### **Background:**

**SUBJECT**: Accept Work for Sanitary Sewer Rehabilitation by Sliplining and Pipe Bursting Methods.

**RECOMMENDATION**: (Summary) Pass a motion to approve the final contract amount of \$4,965,675.47, which is 3.04% over the original contract amount and under the 5% contingency amount, accept the work, and authorize final payment.

**PROJECT NOTICE/JUSTIFICATION**: Under this project, the contractor provided sanitary sewer rehabilitation by sliplining and pipe bursting method to deteriorated sewer collection systems throughout the City.

**DESCRIPTION/SCOPE**: This project consisted of sanitary sewer rehabilitation by sliplining and pipe bursting methods. The project was awarded to Lopez Utilities Contractor, LLC, with an original contract amount of \$4,819,352.31. The Contract duration for this project was 540 calendar days.

**LOCATION**: The projects are located throughout the City of Houston.

<u>CONTRACT COMPLETION AND COST</u>: The contractor, Lopez Utilities Contractor, LLC has completed the work under the contract. The contract was completed within the contract time. The final cost of the project is \$4,965,675.47, an increase of \$146,323.16 or 3.04% over the original contract amount. More static pipe bursting was needed than anticipated.

The final amount of this work order contract was not affected by Change Orders No. 1, No. 2, and No. 3.

**MWDBE PARTICIPATION**: The advertised M/WBE contract goals for this project were 12.94%

MBE and 8.72% WBE (21.66% total). The M/WBE goals approved for this project were 13.02% MBE and 8.90% WBE (21.92% total). According to the Office of Business Opportunity, the actual participation achieved on this project was 9.57% MBE and 2.13% WBE (11.70% total). The standard for meeting MWBE participation goals is the demonstration of Good Faith Efforts. The Contractor's MWBE performance on this project was rated as Satisfactory due to Good Faith Efforts for the following reasons: Due to scope of work changes on the project and the need for specialty work to be performed using the static pipe bursting method, the Prime had to self-perform the majority of the work and was unable to use all goal credit subcontractors for the full contract amounts originally listed. For the reasons listed, the Contractor's performance meets the intent and the spirit of the City of Houston's MWBE Program.

**PROJECT NOTICE/JUSTIFICATION**: Under this project, the contractor provided sanitary sewer rehabilitation by sliplining and pipe bursting method to deteriorated sewer collection systems throughout the City.

**DESCRIPTION/SCOPE**: This project consisted of sanitary sewer rehabilitation by sliplining and pipe bursting methods. The project was awarded to Lopez Utilities Contractor, LLC, with an original contract amount of \$4,819,352.31. The Contract duration for this project was 540 calendar days.

**LOCATION**: The projects are located throughout the City of Houston.

**CONTRACT COMPLETION AND COST**: The contractor, Lopez Utilities Contractor, LLC has completed the work under the contract. The contract was completed within the contract time. The final cost of the project is \$4,965,675.47, an increase of \$146,323.16 or 3.04% over the original contract amount. More static pipe bursting was needed than anticipated.

The final amount of this work order contract was not affected by Change Orders No. 1, No. 2, and No. 3.

Formal Bids Received August 11, 2022, for P12-S31261 - Approve an award to Pethealth Services (USA), Inc. in the amount not to exceed \$315,000.00 for the purchase of pet microchips and supplies for the Administration and Regulatory Affairs Department.

### **Specific Explanation:**

The Director of the Administration and Regulatory Affairs Department and the Chief Procurement Officer recommend that City Council approve an award to **Pethealth Services (USA)**, **Inc**. on its low bid meeting specifications in the amount not to exceed \$315,000.00 for the purchase of pet microchips and supplies for the Administration and Regulatory Affairs Department. It is further requested that authorization be given to make purchases, as needed, for a **36-month period with two one-year options**. This award consists of approximately 4,000 pre-registered microchip supplies to be used for animal tagging and tracking. ### **Background:**

P04-S26108.A1 – Amend Council Motion 2018-0256, passed on May 16, 2018, to increase the spending authority from \$11,750,000.00 to \$16,450,000.00 for liquid polymer floculent chemicals for Houston Public Works.

### **Specific Explanation:**

The Director of Houston Public Works and the Chief Procurement Officer recommend that City Council amend Council Motion No. 2018-0256 to increase the spending authority for the purchase of liquid polymer flocculent chemicals awarded to **Solenis LLC** (formerly BASF Corporation) from \$11,750,000.00 to \$16,450,000.00 for Houston Public Works.

This award began July 1, 2018 for a 60-month term in the amount not to exceed \$11,750,000.00. Expenditures as of December 7, 2022 totaled \$11,697,917.58. Solenis LLC continues to experience hyperinflation regarding raw materials and transportation costs. Therefore, the spending capacity for this award has been rapidly depleted. Houston Public Works is working on a renewal for liquid polymer flocculent.

