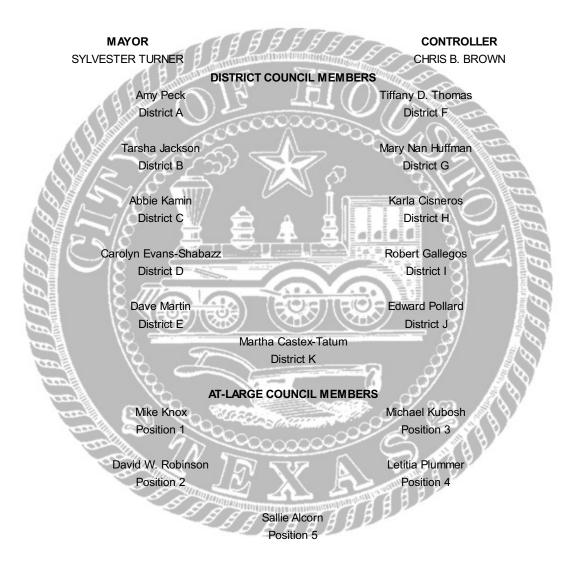

RECOMMENDATION from the Mayor's Office of Government Relations for renewal of membership in the **HOUSTON-GALVESTON AREA COUNCIL** - \$92,183.20 - General Fund

Background:

The Houston-Galveston Area Council (H-GAC) was organized in 1966 by local leaders from Brazoria, Galveston and Harris counties and the cities of Galveston and Houston. H-GAC now covers a 13-county region made up of Austin, Brazoria, Chambers, Colorado, Fort Bend, Galveston, Harris, Liberty, Matagorda, Montgomery, Walker, Waller, and Wharton counties. H-GAC provides opportunities for local elected officials to work together to resolve significant public issues. The City of Houston has numerous appointments held by elected officials and City staff to various committees and the Board of Directors covering issues such as transportation, criminal justice, homeland security, economic development and the environment.

H-GAC is an important funding resource for Houston. As a Council of Government (COG), H-GAC coordinates or administers a variety of important federal and state grants to the City of Houston. Examples from 2021-2022 include \$790,226 for criminal justice/public safety programs and \$124,625 for solid waste programs. H-GAC also facilitated the committee process for \$371,951 in State Homeland Security Grant funds. In addition, the City of Houston benefits from participating in H-GAC's cooperative purchasing program, enjoying significant savings for the purchase of vehicles, fire trucks, ambulances, radios and construction equipment.

H-GAC is the regional Workforce System helping individuals through 28 career offices to provide training, apprenticeships, employment resources, resume assistance, and adult literacy programs with over \$215,016,757 in services provided.

Local government dues, state appropriations, and state and federal grants and contracts finance H-GAC activities to fulfill its mission to serve as the instrument of local government cooperation, promoting the region's orderly development and the safety and welfare of its citizens.

Annual renewal for H-GAC membership in the amount of \$92,183.20 is calculated using the City of Houston's population from the 2020 Census. The dues amount is the same as 2022. Dues are calculated at \$0.04 per capita.

