During excavation of the proposed storm sewer outfall replacement, it became apparent that the internal bridge wingwalls adjacent to the storm outfall has lack of structural support, and there were safety concerns with the condition and structural integrity of wingwall. One of the internal existing wingwall on southeast corner showed evidence of cracking due to previous movement, and there were large voids identified underneath and around the wingwalls. The southeast wingwall continued to shift during the storm sewer excavation and contractor has hold the wingwall with chain support to prevent further movement. Further investigation showed that existing wingwalls were constructed without a structural foundation and were essentially isolated structures floating on the bridge abutment cap and surrounding soil. Based on the condition and structural integrity of the existing wingwalls, it was agreed to replace the two existing wingwalls that posed an immediate safety concern to the travelling public as well as contractor's personnel working in the area.

## **Specific Explanation:**

The Chief Operating Officer of Houston Public Works (HPW) and the Chief Procurement Officer recommend that the City Council amend Council Motion No. 2019-0394 to extend the award from **September 18, 2024, to September 18, 2025,** and increase the spending authority from \$18,322,703.00 to \$25,651,784.20 for the purchase of liquid sodium bisulfite chemical awarded to **Southern Ionics, Inc.,** for Houston Public Works.

This award began September 18, 2019, for a 60-month period, in the amount not to exceed \$13,087,645.00. An amending motion was approved by Council Motion No. 2023-0156 on March 1, 2023 to increase spend authority from \$13,087,645.00 to \$18,322,703.00. Expenditures as of August 28, 2024, totaled \$17,926,057.59.

Liquid sodium bisulfite is used daily in the treatment of wastewater. It is essential in the dechlorination process, which is vital for maintaining the safety and well-being of Houston's residents. After chlorination, it is essential to neutralize the chlorine and chloramines to prevent any harmful impacts on the environment. Liquid sodium bisulfite effectively neutralizes residual chemicals, transforming them into harmless by-products and ensuring the treated wastewater meets stringent safety standards before discharge. Weather conditions and the addition of the Northeast Water Purification Plant – Expansion and the Kingwood area wastewater facilities have had a significant impact on the usage of liquid sodium bisulfite, causing a rapid depletion of this contract budget. HPW requires an extension of time and additional spending authority to continue

providing water and wastewater services while the department works on securing a new contract.

# **Summary:**

ORDINANCE AMENDING ARTICLE XVI, CHAPTER 40, CODE OF ORDINANCES, HOUSTON, TEXAS, by adding an area within and surrounding Museum Park Area between Palm Street and Southwest Freeway (59/69) to the north, South Freeway (288) to the east, Hermann Drive to the south, and Main Street and Fannin Street to the west as a Designated Area covered by such Article - DISTRICT D - EVANS-SHABAZZ

# **Background:**

The Civility Ordinance in Sections 40-352 and 40-353 of the City Code was created to provide law enforcement more authority to help preserve and maintain the openness of sidewalks in designated areas. The proposed ordinance aims to balance the needs of the community with the rights of individuals and considers certain exceptions for medical emergencies, disabilities and other circumstances as specified under the code.

In areas designated by the ordinance, persons are prohibited from sitting or lying down on sidewalks and placing personal items on a sidewalk between the hours of 7:00 a.m. and 11:00 p.m. It is currently applicable to the Central Business District, Midtown, Old Sixth Ward, Avondale, Greater Hyde Park, East Downtown Management District, Historic Near Northside, South Post Oak/West Bellfort, Near Northside II, and Riverside Terrace. The ordinance contains provisions for a citizen petition procedure to extend restrictions to other areas of the city.

The Museum Park Super Neighborhood Council, on behalf of residents and property owners in the Museum Park area, submitted a petition to the City Secretary to extend the Civility Ordinance to their neighborhood. In compliance with the procedures set forth in Section 40-353 of the Code of Ordinances, the Planning and Development Department has certified that the petition meets the required criteria. The proposed boundary is bordered by Palm Street and Southwest Freeway (59/69) to the north, South Freeway (288) to the east, Herman Drive to the south, and Main Street and Fannin Street to the west. The petitioned area abuts the Midtown Area on the north and the Riverside Terrace Area on the southeast.