The City's Wastewater Operations use the liquid polymer flocculent, including antifoaming agents, daily to aid in the dewatering of waste sludge by-products during the wastewater treatment process, as liquid polymer flocculent is imperative to maintain regulatory compliance as promulgated by the Environmental Protection Agency, Texas Commission on Environmental Quality, and protect the health and safety of the citizens of Houston.

### M/WBE Participation:

The project was awarded with an 11% MWBE participation goal. Solenis LLC is currently achieving 17.18%.

### **Specific Explanation:**

The Director of the Houston Airport System and the Chief Procurement Officer recommend that City Council approve an ordinance awarding a ten (10) year revenue contract to LaTrelle's Galley, LP to provide and operate a food and beverage concession at William P. Hobby Airport (HOU) for the Houston Airport System.

The Request for Proposals (RFP) was advertised in accordance with the requirements of the State of Texas bid laws. As a result, proposals were received from seven (7) firms: Air Star-LTS Marquis HOU, LLC, Areas HOU JV, LLC, HMS Host International, Inc., LaTrelle's Galley, LP, OTG Management HTX, LLC, Paradies Lagardere @ HOU 2022 (F&B), LLC, and SSP America. The Evaluation Committee (EC) consisted of City employees from the Administration and Regulatory Affairs and General Services Departments, and the Houston Airport System. The evaluation was based on the following criteria:

- 1. Customer Service/Management and Operations Plan
- 2. Local Participation
- 3. Concept Development and Menu
- 4. Design, Material and Sustainability
- 5. Background and Experience
- 6. Transition Plan
- 7. Compensation to the City

The EC's findings, based on the evaluation of proposals' responses to the Technical Competencies and the Compensation to the City, resulted in the following:

LaTrelle's Galley, LP was deemed the most qualified as it received the highest overall score based on the

evaluation criteria. Therefore, the EC is recommending LaTrelle's Galley, LP for Package Two. The RFP comprised Package One and Package Two. LaTrelle's chose Package Two as its preferred package. Package One was cancelled and is being re-procured.

The Term of the Agreement shall commence on the effective date, and unless sooner terminated in accordance with Article XIV of the agreement, shall expire in ten (10) years.

The Concessionaire will deliver to the City on or before the Effective Date a surety bond in an amount equal to \$3,205,950 conditioned on the faithful performance of all terms, conditions, and covenants of the Agreement

The Evaluation Committee (EC) consisted of City employees from the Administration and Regulatory Affairs and General Services Departments, and the Houston Airport System. The evaluation was based on the following criteria:

- 1. Customer Service/Management and Operations Plan
- 2. Local Participation
- 3. Concept Development and Menu
- 4. Design, Material and Sustainability
- 5. Background and Experience
- 6. Transition Plan
- 7. Compensation to the City

The EC's findings, based on the evaluation of proposals' responses to the Technical Competencies and the Compensation to the City, resulted in the following:

LaTrelle's Galley, LP was deemed the most qualified as it received the highest overall score based on the evaluation criteria. Therefore, the EC is recommending LaTrelle's Galley, LP for Package Two. The RFP comprised Package One and Package Two. LaTrelle's chose Package Two as its preferred package. Package One was cancelled and is being re-procured.

The Term of the Agreement shall commence on the effective date, and unless sooner terminated in accordance with Article XIV of the agreement, shall expire in ten (10) years.

The Concessionaire will deliver to the City on or before the Effective Date a surety bond in an amount equal to \$3,205,950 conditioned on the faithful performance of all terms, conditions, and covenants of the Agreement

## **Background:**

**RECOMMENDATION:** Approve an Ordinance (i) awarding a Design/Build contract to Anslow-Bryant Construction, Ltd., (ii) de-appropriating the sum of \$171,000.00 out of the Task Order and Job Order Contracting Program (TOC/JOC) (previously appropriated by Ordinance No. 2020-781); and (iii) appropriating an equivalent amount plus an additional \$1,533,000.00 for the project.

**SPECIFIC EXPLANATION:** The General Services Department (GSD) recommends that City Council award a Design/Build contract to Anslow-Bryant Construction, Ltd., to provide preconstruction and construction phase services for the Southwest Multi-Service Center Renovation for the Houston Health Department (HHD) and appropriate the sum of \$1,704,000.00 to the contract.

