On August 18, 2022, the contractor encountered an unknown 10-inch diameter fiber optic steel casing at approximately Sta. 52+45 which caused tunneling operations to cease. The contractor submitted (RFI) No. 27 requesting guidance.

Construction The Management Team met with CenturyLink who agreed to reroute the fiber optic cables to allow abandonment of the line but not remove the existing casing. 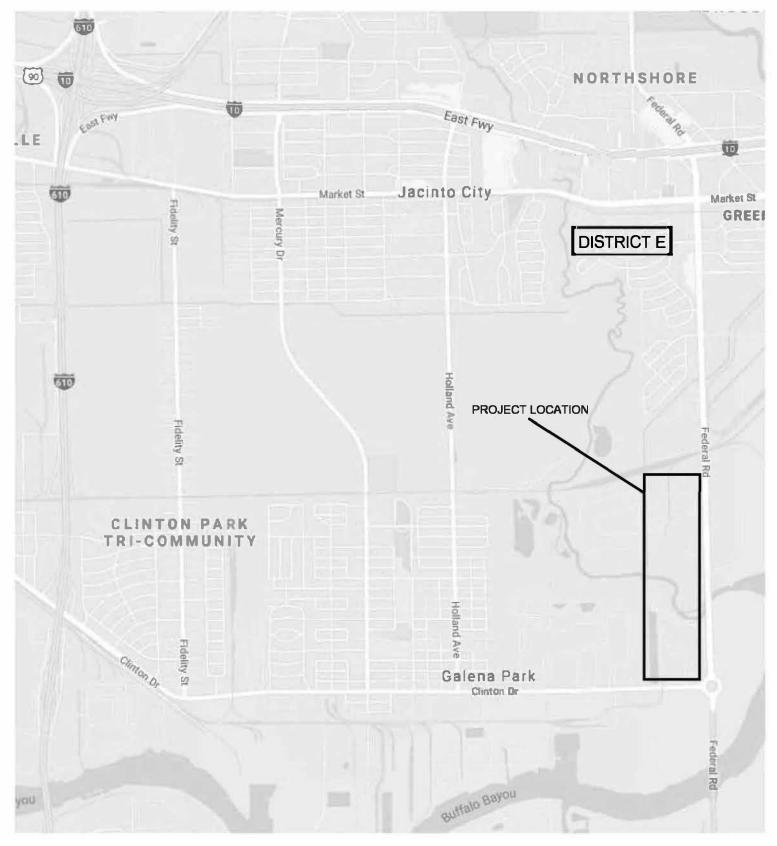

The ordinance authorizes a principal amount not to exceed for the Series 2023 bonds of \$950 million, which would finance the commercial paper refunding, a construction fund for authorized capital projects of the HAS, capitalized interest, debt service reserve funding, and an

allowance for refunding/tender candidates. As a standard course of business, in conjunction with this transaction, the FWG will review possibilities to refinance existing debt if prudent opportunities to achieve present value savings exists. Excluding any refunding/tender components, the approximate size of the bonds would be approximately \$660 million.

Background:

The Administration & Regulatory Affairs Department (ARA) recommends that City Council approve an ordinance amending Chapters 16 and 26 of the City of Houston Code of Ordinances (Code) relating to parking regulations.

Chapter 16 sets forth the authority to administratively adjudicate parking citations in the Municipal Courts. The proposed amendments have been reviewed by the Presiding Judge of the Municipal Courts. ARA recommends the following revisions to Chapter 16, Article IV:

- Amend Section 16-64 to eliminate language requiring a cash bond to secure appearance in person or through legal counsel.
- Amend Section 16-64.1 to allow a parking citation to be contested *online* within 30 days of the issuance of the citation. Currently, citations may be contested within seven (7) days.
- Amend Section 16-66 to eliminate language requiring a cash bond to schedule a hearing. Hearings are held upon request for a hearing but must be within 30 days from the date of the issuance of the citation.
- Amend Section 16-66 to eliminate language requiring the prosecuting attorney to appear on behalf of the City at the hearing.

