Background:

SUBJECT: Accept Work for Waterline Wrap Repairs.

RECOMMENDATION: (SUMMARY) Pass a motion to approve the final contract amount of \$1,978,203.59 or 4.81% over the original contract amount, accept the work, and authorize final payment.

PROJECT NOTICE/JUSTIFICATION: This project provided a work order based contract to repair water lines up to 16-inches in diameter in the distribution system on an emergency basis throughout the City.

DESCRIPTION/SCOPE: This project included the improvement and/or new installation of water main lines and service lines. The main lines ranged in diameter up to 16 inches and the service lines ranged in size from ³/₄ inch to 2-inches in diameter. The project was awarded to D.L. Elliott Enterprises, Inc. with an original contract amount of \$1,887,479.62. The contract duration for this project was 365 calendar days.

LOCATION: The projects are located throughout the City of Houston.

CONTRACT COMPLETION AND COST: The contractor, D.L. Elliott Enterprises, Inc., has completed the work under the subject contract. The project was completed within the original contract time. The final cost of the project, including overrun and underrun of estimated unit price quantities is \$1,978,203.59, an increase of \$90,723.97 or 4.81% over the original contract amount and under the 5% contingency amount. The increased cost is the result of the difference between planned and unplanned emergency work.

M/WSBE PARTICIPATION: The advertised MWBE contract goals for this project were 12.00% MBE and 8.00% WBE (20.00% total). The MWSBE goals approved for this project were 12.00%


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

ORDINANCE AMENDING ARTICLE V OF CHAPTER 32 OF THE CODE OF ORDINANCES, HOUSTON, TEXAS, relating to the creation of 26 Natural Preservations within City of Houston's Parks; containing findings and other provisions relating to the foregoing subject; providing for severability

Background:

The Houston Parks and Recreation Department (HPARD) requests Council approval of an amendment to City of Houston, Code of Ordinances, Chapter 32, add Article V., Nature Preserves.

The Nature Preserve Ordinance would preserve Houston's most significant natural habitats in 26 parks throughout the city for the protection of ecological communities and native wildlife, as well as the ecosystem services they provide to the City of Houston. The proposed ordinance was presented to City Council Quality of Life Committee on July 27, 2022. The last update to Chapter 32 was in 2015.

The purpose of this amendment is to preserve and protect in perpetuity city-owned natural areas by regulating public uses of these lands. Protection of the land within a preserve system provides a habitat for native wildlife, ecosystem services, and co-benefits in the form of carbon storage, reduced urban heat island effects, improved air quality, improved water quality and quantity, and educational opportunities for the public.

The preserve will not contain traditional or customary facilities or improvements associated with a public park but may contain improvements to support passive recreational activities. Most of the parks have both a nature preserve area and an existing developed area that contains active recreation amenities. Additional proposed amenities include trails, benches, signage, trash cans, and bird-friendly lighting. This amendment applies only to city-owned nature preserves within the Houston Parks and Recreation Department, or city-owned nature preserves managed by Harris County or another metropolitan county.

Nature Preserve designations will be targeted for park land throughout the city to ensure equitable access to the benefits of nature for all Houstonians.

Additional proposed amenities include trails, benches, signage, trash cans, and bird-friendly lighting. This amendment applies only to city-owned nature preserves within the Houston Parks and Recreation Department, or city-owned nature preserves managed by Harris County or another metropolitan county.

Nature Preserve designations will be targeted for park land throughout the city to ensure equitable access to the benefits of nature for all Houstonians.

Background:

The Administration & Regulatory Affairs Department (ARA) recommends that City Council adopt an ordinance denying Entergy Texas, Inc. (Entergy or Company) proposed rate increase and maintaining current rates in effect within Houston. Entergy provides electric service to approximately 486,000 Texas retail customers. According to the utility, Entergy serves approximately 1,800 customers in the Kingwood area — 1,500 residential and 300 commercial customers. The City of Houston exercises original jurisdiction over the rates, operations, and services of Entergy under the provisions of the Texas Utilities Code for customers within Houston city limits. Houston participates in Entergy proceedings, including rate case proceedings, as a member of the Steering Committee of Cities (Coalition), a group of similarly situated cities with Entergy customers within their city limits.

On July 1, 2022, Entergy filed a Statement of Intent and Application for Authority to Change Rates within its service territory, including the City of Houston for Houston customers. Entergy is requesting an annual base rate and rider revenue increase of \$131.4 million, an 11.2% increase over current rates (excluding fuel revenues). If the Company's revenue request is approved, the average residential customer using 1,000 kWh of electricity will experience a \$13.50 increase to the monthly bill. The table below outlines the proposed base rate and rider revenue increase by customer class.

On July 27, 2022, City Council approved ordinance No. 2022-587 suspending for 90 days the proposed

effective date of Entergy's requested rates to November 3, 2022. City Council approved the rate suspension to provide the City, in cooperation with the Coalition, the time necessary to review the request and prepare a final recommendation for consideration by the Mayor and City Council. The Coalition engaged rate consultants to review Entergy's request and provide recommendations regarding the reasonableness of the rate request.