On September 16, 2020, by Ordinance No. 2020-781, City Council appropriated \$1,176,000.00 out of the Public Health Consolidated Construction Fund for the TOC/JOC Contracting Program for FY21, for renovations and improvements for the Houston Health Department. GSD has determined that it is more cost-effective to engage a Design/Build contractor to perform the renovations at the Southwest Multi-Service Center. The requested action will de-appropriate \$171,000.00 out of the TOC/JOC Contracting Program for FY21 and appropriate an equivalent amount to the Design/Build contract with Anslow-Bryant Construction, Ltd. for the project.

On September 24 and October 1, 2021, GSD advertised a Request for Qualifications (RFQ) for Design/Build services for the Southwest Multi-Service Center Renovation. The RFQ contained selection criteria that ranked respondents on experience, personnel expertise, design team

consultants experience, and approach to the project. The Statements of Qualifications were due on October 14, 2021, and four firms responded. GSD formed a selection committee comprised of representatives from GSD and the Houston Health Department to evaluate the respondents. The selection committee short-listed and interviewed all four firms. Anslow-Bryant Construction, Ltd. received the highest points based on the advertised criteria and offers the best value for the City.

PROJECT LOCATION: 6400 High Star Drive, Houston, TX, 77074

PROJECT DESCRIPTION: The existing Southwest Multi-Service Center is a 24,000 sf, onestory building originally constructed in 2006 and has never been renovated. This project will renovate areas of the facility to address deficiencies identified in the Facilities Condition Assessment. The scope includes repair and repaint interior gypsum board; install chair rail, corner guards and wainscot wall protection; refurbish auditorium folding partition; replace VCT flooring with stained and polished concrete and add rubber base; repair millwork cabinets; new countertops; replace restroom mirror; professionally clean interior tile flooring and masonry base; new interior wayfinding and room signs; replace high-bay corridor light fixtures with LED; install paging system; upgrade Main Distribution Frame room including new mini split A/C; provide miscellaneous FF&E including electronic visual display units, pamphlet holders and trash receptacles; power wash building exterior sidewalks and parking areas and restripe all markings; repair and repaint wrought iron fencing; paint exterior ferrous metal surfaces; reseal building perimeter pavement joints; install additional parking area security cameras; add an automatic sliding parking lot entry gate and card reader; refresh landscaping including repair of concrete hardscape elements; replace four air handling units, associated condensers and test & balance; and hire owner approved third party commission agent for HVAC scope.

#### **Background:**

**SPECIFIC EXPLANATION:** The General Services Department (GSD) recommends that City Council award a Design/Build contract to Anslow-Bryant Construction, Ltd., to provide pre-construction and construction phase services for the Southwest Multi-Service Center Renovation for the Houston Health Department (HHD) and appropriate the sum of **\$1,704,000.00** to the contract.

On September 16, 2020, by Ordinance No. 2020-781, City Council appropriated \$1,176,000.00 out of the Public Health Consolidated Construction Fund for the TOC/JOC Contracting Program for FY21, for renovations and improvements for the Houston Health Department. GSD has determined that it is more cost-effective to engage a Design/Build contractor to perform the renovations at the Southwest Multi-Service Center. The requested action will de-appropriate \$171,000.00 out of the TOC/JOC Contracting Program for FY21 and appropriate an equivalent amount to the Design/Build contract with Anslow-Bryant Construction, Ltd. for the project.

On September 24 and October 1, 2021, GSD advertised a Request for Qualifications (RFQ) for Design/Build services for the Southwest Multi-Service Center Renovation. The RFQ contained selection criteria that ranked respondents on experience, personnel expertise, design team consultants experience, and approach to the project. The Statements of Qualifications were due on October 14, 2021, and four firms responded. GSD formed a selection committee comprised of representatives from GSD and the Houston Health Department to evaluate the respondents. The selection committee short-listed and interviewed all four firms. Anslow-Bryant Construction, Ltd. received the highest points based on the advertised criteria and offers the best value for the City.

PROJECT LOCATION: 6400 High Star Drive, Houston, TX, 77074

PROJECT DESCRIPTION: The existing Southwest Multi-Service Center is a 24,000 sf, one-story building originally constructed in 2006 and has never been renovated. This project will renovate areas of the facility to address deficiencies identified in the Facilities Condition Assessment. The scope includes repair and repaint interior gypsum board; install chair rail, corner guards and wainscot wall protection; refurbish auditorium folding partition; replace VCT flooring with stained and polished concrete and add rubber base; repair millwork cabinets; new countertops; replace restroom mirror; professionally clean interior tile flooring and masonry base; new interior wayfinding and room signs; replace high-bay corridor light fixtures with LED; install paging system; upgrade Main Distribution Frame room including new mini split A/C; provide miscellaneous FF&E including electronic visual display units, pamphlet holders and trash receptacles; power wash building exterior sidewalks and parking areas and restripe all markings; repair and repaint wrought iron fencing; paint exterior ferrous metal surfaces; reseal building perimeter pavement joints; install additional parking area security cameras; add an automatic sliding parking lot entry gate and card reader; refresh landscaping including repair of concrete hardscape elements; replace four air handling units, associated condensers and test & balance; and hire owner approved third party commission agent for HVAC scope.