Chapter 26 pertains to various on-street and off-street parking enforcement and regulations. ARA recommends the following revisions to Chapter 26 impacting on-street parking regulations:

- Amend Section 26-2 to include a payment plan option for booted vehicle owners wishing to clear outstanding citations but who need the flexibility to pay over time.
- Amend Section 26-83 to implement time limits on Veteran's parking privileges at City of Houston parking facilities, specifically including Houston airports and facilities managed by Houston First.
- Amend Sections 26-94, 26-95, and 26-96 relating to large vehicle restrictions, as recommended by HPD.
- Amend Section 26-155 to extend all parking meters to 12 a.m., unless otherwise signed.

Currently, all parking meters in established zones regulate the parking of vehicles between the hours of 7:00 a.m. and 6:00 p.m. on Mondays through Saturdays except legal holidays unless otherwise specified on the meter or applicable signage.

SiEnergy is requesting an approximate \$2.7 million revenue increase in the incorporated areas, a 47.3% increase over current adjusted revenues excluding gas costs. On a system-wide basis, the Company is proposing a \$9.7 million increase in revenues. If the requested adjustment is adopted, the fixed customer charge for all residential customers would increase from \$15.00 to \$25.00 and the usage charge from \$0.2900 per Ccf to \$0.6758 per Ccf.

Pursuant to the Texas Utilities Code, SiEnergy's request will take effect June 9, 2023 — 35 days after filing — unless City Council adopts an ordinance suspending the proposed effective date. If the requested adjustment is adopted, the fixed customer charge for all residential customers would increase from \$15.00 to \$25.00 and the usage charge from \$0.2900 per Ccf to \$0.6758 per Ccf.

Pursuant to the Texas Utilities Code, SiEnergy's request will take effect June 9, 2023 — 35 days after filing — unless City Council adopts an ordinance suspending the proposed effective date. The City, as regulatory authority, is allowed to suspend the proposed effective date for 90 days — to September 7, 2023. A rate expert will be engaged to assist with the review and prepare a final recommendation for consideration by the Mayor and City Council.

ARA recommends that City Council adopt an ordinance suspending for 90 days the effective date of SiEnergy's Statement of Intent to increase gas utility rates for all customers within the Houston and otherwise maintaining current rates in effect.

During the life of the contract, parking revenues are forecasted to be approximately \$1,088,965,798.00. City Council authorized Appropriation #2, in the amount of \$36,824,588.00, on July 13, 2022. The agreement term began July 1, 2021, and the first-year appropriation was \$34,200,000.00. The Director of the Houston Airport System may terminate it at any time upon one hundred eighty (180) days' written notice to the contractor.

The scope of work requires the contractor to provide services as follows:

- Manage nearly 32,000 parking spaces in 8 parking garages and 4 surface lots. The parking operation services provides self-parking, valet parking, employee parking, economy lot parking with 56 shuttle buses, ambassador program that operates 15 courtesy carts in the Terminal C Garages and HOU ecopark to assist customers from vehicles to the terminal, and ground transportation services. The Parking Operator has approximately 515 employees to manage these services.
- Maintaining facilities in an opening day fresh condition through a comprehensive asset management and maintenance program (e.g., painting, janitorial services, parking surface

repairs and facility improvements).

- Maintaining the parking access revenue control systems (PARCS) and network for PCI compliance.
- Provide high quality parking and shuttle bus management and operation services at the Airports that enhance the customer's parking experience by offering a choice of products with quality service levels at a range of cost and convenience.
- Have parking Facilities and shuttle bus services staffed by well-trained, efficient, friendly, and customer-oriented personnel during all hours of the Airports' operation.
- Provide uninterrupted parking and shuttle bus services to the traveling public during all operational hours at the Airports.
- Grow net parking revenues; revenue collections are deposited into the City's bank account.
- Improve operational efficiencies and promote best practices.
- Create flexibility to adopt new products, service, and technologies.
- Managing all Commercial Ground Transportation Curbs for Taxi, TNC, and Shuttle Bus Operations at both airports.

