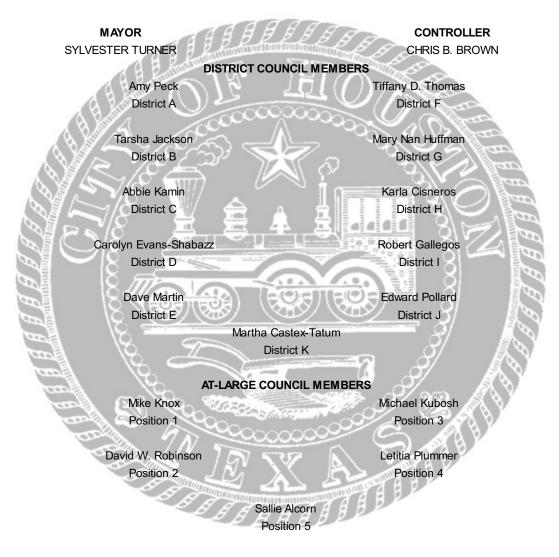

Background:

SUBJECT: Accept Work for Sanitary Sewer Rehabilitation by Sliplining, Pipe Bursting and Cured-In-Place Pipe Methods.

<u>RECOMMENDATION</u>: (Summary) Pass a motion to approve the final contract amount of \$6,601,629.02 or 1.46% under the original contract amount, accept the work and authorize final payment.

PROJECT NOTICE/JUSTIFICATION: This project was part of the Neighborhood Sewer Rehabilitation Program and was required to renew/replace various deteriorated neighborhood collection systems throughout the City. The project involved sanitary sewer rehabilitation by sliplining, pipe bursting and cured-in-place pipe methods. The purpose was to reduce sanitary sewer overflows, which was accomplished by renewal/rehabilitation of deteriorated collection systems.

DESCRIPTION/SCOPE: This project consisted of sanitary sewer rehabilitation by sliplining, pipe bursting and cured-in-place pipe methods. The project was awarded to rePipe Construction, LLC dba IPR South Central, LLC with an original contract amount of \$6,697,996.57 with 730 calendar days allowed for construction.

LOCATION: The projects are located throughout the City of Houston.

CONTRACT COMPLETION AND COST: The contractor, rePipe Construction, LLC dba IPR South Central, LLC, has completed the work under the contract. The contract was completed within the contract time. The final cost of the project, including overrun and underrun of estimated unit price quantities and previously approved Change Orders No. 1, No. 2, No. 3, No. 4, No. 5 and No. 6, is \$6,601,629.02, a decrease of \$96,367.55 or 1.46% under the original contract amount. The decreased cost is a result of the difference between planned and measured quantities.

MWDBE PARTICIPATION: The advertised and awarded M/WBE contract goals for this SRF project were 12.94% MBE and 8.72% WBE (21.66% total). 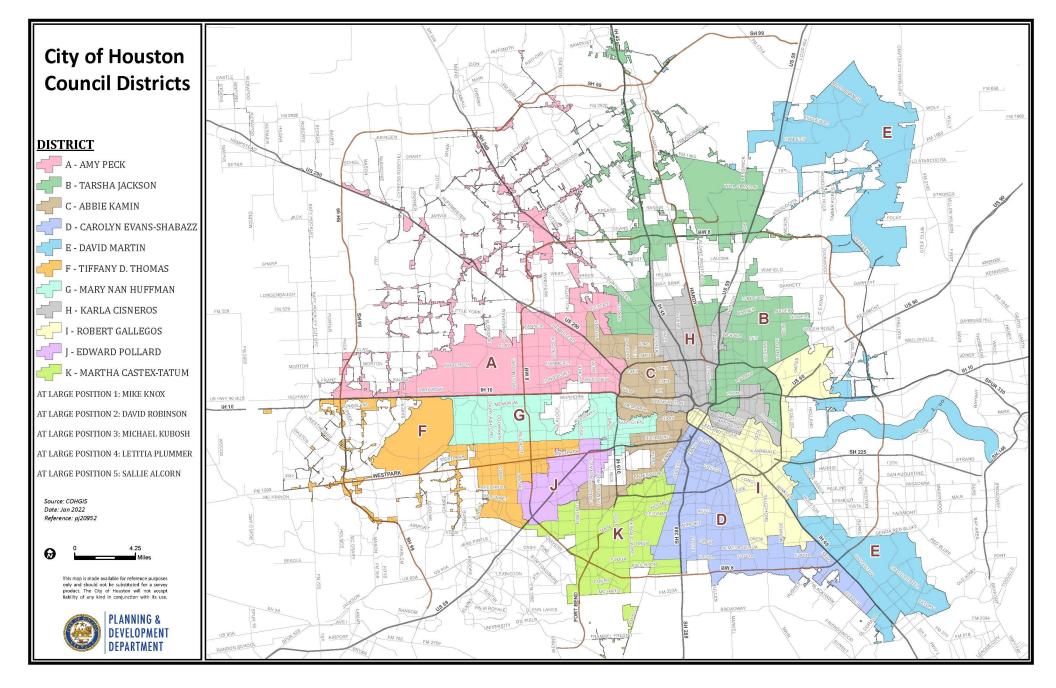