**<u>DESCRIPTION/SCOPE:</u>** The proposed Amendment is for additional panels to be replaced during the original Panel Replacement Project.

## **Summary:**

**SET A PUBLIC HEARING DATE** to update portions of the City's Development Code, Chapter 42, to create more opportunities for walkability, affordability and equity **HEARING DATE - 9:00 A.M. - WEDNESDAY - JANUARY 11, 2023** 

## **Background:**

The Planning and Development Department has been working with the Livable Places Action Committee (LPAC) to update portions of the City's development code, Chapter 42, to create more opportunities for walkability, affordability and equity. Chapter 42 is the ordinance that establishes the general rules and regulations governing plats, subdivisions and development of land within the city and its extraterritorial jurisdiction area to promote the health, safety, and orderly development of the city. As part of this effort, the LPAC recommended revisions to the Residential Buffering Ordinance within Chapter 42.

The ordinance amendments will address the effects of newly constructed, mid-rise and high-rise structures that may arise when they abut single-family and small scale multi-family residential structures. Planning Commission held a public hearing on the proposed amendments on September 29, 2022 and approved the amendments unanimously on December 1, 2022.

The proposed amendments address four main areas:

- Residential buffering standards Proposes a buffer distance between all single-family residential or multi-unit residential properties and high-rise or mid-rise structures. The Action Committee introduced new category of mid-rise structures that must provide a buffer when located along only local streets and abut single-family residential or multi-unit residential properties.
- Garage screening and lighting standards— Proposes measures to prevent headlights
  from cars in parking garages from shining on adjacent residential properties. The amendment
  would also prevent garage ceiling lights from shining into adjacent residential properties or
  streets. The Committee revised the exterior cover standards for parking garages and
  enhanced permitting requirements to prevent light trespass from garage ceiling lights on
  adjacent residential properties or streets.
- Wall or pole mounted light fixtures standards— Proposes measures to prevent pole lights on commercial properties from shining into residential properties or streets. The Committee revised the standards to require that all outdoor fixtures be fully enclosed in the

fixture housing and shielded properly to make sure there is no light trespass.

• **Dumpster screening standards** – Proposes that commercial developments provide screening when they are located adjacent to streets or residential properties and include the dumpster location on site plans.

#### **Summary:**

**SET A PUBLIC HEARING DATE** to update portions of the City's development code, Chapter 42, to create more opportunities for walkability, affordability and equity. Chapter 42 is the ordinance that establishes the general rules and regulations governing plats, subdivisions and development of land within the city and its extraterritorial jurisdiction area to promote the health, safety, and orderly development of the city

#### **Background:**

The Planning and Development Department has been working with the Livable Places Action Committee (LPAC) to update portions of the City's development code, Chapter 42, to create more opportunities for walkability, affordability and equity. Chapter 42 is the ordinance that establishes the general rules and regulations governing plats, subdivisions and development of land within the city and its extraterritorial jurisdiction area to promote the health, safety, and orderly development of the city. As part of this effort, the LPAC recommended revisions to the Residential Buffering Ordinance within Chapter 42.

The ordinance amendments will address the effects of newly constructed, mid-rise and high-rise structures that may arise when they abut single-family and small scale multi-family residential structures. Planning Commission held a public hearing on the proposed amendments on September 29, 2022 and approved the amendments unanimously on December 1, 2022.

The proposed amendments address four main areas:

- Residential buffering standards Proposes a buffer distance between all single-family residential or multi-unit residential properties and high-rise or mid-rise structures. The Action Committee introduced new category of mid-rise structures that must provide a buffer when located along only local streets and abut single-family residential or multi-unit residential properties.
- Garage screening and lighting standards— Proposes measures to prevent headlights from cars in parking garages from shining on adjacent residential properties. The amendment would also prevent garage ceiling lights from shining into adjacent residential properties or streets. The Committee revised the exterior cover standards for parking garages and enhanced permitting requirements to prevent light trespass from garage ceiling lights on adjacent residential properties or streets.
- Wall or pole mounted light fixtures standards— Proposes measures to prevent pole lights on commercial properties from shining into residential properties or streets. The Committee revised the standards to require that all outdoor fixtures be fully enclosed in the fixture housing and shielded properly to make sure there is no light trespass.
- **Dumpster screening standards** Proposes that commercial developments provide screening when they are located adjacent to streets or residential properties and include the dumpster location on site plans.
