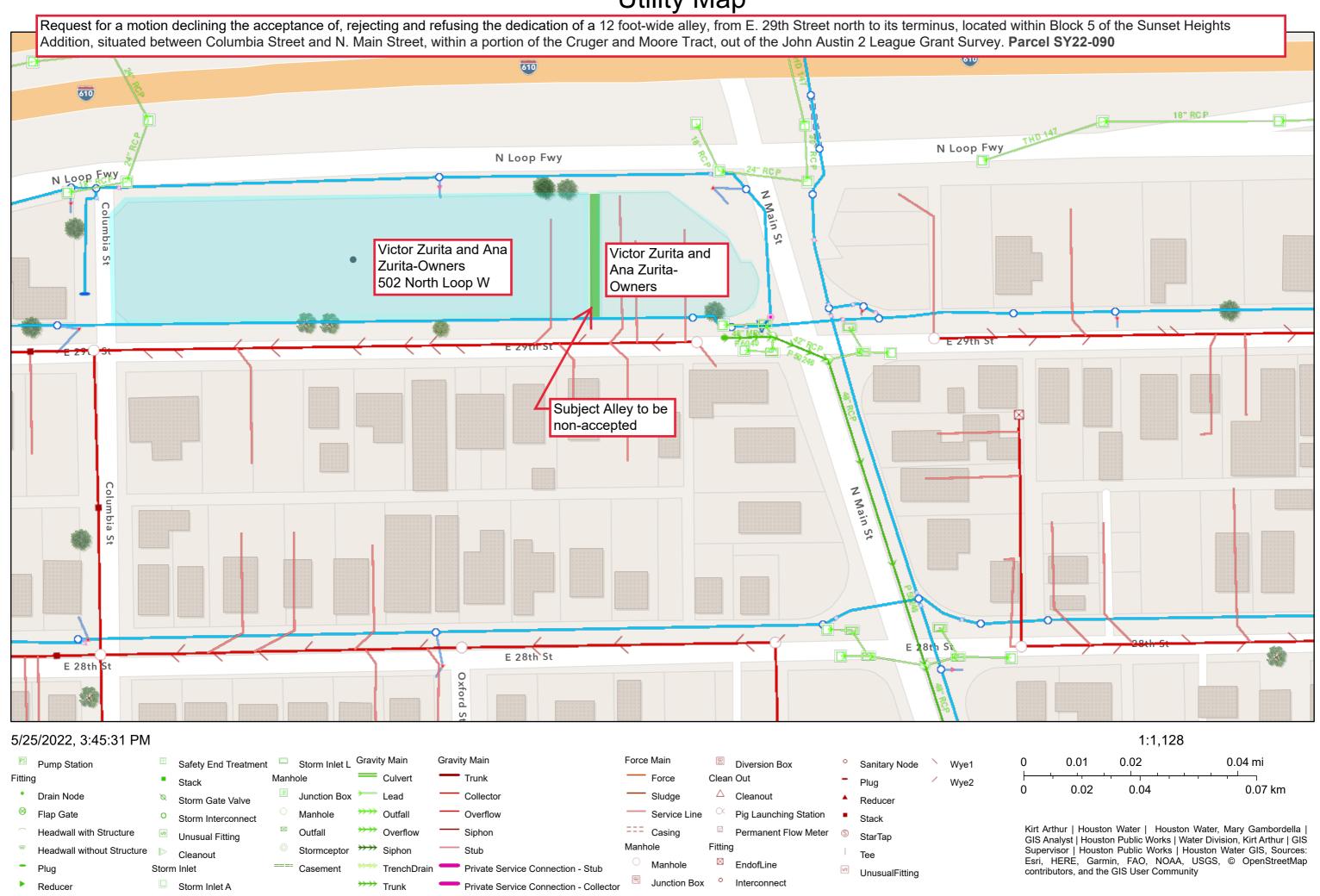

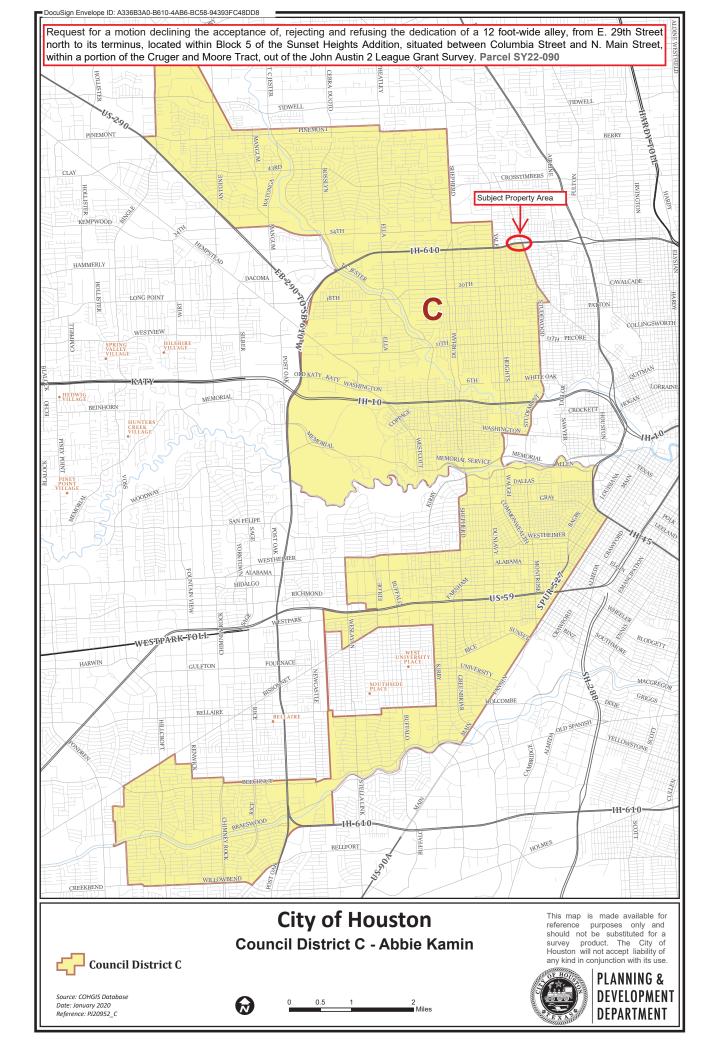

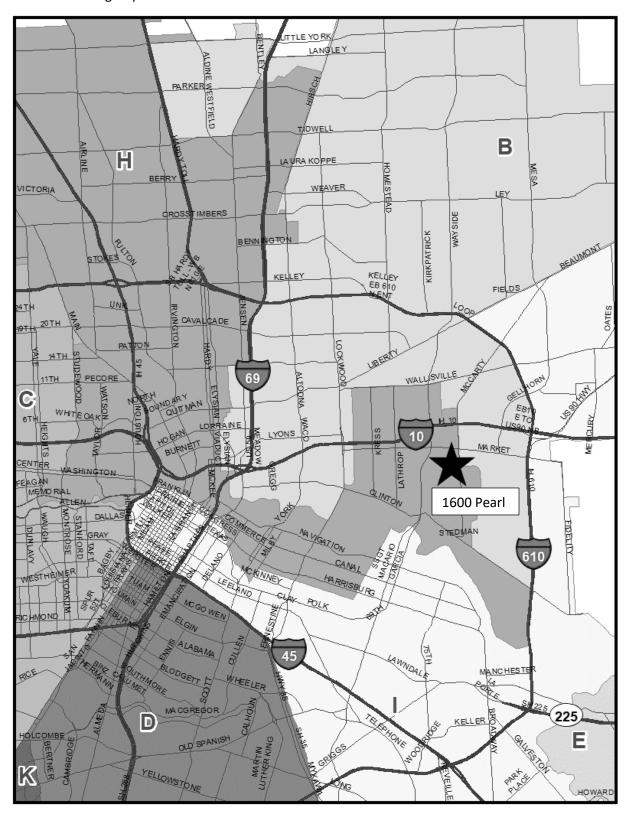

- Information allowing HHD to verify eligibility of requests and consumer identity.
- Email, text, and voicemail updates to consumers on the status of each online request
- Consumer support as needed by maintaining a public phone number and/or electronic address
- Support permitting HHD staff to assist the public at no charge with issues related to the software application.

Permitium will give ongoing support, and offer technical assistance as needed to make sure consumers are satisfied. On average HHD issues approximately 100,000 certificates annually, This online platform will allow ease of access for consumers that are outside of the Houston area.

Projected revenue is \$800,000.00 annually.

#### **Background:**

SUBJECT: Contract Award for Facilities Consolidation - Chelford City Diversion Package 3.

**RECOMMENDATION:** Award a Construction Contract to BRH-Garver Construction, LLC for Facilities Consolidation - Chelford City Diversion Package 3 and appropriate funds.

**PROJECT NOTICE/JUSTIFICATION:** This project is part of the Wastewater Treatment Facilities Capital Improvement Plan and is required to control operation costs, maintenance costs, and regulatory compliance.

The work to be performed under this contract award is necessary to maintain compliance with Houston's wastewater consent decree with EPA and TCEQ.

**DESCRIPTION/SCOPE:** This project consists of the abandonment of Green Crest Lift Stations, the diversion of the wastewater flow to the Upper Braes Wastewater Treatment Plant and the implementation of a plan for phased consolidation of facilities. The Contract duration for this project is 570 calendar days. This project was designed by Parsons Water & Infrastructure, Inc.

**LOCATION:** The project area is generally bound by Richmond Avenue on the north, Westpark Drive on the south, Westhollow Drive on the east and Green Crest Drive on the west.

BIDS: This project was advertised for bidding on February 18, 2022. Bids were received on March 17, 2022. The four (4) bids are as follows:

**AWARD:** It is recommended that this construction contract be awarded to BRH-Garver Construction, LLC with a low bid of \$15,464,235.00 and Addenda Numbers 1 and 2 be made a part of this Contract.

PROJECT COST: The total cost of this project is \$17,310,659.00 to be appropriated as follows:

Testing Services will be provided by Tolunay-Wong Engineers, Inc. under a previously approved contract.