City Council conducted the required public hearing on Wednesday, August 14, 2024, wherein the Planning and Development Department presented its report on the petition request to extend the provisions of the Civility Ordinance to the Museum Park area. The report prepared by the Houston Police Department as required by the ordinance indicates the existence of incidents of criminal misconduct prohibited under the Civility Ordinance within the petitioned Museum Park area. Based on HPD's report and public testimony at the hearing, this matter is presented to City Council to consider

adopting the proposed ordinance to extend provisions of the Civility Ordinance to Museum Park.

The petitioned area abuts the Midtown Area on the north and the Riverside Terrace Area on the southeast.

City Council conducted the required public hearing on Wednesday, August 14, 2024, wherein the Planning and Development Department presented its report on the petition request to extend the provisions of the Civility Ordinance to the Museum Park area. 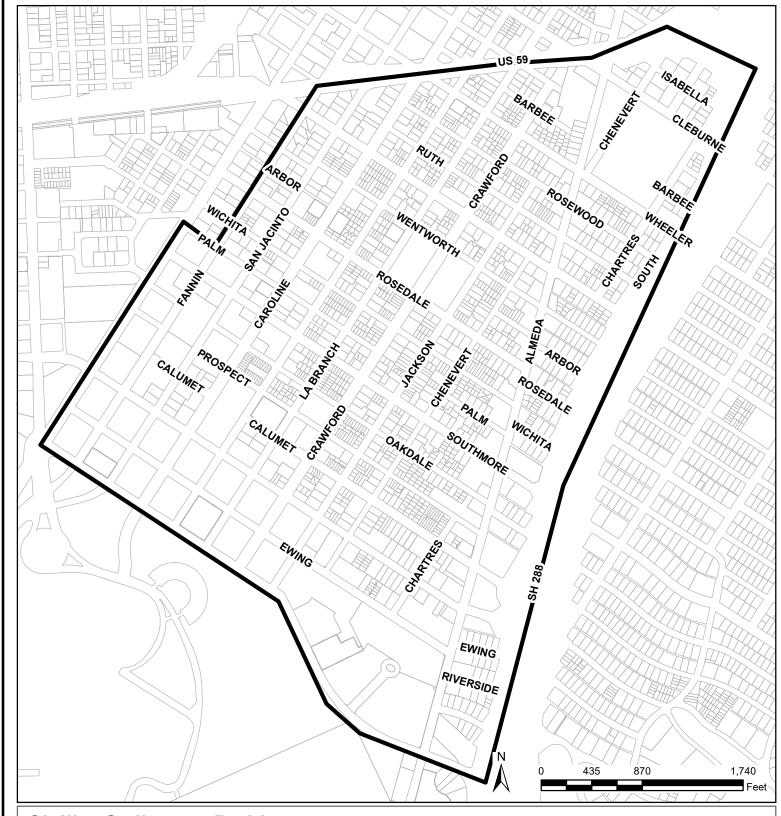

<u>SPECIFIC EXPLANATION:</u> The Woodlands Road Utility District No. 1 (the "District") was created through the Legislature in 1991, and currently consists of 2,563.3814 acres within Montgomery County and Harris County. The District is within the extraterritorial jurisdiction of the City of Houston (the "City") and has petitioned the City for consent to add six (6) tracts of land totaling 19.2632 acres of developed land to the District. The proposed annexation tracts are in the vicinity of Woodlands Parkway, Huffsmith Road/ Rayford Road, Kuykendahl Road, and I-45. The addition of land to the District does not release it from the City's extraterritorial jurisdiction.

The Utility District Review Committee has evaluated the application with respect to wastewater collection and treatment, potable water distribution, storm water conveyance, and other public services.