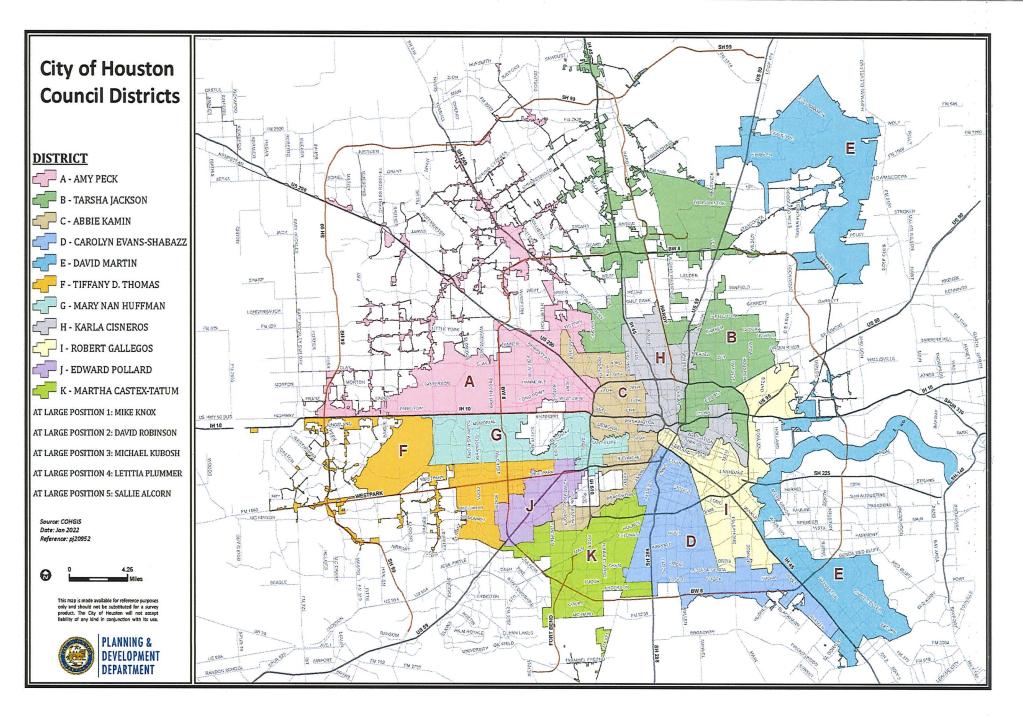

Background:

P04-S26109.A1 – Amend Council Motion 2018-0180, passed on April 4, 2018, to increase the spending authority from \$16,555,065.00 to \$23,177,091.00 for inorganic metal salt coagulant chemicals for Houston Public Works.

Specific Explanation:

The Director of Houston Public Works and the Chief Procurement Officer recommend that City Council amend Council Motion No. 2018-0180 to increase the spending authority for the purchase of inorganic metal salt coagulant chemicals awarded to **G20 Technologies LLC** (formally Geo Specialty Chemical, Inc.) from **\$16,555,065.00** to **\$23,177,091.00** for Houston Public Works.

This award began April 23, 2018, for a 60-month term with, in the amount not to exceed **\$16,555,065.00**. Expenditure as of February 6, 2023 totaled **\$16,488,280.37**.

Inorganic metal salt coagulant chemicals (PAC/ACH) are utilized on a daily and contingency basis by the department's Drinking Water Operations to extract organic compounds, dirt, contaminants, and other particles from raw water influent. Inorganic metal salt coagulant chemicals are imperative to the potable drinking water purification process as promulgated by state and federal regulations to preserve and protect the health and safety of the citizens of Houston.