The increase between the Year 2 Appropriation and this Year 3 Appropriation is primarily attributable to increased employee wages in compliance with the Living Wage Executive Order and an increase in staffing to pre-pandemic levels. Additionally, there is a 50% increase in security services based on a recommendation from the Houston Police Department.

- Cashier shortages, including robberies.

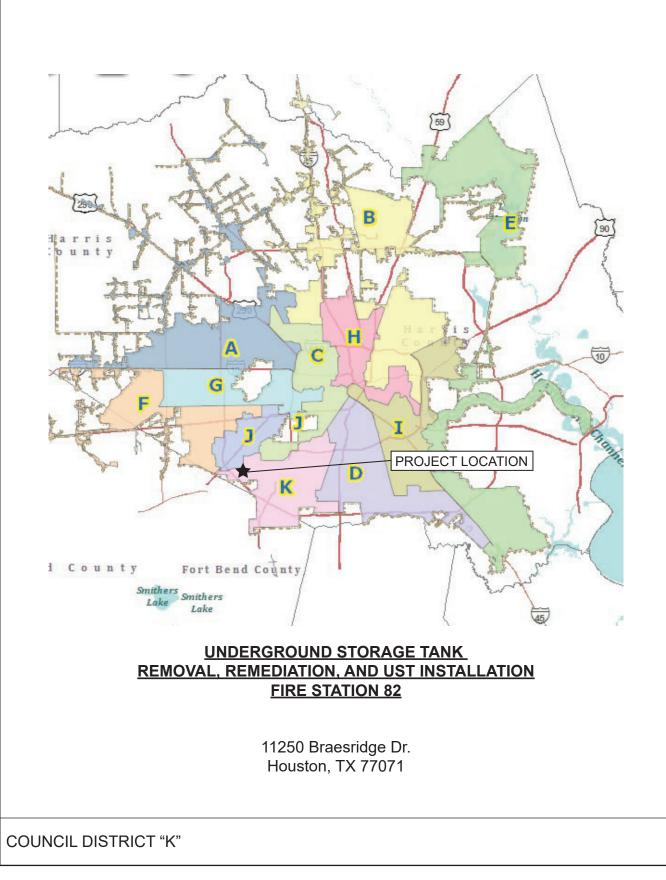
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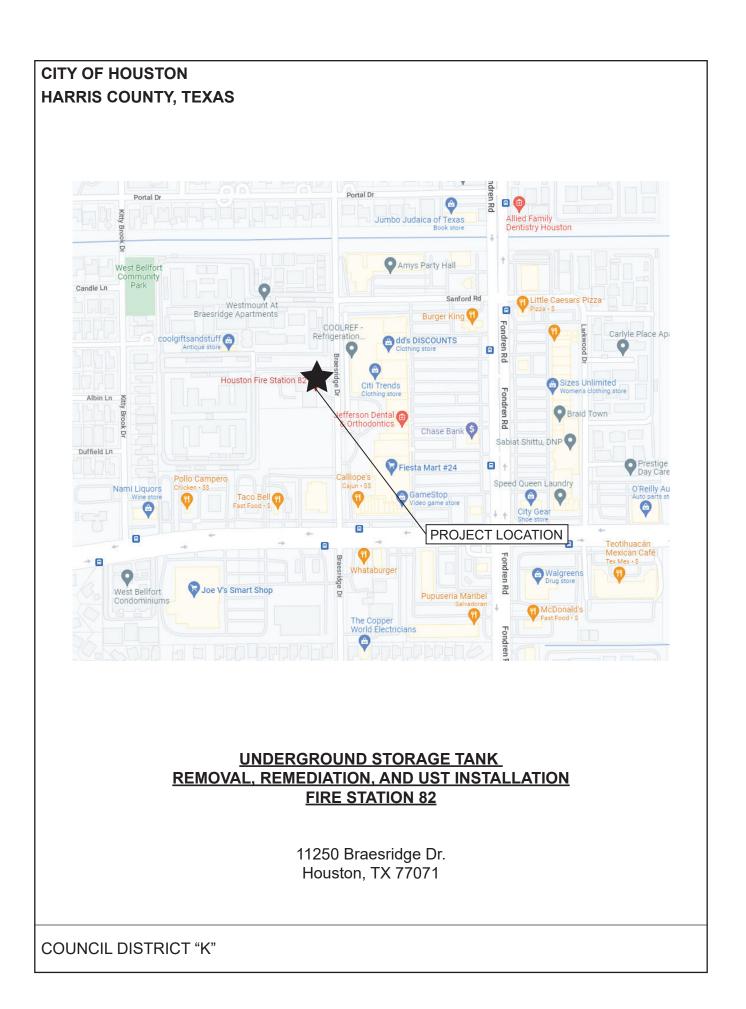