The District is a road utility district and the general nature of the work to be done in the area sought to be annexed to the District is the construction, acquisition, and improvement of macadamized, graveled or paved roads and turnpikes which serve or are intended to serve as arterial or main feeder roads, and any drainage works related to or in furtherance of the construction, acquisition or improvement of such roads.

The nearest drainage facility for The Woodlands Road Utility District No. 1 is Walnut Creek, within the Spring Creek watershed, which flows into the San Jacinto River, and finally into Lake Houston. The Woodlands has been developed in compliance with the Woodlands Master Drainage Report, including Supplement No. 1 and that plan incorporates the area being annexed. The proposed annexation tracts are not within the 100-year floodplain but are within the 500-year floodplain (2.16%).

By executing the Petition for Consent, the District has acknowledged that all plans for the construction of water conveyance, wastewater collection, and storm water collection systems within the District must be approved by the City prior to their construction.

The Utility District Review Committee recommends that the subject petition be approved.

#### **Background:**

SUBJECT: Petition for the City's consent to the addition of (6) tracts of land totaling 19.2632 acres to The Woodlands Road Utility District No. 1.

<u>RECOMMENDATION</u>: Petition for the City's consent to the addition of (6) tracts of land totaling 19.2632 acres to The Woodlands Road Utility District No. 1 be approved.

<u>SPECIFIC EXPLANATION:</u> The Woodlands Road Utility District No. 1 (the "District") was created through the Legislature in 1991, and currently consists of 2,563.3814 acres within Montgomery County and Harris County. The District is within the extraterritorial jurisdiction of the City of Houston (the "City") and has petitioned the City for consent to add six (6) tracts of land totaling 19.2632 acres of developed land to the District. The proposed annexation tracts are in the vicinity of Woodlands Parkway, Huffsmith Road/ Rayford Road, Kuykendahl Road, and I-45. The addition of land to the District does not release it from the City's extraterritorial jurisdiction.

The Utility District Review Committee has evaluated the application with respect to wastewater collection and treatment, potable water distribution, storm water conveyance, and other public services.

The District is a road utility district and the general nature of the work to be done in the area sought to be annexed to the District is the construction, acquisition, and improvement of macadamized, graveled or paved roads and turnpikes which serve or are intended to serve as arterial or main feeder roads, and any drainage works related to or in furtherance of the construction, acquisition or improvement of such roads.

The nearest drainage facility for The Woodlands Road Utility District No. 1 is Walnut Creek, within the Spring Creek watershed, which flows into the San Jacinto River, and finally into Lake Houston. The Woodlands has been developed in compliance with the Woodlands Master Drainage Report, including Supplement No. 1 and that plan incorporates the area being annexed. The proposed annexation tracts are not within the 100-year floodplain but are within the 500-year floodplain (2.16%).

By executing the Petition for Consent, the District has acknowledged that all plans for the construction of water conveyance, wastewater collection, and storm water collection systems within the District must be approved by the City prior to their construction.

The Utility District Review Committee recommends that the subject petition be approved.