Based on the review, the Coalition experts determined that Entergy's request is substantially overstated, requiring significant reductions, for example to profit levels (-\$37.2 million) and depreciation (-\$43.5 million). Additional adjustments are anticipated as the rate experts continue their review. Therefore, the Coalition experts recommend that Coalition cities deny Energy's proposed rate increase and keep rates at existing levels.

ARA recommends that City Council adopt an ordinance denying Entergy's proposed rate increase and maintaining current rates in effect within Houston. City Council must make a final determination regarding the rate request no later than November 3, 2022. Entergy is expected to appeal the City's decision to the Public Utility Commission (Commission). Once appealed, the City's proceeding will be consolidated into the parallel case at the Commission. The Coalition will continue to review the requested rate increase and to participate in the Commission proceeding.

RECOMMENDATION:

SPECIFIC EXPLANATION:

The Administration has undertaken a comprehensive review of the proposed FY22 TIRZ budgets. The Administration recommends approval of the FY22 Operating Budget for Midtown Redevelopment Authority (the "Authority") and the FY22 – FY26 CIP Budget for Reinvestment Zone Number Two (the "Zone").

- Total Operating Budget for FY22 is \$48,224,643 which includes \$8,164,587 for required fund transfers and \$40,060,056 for Project Costs committed primarily to the development of affordable housing, the reconstruction of Caroline St., Brazos St., Tuam St., and the renovation and maintenance of area parks including Midtown Park, Bagby Park, Elizabeth Baldwin Park, and Glover Park.
- The FY22 FY26 CIP totals \$173,973,730 and includes provisions for the design and construction of streets, sidewalks, and utilities to accommodate growing mobility and infrastructure demands in the Zone. The plan also includes the development of affordable housing and the renovation and maintenance of area parks.
- The FY22 Operating Budget includes \$1,658,150 for administration and overhead and a municipal services cost payment of \$781,263, to pay for the incremental cost of providing

services to the area and \$492,737 for supplemental private security services.

• The Authority must advise the Chief Development Officer of any budget amendments. Adjustments to the budget that exceed \$400,000 require City Council approval.




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VICINITY MAP N.T.S. KEY MAP 365 M,R



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
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VICINITY MAP N.T.S. KEY MAP 365 R




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VICINITY MAP n.t.s. key map 365 p

The scope of services under the original contract consisted of the design and construction of Fondren Road from Hillcroft to FM 2234 (Fondren); South Post Oak from Beltway 8 to FM 2234 (South Post Oak) and Blue Ridge Road from south of Rockergate Drive to FM 2234 (Blue Ridge Road). The first amendment approved by City Council on June 4, 2014, under Ordinance No. 2014-0558 removed Fondren and Blue Ridge Road from the project and added Hillcroft Avenue and Court Road Extension.

SCOPE OF THIS AMENDMENT: Under the Agreement, the County will contribute a maximum of \$5,750.000.00 and the City will contribute \$11,750,000.00 towards the increased total cost of the project of \$17,500,000.00. The City will be managing the Engineering and Construction Contracts along with managing the acquisition of right of way. The City share of project cost will be appropriated as vendor contracts are presented to Council for approval.

Under the Agreement, the City will also be responsible for the maintenance of Hillcroft as follows:

- mowing grass
- street sweeping
- · pavement maintenance
- storm sewer maintenance
- · box culvert maintenance
- · bridge maintenance
- · concrete channel lining maintenance
- · sidewalk maintenance
- · curb drain maintenance

FISCAL NOTE: No significant Fiscal Operating Impact is anticipated as a result of this project.

It is recommended that City Council adopt the dates and times of three public hearings on Proposition "A" through "G" regarding the issuance of public improvement bonds. The hearings are intended to provide information to voters and allow Council to discuss the propositions that will appear on the ballot for the City of Houston bond election to be held on Tuesday, November 8, 2022.

The following are the dates and times to receive public comment on the propositions to be considered by the voters at the special election to be held on Tuesday, November 8, 2022, pursuant to the proposed motion:

Wednesday, October 05, 2022 at 6:00 p.m. Wednesday, October 12, 2022 at 6:00 p.m. Wednesday, October 19, 2022 at 9:00 a.m.

All three hearings will be conducted in the City Council Chambers, City Hall, 901 Bagby, 2nd floor, Houston, Texas.

Additionally, Section 1251.052 of the Government Code (enacted by the Legislature in 2019) requires a political subdivision with at least 250 registered voters to prepare a voter information document for each proposition to be voted on at the election. The statute requires that the voter information documents be posted (1) on election day and during early voting by personal

appearance, in a prominent location at each polling place; (2) not later than the 21st day before the election, in three public places in the boundaries of the political subdivision holding the election; and (3) during the 21 days before the election, on the political subdivision's Internet website, prominently and together with the notice of the election, the contents of the proposition, and any sample ballot prepared for the election.

Section 1251.052 distinctly prescribes the types of information to be contained on the voter information documents.