Background:

E32777 – Approve an ordinance awarding a sole source contract to ESi Acquisition, Inc. in the amount not to exceed \$453,163.70 for a service agreement for a crisis information management system for the Mayor's Office of Public Safety and Homeland Security.

Specific Explanation:

The Director of the Mayor's Office of Public Safety and Homeland Security and the Chief Procurement Officer recommend that City Council approve an ordinance awarding a **three-year sole source contract with two, one-year options** for renewal to **ESi Acquisition, Inc.**, in the amount not to exceed **\$453,163.70** for a service agreement for a crisis information management system for the Mayor's Office of Public Safety and Homeland Security. The Chief Procurement Office may terminate this contract at any time upon 30-day written notice to the contractor.

The scope of work requires the contractor to provide all labor, materials, hosting and maintenance for the Enterprise WebEOC system, a standardized regional information management system that provides real-time sharing of critical information during emergency incidents and significant events.

The Enterprise WebEOC system allows secure access to emergency operations centers (EOCs) from remote sites via computer and web-enabled wireless devices. Remote access allows individuals and organizations to participate in the decision-making process and promote the virtual EOC concept regarding information sharing, resource tracking and requests.

The Texas Division of Emergency Management (TDEM) has selected WebEOC as a standard system across the State of Texas. Many jurisdictions throughout the state have also adopted the same application as the standard. Background:

<u>RECOMMENDATION</u>: Approval of an ordinance authorizing the acquisition by the City of Houston of the former Rufus Cage School site from the Houston Independent School District.

SPECIFIC EXPLANATION:

On May 10, 2000, by Ordinance No. 2000-0362, City Council approved an Interlocal Agreement between City of Houston and Houston Independent School District (HISD) to establish a Credit Account for exchanging and conveying properties between each party instead of requiring a cash payment for each transaction.

The historic Rufus Cage School, located at 1417 Telephone Road, Houston, Texas, was permanently closed by Houston Independent Scholl District in 1983 when a new Rufus Cage School campus was built at a different site. The City acquired the old Rufus Cage School site from Houston Independent School District for \$100,000.00 in credit toward future needs for public access from our right-of-way. Houston Independent School District is authorized to transfer historic property to another governmental entity at below market value. In lieu of cash payment, a credit was established for Houston Independent School District in the amount of \$100,000.00 in the credit account already established pursuant to an interlocal agreement between the City and Houston Independent School District (Ordinance No. 97-775). After the acquisition the City designated the property as a protected landmark.

The deed transferring the property to the City had a reverter clause, stating that in the event the property is not used for public purpose, the property will automatically revert to Houston Independent School District.

The City is planning to develop the property in a public/private partnership to benefit the community, including the maintenance and refurbishing the original Cage School and developing the remainder of the property to provide needed services to the community. Since this will be a public/private partnership development, Houston Independent School District has agreed to amend the deed for \$144,750.00 as consideration for the release of the reversionary interest and the removal of property restrictions placed on the former Rufus Cage School ("Property") which was acquired by the City of Houston, Texas ("City") from Houston Independent School District ("HISD") pursuant to Ordinance No. 2011–926.

