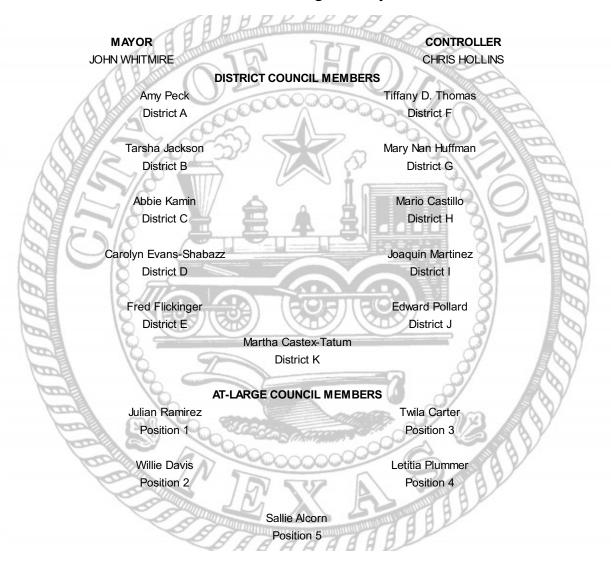

CONTRACT COMPLETION AND COST: The Contractor, Vaca Underground Utilities, Inc., has completed the work under the subject Contract. The project was completed beyond the established completion date with an additional 10 days approved by Change Order Nos 1 and 4. The final cost of the project, including overrun and underrun of estimated unit price quantities and previously approved Change Order Nos 2, 3, and 4 is \$956,486.28, a decrease of \$46,283.22 or 4.62% under the original Contract Amount. The decrease cost is a result of the difference between planned and measured quantities.

M/WSBE PARTICIPATION: The advertised M/WBE contract goals for this project were 13.00% MBE and 7.00% WBE. The goals approved for this project were 13.00% MBE and 7.00% WBE. According to the Office of Business Opportunity, the actual participation achieved on this project was 13.19% MBE, and 5.65% WBE. The standard for meeting MWSBE participation goals is the demonstration of Good Faith Efforts. The Contractor's MBE and WBE performance on this project was rated Satisfactory for the following reasons: Although the Prime experienced a slight WBE shortfall due to no fault of their own, the MBE goal was met, and all goal credit subcontractors were utilized to the fullest extent possible. For the reasons listed, the Contractor's performance meets the intent and spirit of the City of Houston's MWSBE program.