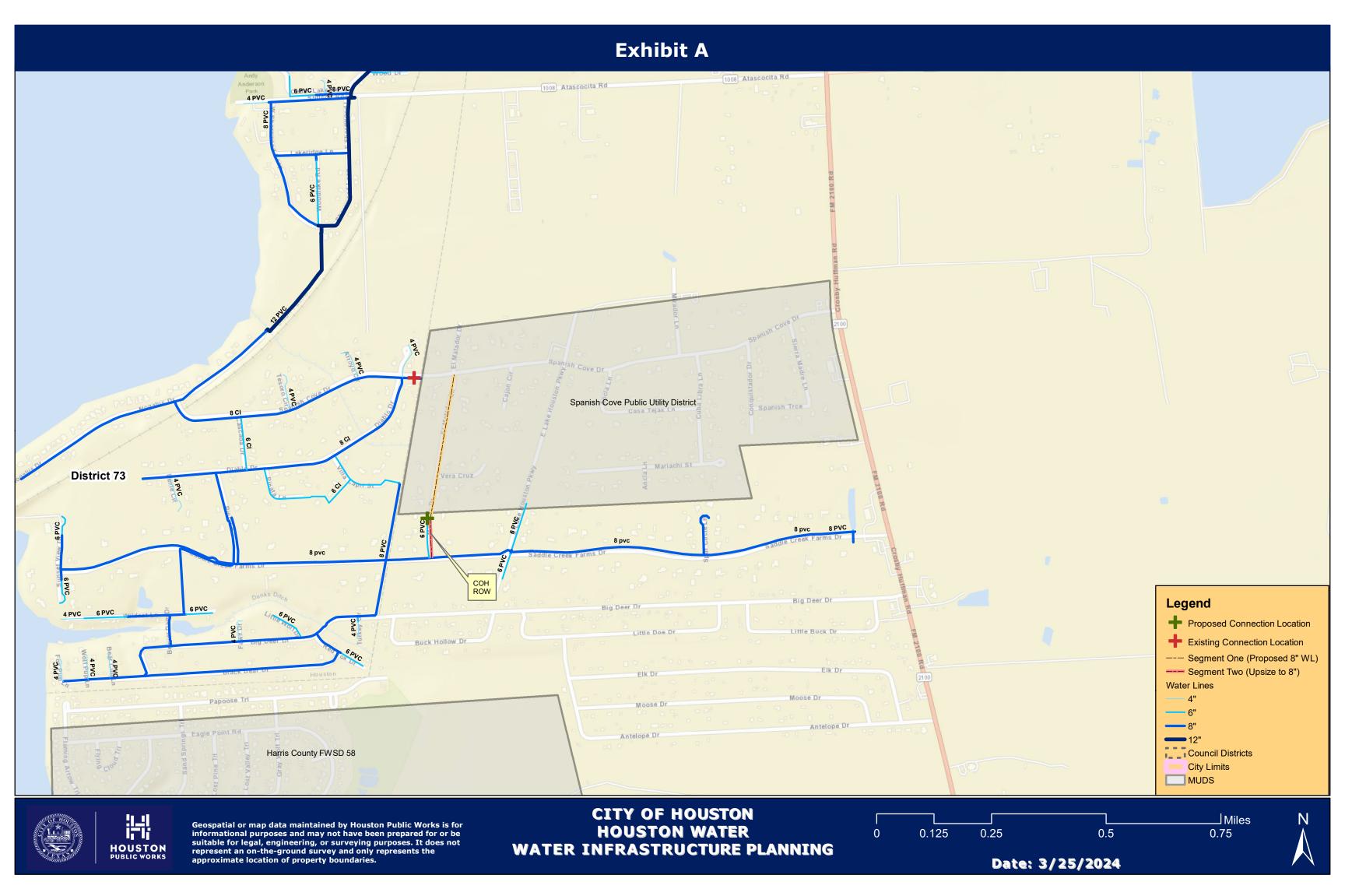

<u>PROJECT NOTICE/JUSTIFICATION:</u> The project is part of the Capital Improvement Plan (CIP) and will include the Plans, Specifications and Estimate package as per Texas Department of Transportation (TxDOT) requirements and General Engineering Consultant oversight.

**DESCRIPTION/SCOPE**: This project will consist of the reconstruction of concrete paving along both sides of Antoine Drive between US 290 Westbound Frontage Road and Acorn Street, replacement of the existing northbound and southbound bridges over Brickhouse Gully, sidewalks, curbs, and median, replacement of the existing small diameter water lines, replacement of the existing sanitary sewer lines, upgrades to existing storm sewers and inlets, and installation of new signals and street lights.