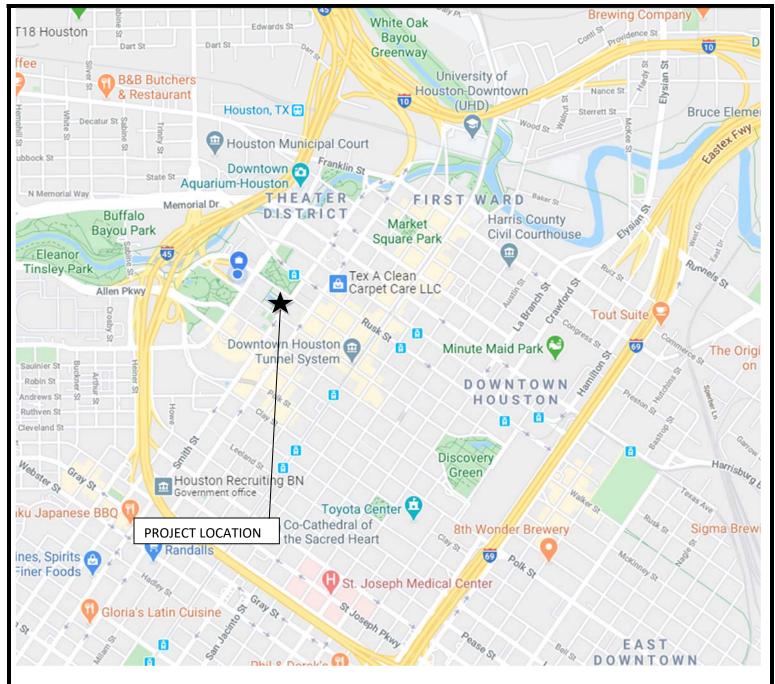

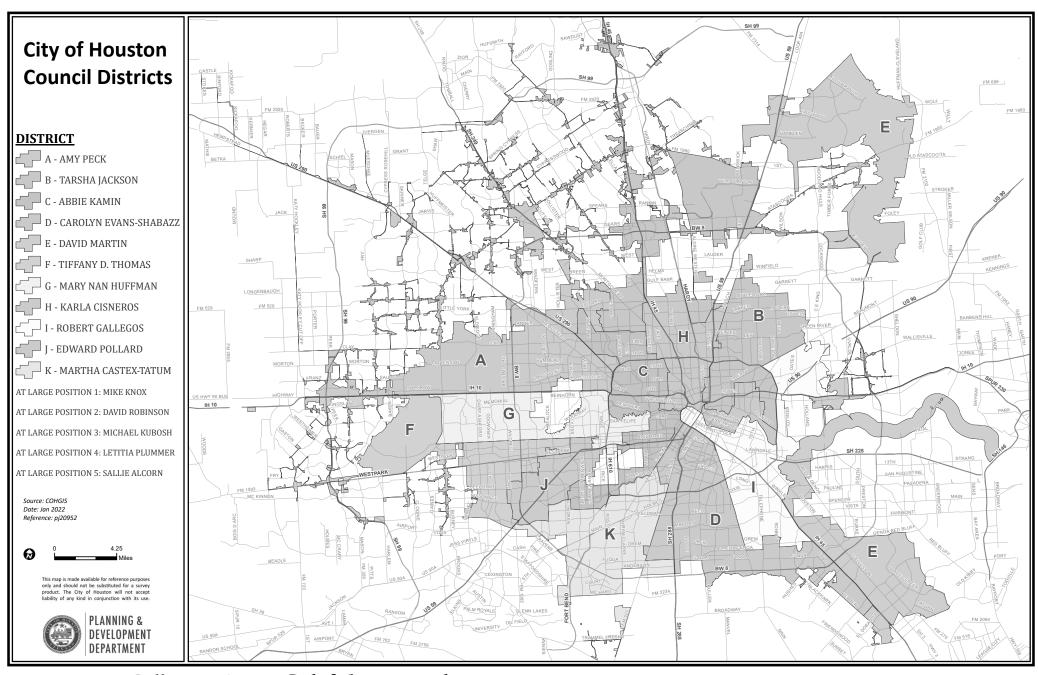

SUBJECT: Accept Work for FY2022 Local Drainage Program (LDP) Contract #2.

RECOMMENDATION: (SUMMARY) Pass a motion to approve the final Contract Amount of \$3,114,589.17 or 3.82% over the original Contract Amount, accept the Work and authorize final payment.

PROJECT NOTICE/JUSTIFICATION: This project was part of the Transportation & Drainage Operations Program and provided work authorizations on a location by location as needed, to preserve, repair, rehabilitate or reconstruct the stormwater drainage asset to such a condition that it may be effectively used for its designated functional purpose.

<u>DESCRIPTION/SCOPE:</u> This project consisted of construction services to resolve localized stormwater drainage problems. The scope was established by each work authorization. CONTRACT COMPLETION AND COST: The Contractor, J. Rivas Construction, LLC., has completed

the work under the subject Contract. The project was completed within the original Contract time. The final cost of the project, including overrun and underrun of estimated unit price quantities is \$3,114,589.17, an increase of \$114,589.17 or 3.82% over the original Contract Amount and under the 5% contingency amount. The increased cost is a result of the difference between planned and measured quantities.

M/WSBE PARTICIPATION: This project's advertised M/WBE contract goals were 7.00% MBE and 2.00% WBE (9.00% total). The approved M/W/SBE goals for this project were 5.00% MBE, 2.00% WBE, and 2.00% SBE (a total of 9.00%). The Houston Health Department (HHD) requests City Council approval of an ordinance authorizing and approving a Full and Final Settlement, Confidentiality Agreement and Release (Compromise and Settlement Agreement) between the Houston Health Department (HHD) and the Texas Department of State Health Services (DSHS) to settle all claims associated with DSHS Contract No. HHSREV100002417 for reimbursement of goods and services in relation to the ELC Reopening Schools project.

Specific Explanation:

The Director of the Houston Health Department (HHD) recommends that City Council enact an ordinance approving and authorizing a Compromise and Settlement Agreement between the City of Houston and the Texas Department of State Health Services (DSHS).