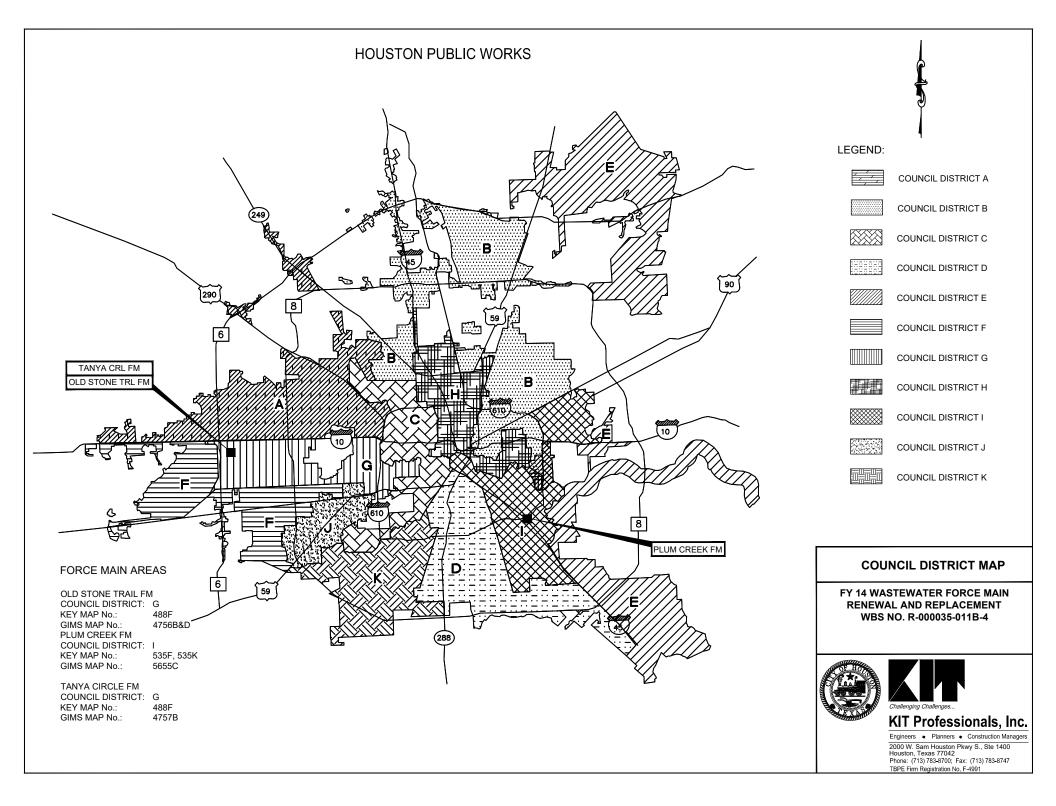

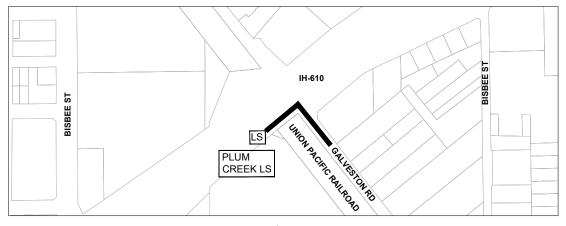

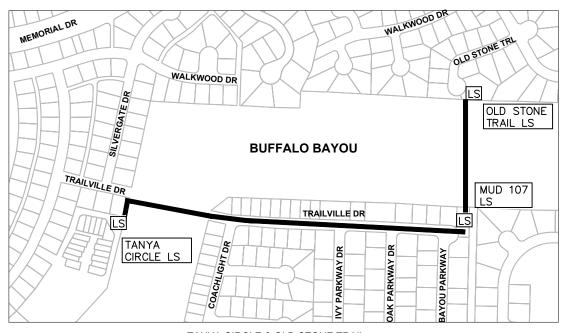

RESOLUTION authorizing the issuance of a Letter of Approval to **EMS PROS, LLC** pursuant to Section 773.0573 of the Texas Health and Safety Code

Background:

RECOMMENDATION:

A resolution authorizing the issuance of a letter of approval to **EMS PROS LLC** pursuant to Section 773.0573 of the Texas Health and Safety Code.

SPECIFIC EXPLANATION:

The Houston Health Department (HHD) requests City Council's approval of a resolution authorizing the issuance of a letter of Approval (LOA) to EMS Pros LLC pursuant to § 773.0573 of the Texas Health and Safety Code.

During the 83rd Legislative Session, the Texas Legislature and the Governor approved Senate Bill 8 which amended § 773.0573 of the Health and Safety Code to require that a new EMS provider seeking a state EMS license must first obtain a letter of approval from the governing body or commissioners court of the jurisdiction in which the applicant is located and intends to provide EMS services.

Section 773.0573 provides that the governing body or commissioners court may issue an LOA if it is determined that:

(1) the addition of another licensed emergency medical services provider will not interfere with or adversely affect the provision of emergency medical services by the licensed emergency medical services providers operating in the municipality or county;

Determination: The addition of these EMS providers will not adversely affect the provision of EMS services because only HFD is authorized to provide emergency medical services in the City; State licensed EMS providers are not authorized to do so except under certain, limited circumstances after providing notice to HFD. They provide private non-emergency transport services. Therefore, a new private provider would not interfere with emergency medical service providers.

(2) The addition of another licensed emergency medical services provider will remedy an existing provider shortage that cannot be resolved through the use of the licensed emergency medical

services providers operating in the municipality or county; and

Determination: Citizens, hospitals, and other entities continue contacting HFD for non-emergency medical transports which takes HFD away from providing emergency transport services. In 2019, HFD provided 5070 non-emergency transports to/from dialysis facilities, doctors' offices, clinics and hospitals. There are 85 EMS providers currently licensed in the city. Additional providers will offer the community more EMS service providers for non-emergency transports which should reduce the number of non-emergency calls received by HFD.

(3) The addition of another licensed emergency medical services provider will not cause an oversupply of licensed emergency medical services providers in the municipality or county.

Determination: There are 85 EMS providers licensed by the City and HHD has not received any complaints or concerns from citizens or the stakeholder community regarding an oversupply of providers. This is a relatively low number given the city's population.

Based on the application submitted by EMS Pros LLC, HHD recommends City council approve the issuance of a letter of approval to EMS Pros LLC.

Background:

RECOMMENDATION: Award Design/Build contract and appropriate funds for the project.

SPECIFIC EXPLANATION: The General Services Department (GSD) recommends that City Council award a Design/Build contract to Times Construction, Inc. to perform design and construction phase services for the West End Health Center Renovation project for the Houston Health Department (HHD)

On December 01, 2023, and December 08, 2023, GSD advertised a Request for Proposals (RFP) for design/build services for the West End Health Center Renovation Project. The RFP contained selection criteria that ranked respondents on experience, personnel expertise, design team consultant's experience, approach to the project and construction phase fee. The Proposals were due on February 22, 2024, and three firms responded. GSD formed a selection committee comprised of representatives from GSD and HHD to evaluate the respondents. The selection committee short-listed and interviewed all firms. Times Construction, Inc. received the highest points based on the advertised criteria and offers the best value for the City.