COUNCIL DISTRICT/KEY MAP

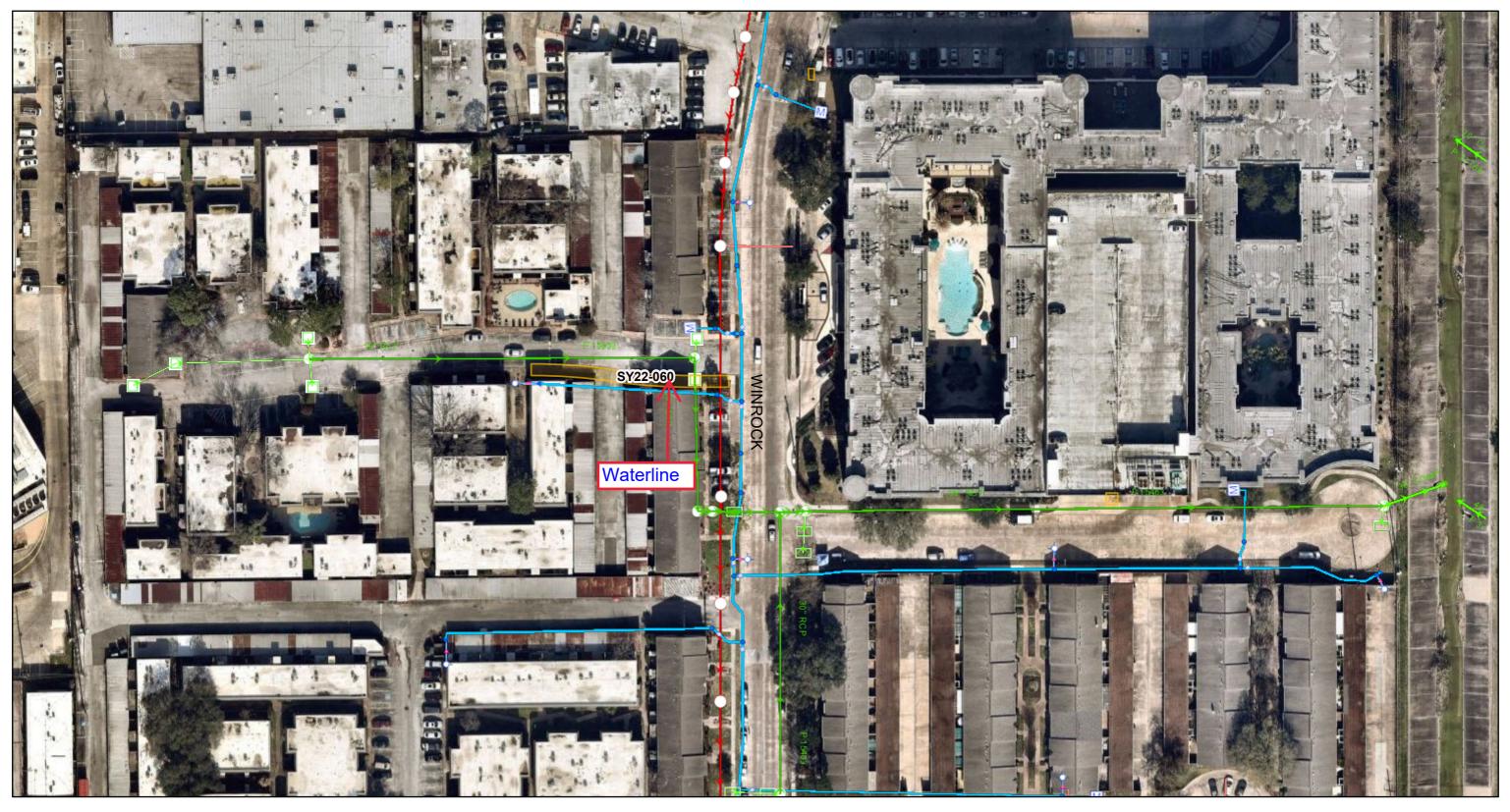

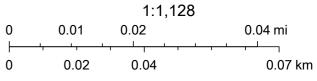