On February 16, 2022, City Council approved an Interlocal Cooperation Contract with DSHS (DSHS Contract No. HHSREVE100002417) to support public and private schools within the City of Houston's jurisdiction with rapid antigen test kits as part of the ELC Reopening Schools: Support for Screening, Testing to Reopen, and Keep Schools Operating Safely Grant. Under DSHS Contract No. HHSREVE100002417, participating schools ordered rapid antigen kits directly from DSHS vendors, and said vendors billed DSHS for those kits. The CDC issued a Notice that it was exercising expanded authority to permit the extension of the funds. This expanded authority allows fund to be extended from one budget period to the next. The ELC Reopening Schools fund was extended through July 31, 2023.

With this extension and the need to amend the payment schedule, the parties agreed to amend DSHS Contract No. HHS REV10002417 to change extend the term of the contract and adjust the payment terms. Before the amendment could be finalized, the contract expired on July 31, 2022. Before expiration of the original agreement, DSHS submitted invoices totaling \$704,659.20 for goods and services provided between September 2021 to July 2022; DSHS Contract No. HHS

REV10002417, however, did not contain a mechanism for partial payment, leaving a dispute as to how payment would occur for DSHS's work under the contract.

In order to settle the dispute and pay DSHS for goods and services provided, the Parties agreed to a compromise and settlement to pay the submitted invoices and close out the old contract for the goods and services provided.

Background:

RECOMMENDATION: Appropriate funds for the TOC/JOC Contracting Program.

SPECIFIC EXPLANATION: The General Services Department (GSD) utilizes task order and job order contracts to facilitate minor architectural and engineering design services; mechanical, electrical, and plumbing services (MEP); roof consulting services; construction, repairs, rehabilitations, or alterations of facilities for its client departments. Having these contracts in place allows the City to expedite smaller facility construction projects and can help the City respond quickly to facility needs. Funds are allocated to design task order contracts or construction job order contracts as work orders are issued. Accordingly, GSD recommends that City Council appropriate a sum of \$9,000,000.00 to the TOC/JOC Contracting Program for professional and construction services for various City Departments.

BACKGROUND: The TOC/JOC Program is funded through supplemental allocations from various departmental budgets or appropriations from various bond funds, up to the maximum contract amount, as departments identify projects and specific funding for each project. Fees for each TOC project are negotiated based on the size and complexity of the tasks involved. Work orders for JOC are issued and approved in accordance with pre-described and pre-priced tasks as established by the *R.S. Means Facilities Construction Cost Data* book.

JOC CONTRACTORS: Currently, GSD utilizes five JOC contractors. On September 4, 2019, by Ordinance No. 2019-0677, Council awarded five job order contracts to: (1) Brown & Root Industrial Services, LLC (BRI); (2) E-Contractors USA, LLC (ECON); (3) ERC Environmental & Construction Services, Inc. (ERC); (4) Jamail & Smith Construction, LP (JAM); and (5) Horizon International Group (HOR) for a term of two years with three one-year renewal options. Each contract has a maximum contract amount of \$20,000,000.

M/WBE/SBE PARTICIPATION:

TOC CONTRACTORS: A 5.0% M/WBE goal has been established for the building envelope consulting services task order contracts with BEC, WPM, and WJE. contracts, there is no utilization to report because no projects have commenced.

Removal, and Demolition Services for City facilities and dangerous buildings; providing maximum contract amounts

Background:

Recommendation: Award four task order contracts for Environmental Remediation, Underground Storage Tank Removal and Demolition Services Task Order Contracting Program and appropriate funds for FY 2023.

Specific Explanation: The General Services Department (GSD) recommends that City Council award four, five-year task order contracts to Inland Environments, Ltd., RNDI Companies, Inc., AAR Incorporated, and TRT Abatement, Inc. for the Environmental Remediation, Underground Storage Tank Removal and Demolition Services Task Order Contracting Program for City facilities and dangerous buildings. The Program is funded through supplemental allocations from various departmental budgets and appropriations from various bond funds. Periodically, as departments identify projects and specific funding for each project, Council may be requested to appropriate additional funds for the Program. The funds will be allocated to the contracts as task orders are issued.