PROJECT LOCATION: 190 Heights Blvd., Houston, TX 77007

PROJECT DESCRIPTION: This project will include coordinating and phasing of swing space for power washing the façade, refurbishing the roofing components, and water heaters, replacing rooftop HVAC units; upgrading the fire alarm, electrical systems, public restrooms and door hardware. All construction will be compliant with all jurisdictional requirements.

AWARD: It is recommended that City Council award a Design/Build contract to Times Construction, Inc., and appropriate funds for the project.

The following amounts are based on the funds currently identified in the FY24 Capital Improvement Plan (CIP). The final cost of construction will be submitted to the director for approval as part of the Guaranteed Maximum Price (GMP) proposal.

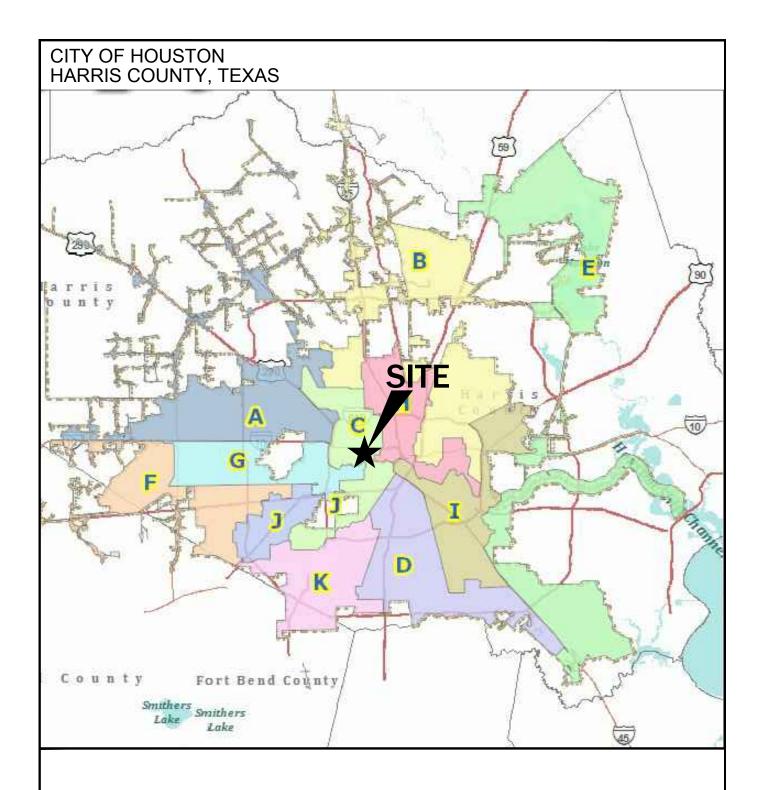

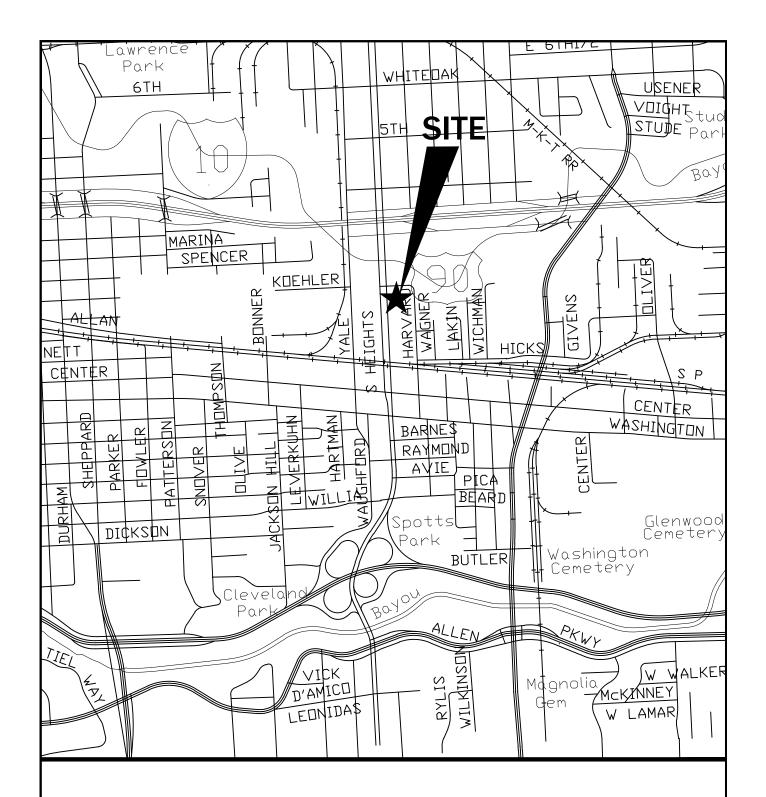