As background, Chapter 106 of the Texas Local Government Code requires the City of Houston to establish a Child Safety Fund for the purpose of providing school crossing guard services to public, parochial, or private elementary or secondary schools. Schools are reimbursed based on the submitted expenditures pursuant to City Ordinance. The Houston Police Department is requesting City Council to approve seventeen (17) School Crossing Guard Agreements for a five-year term via the Child Safety Fund to reimburse these schools. The total revenue for FY2025 available in the Child Safety Fund is \$3,203,500. Anticipated revenue over a five-year period is \$16,017,500.00.

Revenues to the Child Safety Fund come from an assessment of a Municipal Court fee of \$5.00 on each parking violation, a \$1.50 fee for each vehicle registration authorized by Harris County and up to \$25.00 court costs assessed when an offense occurs within a school crossing zone and other truancy violations. The City of Houston pays out all revenues that come into this fund and has no obligation for paying out more from the fund than the fund takes in from revenue. In the event the Child Safety Fund is insufficient to pay the Actual Service Costs, then the available money in the fund shall be apportioned equally on the basis of the total number of elementary school crossings within the city.

The agreements are for a five-year term. Additional agreements with schools/districts may be brought before City Council for approval at a later date, upon approval by their administrative bodies.

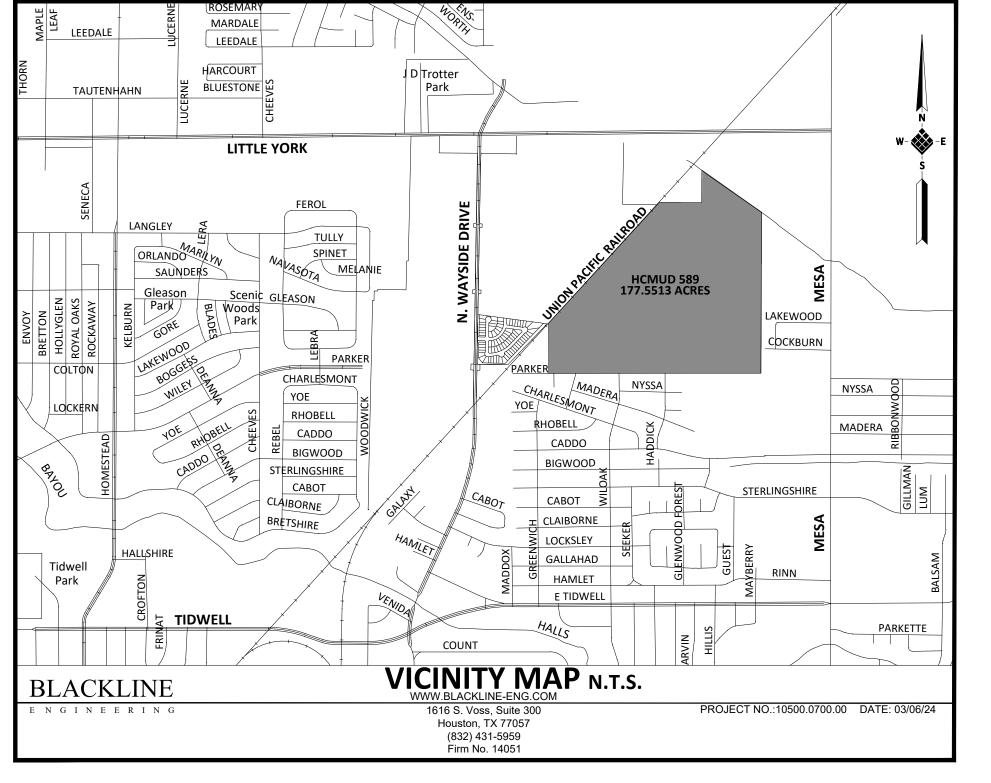
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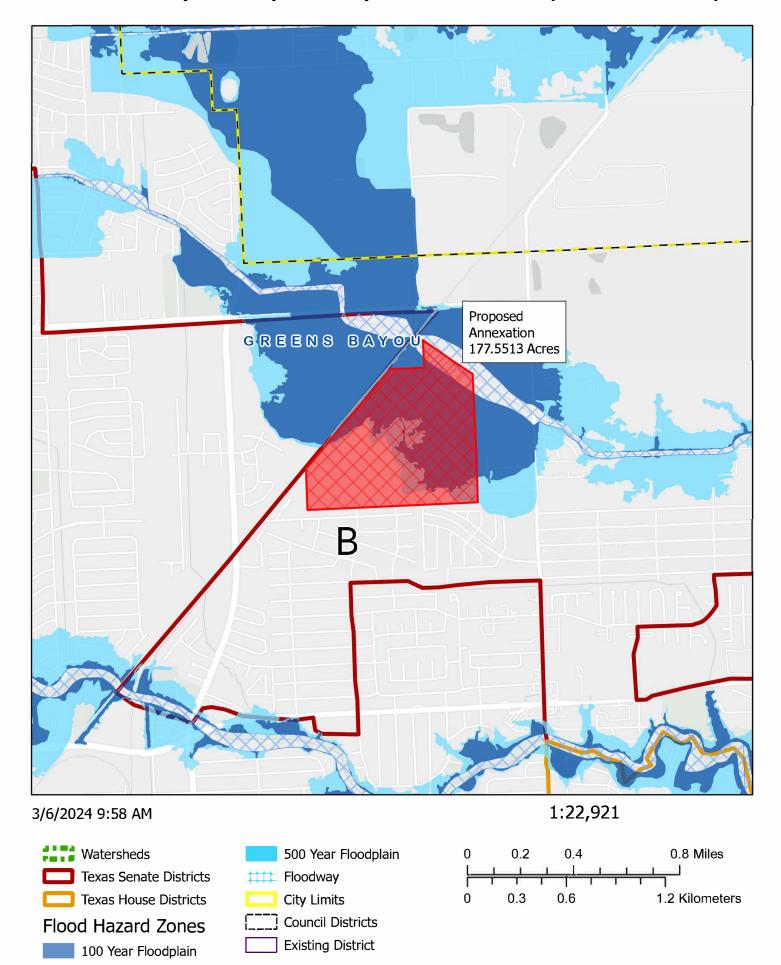