PROJECT LOCATIONS: Citywide

SCOPE OF CONTRACT AND FEE: Under the terms of each contract, task orders will be paid on a unit price basis. GSD negotiated the fees for all four contractors. Bids were obtained from the list of pre-qualified asbestos/lead, mold and soil remediation, demolition, and petroleum

storage tank removal contractors to act as the general contractor for the projects. All pre-qualified contractors were notified of the request for bids. 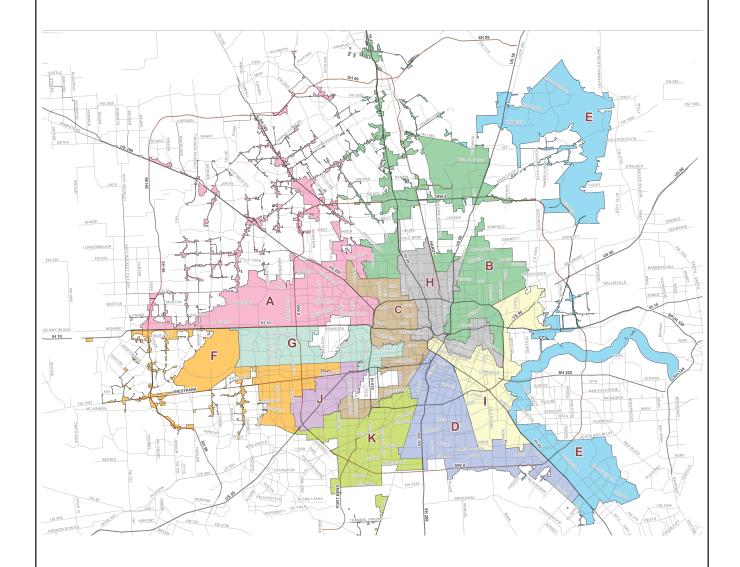

- The FY23 Operating budget also includes \$173,000 for administration and overhead, and a municipal services cost payment in FY23 of \$3,025,573 to pay for the incremental cost of providing services to the area.
- The FY23 FY27 CIP Budget totals \$65,870,505 and includes provisions for the design and construction of roadway improvements, drainage system improvements and park facilities.
- The Authority must advise the Chief Development Officer of any budget amendments. Budget amendments that involve an increase, decrease or adjustment of \$400,000 or more require City Council approval.