<u>RECOMMENDATION</u>: Petition for the City's consent to the addition of 178.013 acres to Bauer Landing Water Control and Improvement District be approved.

<u>SPECIFIC EXPLANATION</u>: Bauer Landing Water Control and Improvement District (the "District") was created through the TCEQ in 2014, and currently consists of 454.134 acres within Harris County. The District is within the extraterritorial jurisdiction of the City of Houston (the "City") and has petitioned the City for consent to add 178.013 acres of vacant land, proposed be developed as single family residential and commercial property, to the District. The proposed annexation tract is located in the vicinity of FM 2920, Hunters Creek, Spring Creek, and Bauer Road. The addition of land to the District does not release it from the City's extraterritorial jurisdiction.

The Utility District Review Committee has evaluated the application with respect to wastewater collection and treatment, potable water distribution, storm water conveyance, and other public services.

The District has a wastewater collection system and treatment facility. The annexation tract will be provided with wastewater treatment by the Bauer Road Wastewater Treatment Plant. Potable water is provided by Bauer Landing Water Plant.

The nearest major drainage facility for Bauer Landing Water Control and Improvement District is Little Cypress Creek and Spring Creek, which flows into Cypress Creek, then to Spring Creek, then to the San Jacinto River, and finally into Lake Houston. The proposed annexation tract is within the 100 year floodplain (5.5%) and 500 year floodplain (1.5%).

By executing the Petition for Consent, the District has acknowledged that all plans for the

construction of water conveyance, wastewater collection, and storm water collection systems within the District must be approved by the City prior to their construction.

The Utility District Review Committee recommends that the subject petition be approved.

HCFCD has previously performed a preliminary study and identified the opportunity to construct a regional floodwater detention storage within the land formerly known as Inwood Golf Course (Property) in the White Oak Bayou watershed. Subsequently, the City acquired the Property under Ordinance No. 2011-0173 on March 2, 2011, for storm water and drainage purposes and passive recreation purposes.

The City and HCFCD entered into an Interlocal Agreement under Ordinance No. 2017-0097 on February 15, 2017, to design, construct and maintain the storm water detention facilities for flood reduction and flood mitigation purposes and subsequently amended the Interlocal Agreement under Ordinance No. 2020-0389 on May 6, 2020 to add terms and conditions relating to HMGP grant

participation in design and permitting activities ("Phase I").

Pursuant to completion and the City's approval of the necessary design and permitting activities under the "Phase I" HMGP grant, TDEM has approved and awarded the City additional federal HMGP funds for construction activities ("Phase II").

<u>SCOPE OF THIS AMENDMENT</u>: This second amendment establishes the allocation between the City and HCFCD of construction costs that exceed grant reimbursements and incorporates the terms and conditions relating to HMGP grant participation in construction activities.

The County is scheduled to consider action on this second amendment at their regularly scheduled February 21, 2023 Commissioner's Court meeting.

Background:

The Housing and Community Development (HCD) Department recommends Council approval of a Resolution of Support for competitive 9% Housing Tax Credits (HTCs) allocated by the Texas Department of Housing and Community Affairs (TDHCA), for select applications located within the City of Houston (City). Applications will be submitted to TDHCA from across the state, and the number of available 9% HTCs is limited. It will not be known which, if any, of these projects will receive HTCs until the end of July 2023 when TDHCA announces awards.

Only preliminary information is available regarding the applications, and HCD has not underwritten these projects for financial viability. HCD reviewed the applications to determine whether they meet the community development policy objectives of the City and meet certain minimum standards. Applications were required to meet a minimum of <u>10 points</u> from the criteria outlined below to receive a Resolution of Support.

- Sites located within the boundaries of a Complete Community or TIRZ. Sites located in overlaying areas of a Complete Community or TIRZ will not receive combined points - 2 points
- Proposals to renovate or reconstruct existing rental housing 2 points
- Sites located within an underserved area described as the following:
 - Within a census tract that has no other affordable housing development funded with HTCs **1 point**
 - Within a census tract if the contiguous census tracts do not have any affordable housing developments funded with HTCs that is less than 10-years old (2013 or after) -2 points
- Sites that promote access to mass transportation options described as the following:
 - Sites located within 1/4 mile of any public transportation stop 1 point