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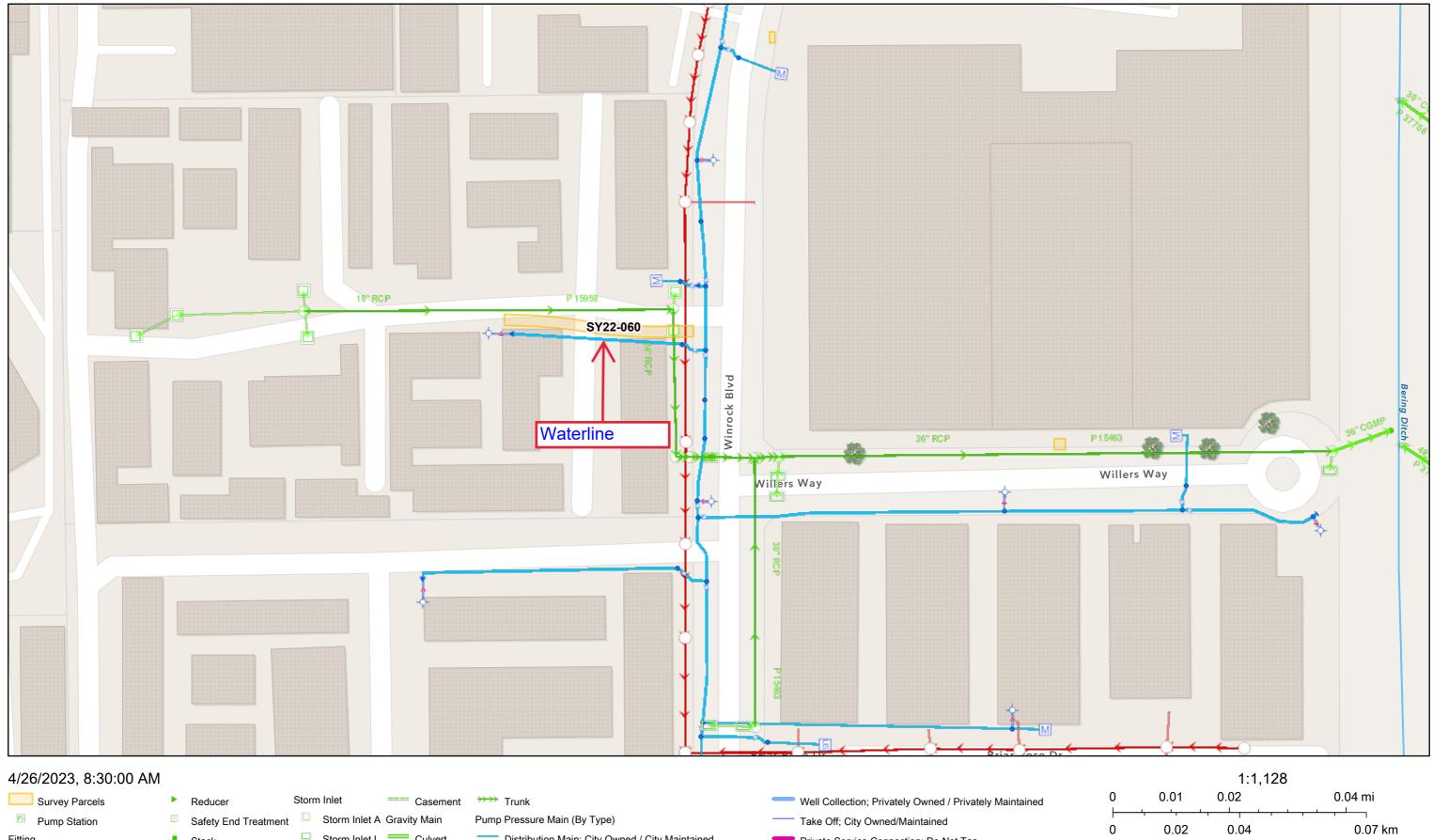