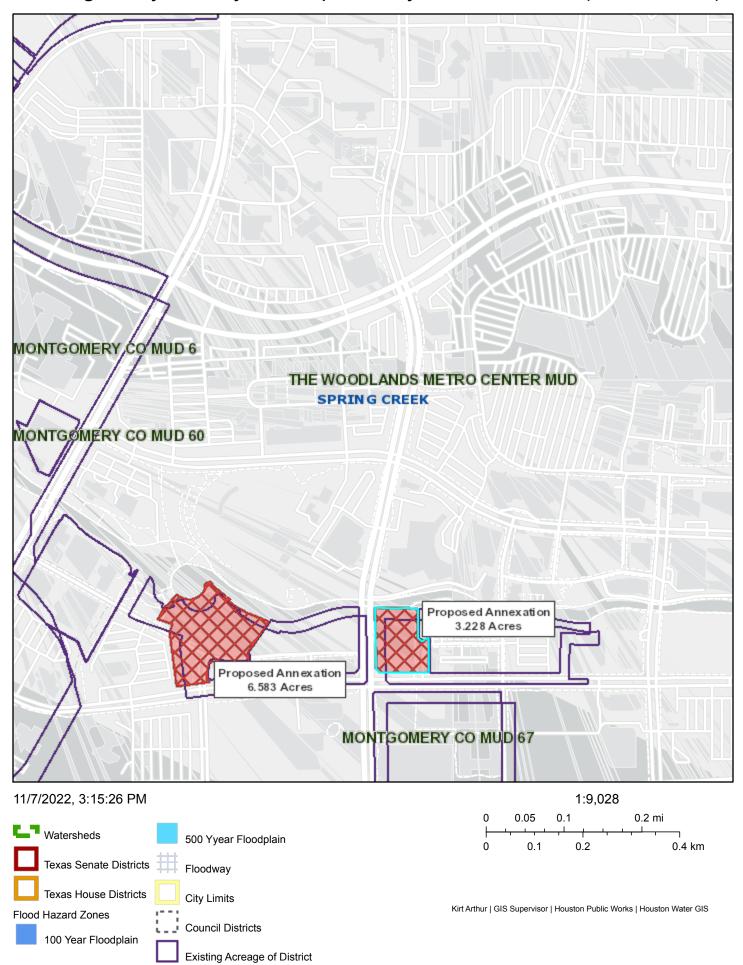

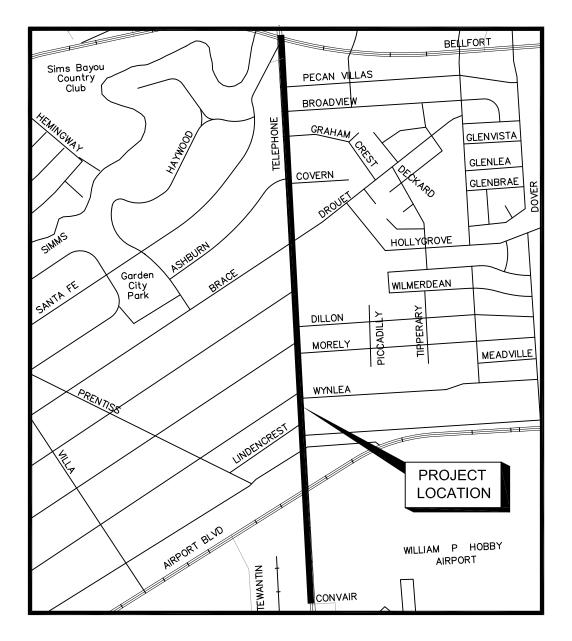

• Total Operating Budget for FY23 is \$28,826,261 which includes \$2,865,633 for required fund transfers and \$25,960,628 for Project Costs primarily allocated to the planning, design and reconstruction of the Club Creek Detention Basin and Park, the design and reconstruction of Corporate Dr. from Beechnut St. to Bellaire Blvd, property acquisition and design of Harwin Dr. from Fondren Rd. to Gessner Rd for total street reconstruction, the reconstruction of Harwin Dr. and South Gessner Rd. intersection, property acquisition, design and reconstruction of a 3.12 mile concrete hike and bike trail that will provide pedestrian and bicycle connections between the Westpark Tollway and the Southwest Freeway, connecting at the Brays Bayou Greenway Trail, and the construction of detention to support the Lee LeClear Tennis Center.

- The FY23 Operating Budget also includes \$174,900 for administration and overhead and a municipal services charge payment in FY23 of \$2,311,587 to pay for the incremental cost of providing services to the area.
- The FY23 FY27 CIP Budget totals \$49,508,000 and includes provisions for street reconstruction, drainage and detention improvements; the redevelopment of Sharpstown Mall.
- The Authority must advise the Chief Development Officer of any budget amendments. Adjustments to the Project Costs in the Operating Budget that exceed \$400,000 require City Council approval.

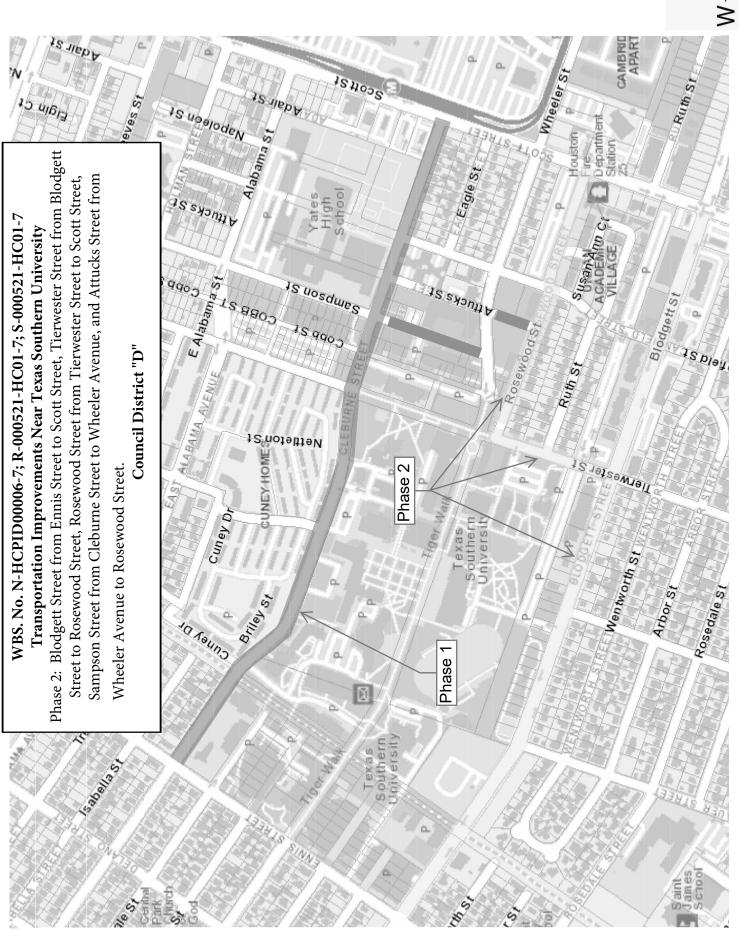