Chapter 40 Article XXII. – Sidewalks

#### **Summary:**

ORDINANCE amending Sec. 40-553. – Applicability. to remove item (3) as a requirement. Also, to amend Sec. 40-560. Fee-in-lieu of sidewalk construction eligibility; fee established. to remove item "a." under subsection (b) as a requirement.

#### Background:

This amendment is regarding the "sidewalk to nowhere" issue that many residential developers are facing in the city of Houston. Currently, the city requires sidewalks to be constructed for new-build single-family homes, even if there are no other sidewalks on the street to connect the sidewalk to. Moreover, currently the city can waive the requirement to construct the sidewalk if the developer pays a fee. This amendment aims to remove the mandatory sidewalk construction requirement for new single-family residential developments, thereby eliminating both the construction requirement and the fee-in-lieu option.

#### Sec. 40-553. Applicability.

- (a) Except as provided in subsection (b) of this section, any person or entity seeking approval for a building permit, certificate of occupancy, or other construction permit or approval required by this Code for any of the following activities must first obtain approval of a sidewalk plan in accordance with this article:
- (3) Construction of a new single-family residential use other than a secondary dwelling unit;

Sec. 40-560. Fee-in-lieu of sidewalk construction eligibility; fee established.

- (a) The planning official and sidewalk committee may waive the sidewalk construction requirement only in accordance with this section. An applicant must file a sidewalk plan with the department and pay the application fee for the plan review and fee-in-lieu determination.
- (b) An applicant may request approval to pay a fee-in-lieu of sidewalk construction when either:
- (1) The planning official determines the activity listed under section 40-553 meets the following conditions:
- a. Construction of a new single-family residential use, other than a secondary dwelling unit;
