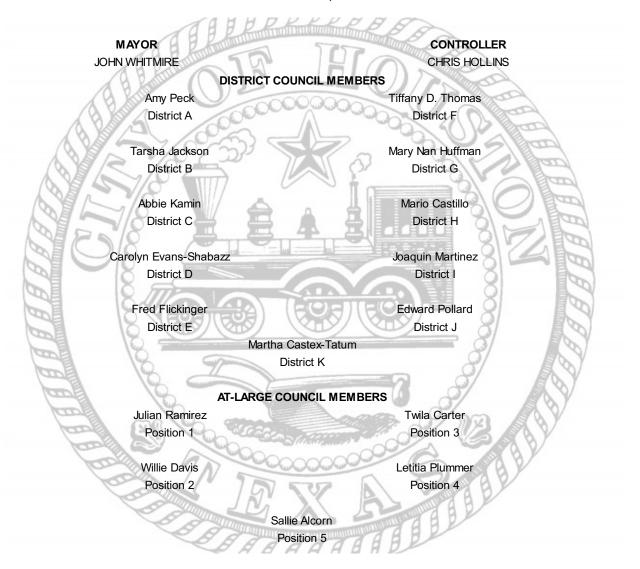

## **Summary:**

MOTION authorizing the Mayor and City Controller to award the sale of Tax and Revenue Anticipation Notes, Series 2024 (the "Notes") in an aggregate amount not to exceed \$232 million (maximum allowable) and take any other action required related to the issuance of the Notes, including ratification and confirmation of the use of the Preliminary Official Statement provided to prospective bidders in connection with the offering for sale of the Notes and approval of the preparation and distribution of the Official Statement

## Background:

#### **RECOMMENDATION:**

Adopt a motion authorizing the Mayor and City Controller to award the sale of Tax and Revenue Anticipation Notes, Series 2024 (the "Notes") in an aggregate amount not to exceed \$232 million (maximum allowable) and take any other action required related to the issuance of the Notes, including ratification and confirmation of the use of the Preliminary Official Statement provided to prospective bidders in connection with the offering for sale of the Notes and approval of the preparation and distribution of the Official Statement.

#### **SPECIFIC EXPLANATION:**

On August 28, 2024 City Council passed Ordinance Nos. 2024-0625 and 2024-0626 (the "Ordinances") authorizing the issuance and sale of Tax and Revenue Anticipation Notes, Series 2024 (the "Notes"). As in prior years, the proceeds of the Notes will be used to fund General Fund operating expenditures in anticipation of the receipt of ad valorem tax revenues later in Fiscal Year 2025.

On or about October 2, 2024, a Notice of Sale and Preliminary Official Statement was made available to prospective purchasers relating to the offering of the Notes in an aggregate amount not to exceed \$232 million (maximum allowable) and requesting the delivery of the bids on October 9, 2024. The bids are received through an auction format described below that allows a broker/dealer to bid for the total principal amount of the Notes or a lesser principal amount; therefore, the "winning bid" may be awarded to more than one firm.

As in prior years, electronic bids for the Notes will be received via Grant Street between 8:30 a.m. – 9:00 a.m. Central Daylight Time on October 9, 2024; however, to encourage competitive bidding, if any bid becomes a leading bid (i.e. lowest yield) within two minutes prior to the scheduled end of the bidding, then the time period for submission of bids will automatically extend by two minutes to allow other bidders additional time to consider improving their pricing. At the close of the bidding period, the Office of the City Controller, Finance Department, and the City's financial advisors will verify interest rate calculations of bids received and provide the results to the City Council. Upon receiving the results, City Council is requested to adopt a motion to award the sale to one or more purchasers based on the lowest true interest cost, ratify and confirm the use of the Preliminary Official Statement and authorize the distribution of the Official Statement. It is expected that the proceeds from the sale of the Notes will be available on Thursday, October 24, 2024.

## **Specific Explanation:**

The Chief Operating Officer of Houston Public Works (HPW) and the Chief Procurement Officer recommend that City Council authorize an **additional appropriation of \$16,054,610.00** out of the Water and Sewer System Consolidated Construction Fund and Dedicated Drainage and Street Renewal Capital Fund – Drainage Charge for an existing contract with **Sensus USA**, **Inc.**, authorized by City Council under Ordinance No. 2020-992, for the installation of the Advanced Metering Infrastructure (AMI) system.

The contract was awarded on November 18, 2020, by Ordinance No. 2020-992 for a ten (10) year term, in the amount not to exceed \$38,038,976.95 with an initial funding amount of \$18,592,348.99. The contract term is from November 20, 2020, through November 20, 2030. Expenditures as of August 21, 2024, totaled \$18,483,598.99.

The scope of work requires the contractor to provide all tools, materials, equipment, labor, training, and supervision necessary for the Sensus AMI network and Software as a Service (SaaS). Software maintenance and upgrades are covered under the terms of the SaaS service agreement. Installation of the individual meter reading devices/infrastructure will be completed by HPW field personnel and/or contractors. This service, which the Texas Commission on Environmental Quality (TCEQ) and Environmental Protection Agency (EPA) require, minimizes the risk of loss of life and property due to flooding during extreme weather events.

The Department will also purchase equipment and services included in the contract with Sensus USA Inc. to implement a flood monitoring system that leverages the communications platform deployed as part of the advanced metering infrastructure system. This work builds upon a successful pilot deployment conducted in 2022.

#### **Specific Explanation:**

The Chief Operating Officer of Houston Public Works (HPW) and the Chief Procurement Officer recommend that City Council authorize an additional appropriation of \$16,054,610.00 out of the Water and Sewer System Consolidated Construction Fund and Dedicated Drainage and Street Renewal Capital Fund - Drainage Charge for an existing contract with Sensus USA, Inc., authorized by City Council under Ordinance No. 2020-992, for the installation of the Advanced Metering Infrastructure (AMI) system.

The contract was awarded on November 18, 2020, by Ordinance No. 2020-992 for a ten (10) year term, in the amount not to exceed \$38,038,976.95 with an initial funding amount of \$18,592,348.99. The contract term is from November 20, 2020, through November 20, 2030. Expenditures as of August 21, 2024, totaled \$18,483,598.99.

The scope of work requires the contractor to provide all tools, materials, equipment, labor, training, and supervision necessary for the Sensus AMI network and Software as a Service (SaaS). Software maintenance and upgrades are covered under the terms of the SaaS service agreement. Installation of the individual meter reading devices/infrastructure will be completed by HPW field personnel and/or contractors. This service, which the Texas Commission on Environmental Quality (TCEQ) and Environmental Protection Agency (EPA) require, minimizes the risk of loss of life and property due to flooding during extreme weather events.

The Department will also purchase equipment and services included in the contract with Sensus USA Inc. to implement a flood monitoring system that leverages the communications platform deployed as part of the advanced metering infrastructure system. This work builds upon a successful pilot deployment conducted in 2022.

#### **MWBE Participation:**

The contract was awarded a 1.9% MWBE goal participation level. Sensus USA Inc. is currently attaining 5.4% as of August 21,2024. The Office of Business Opportunity will continue to monitor the goal progress.

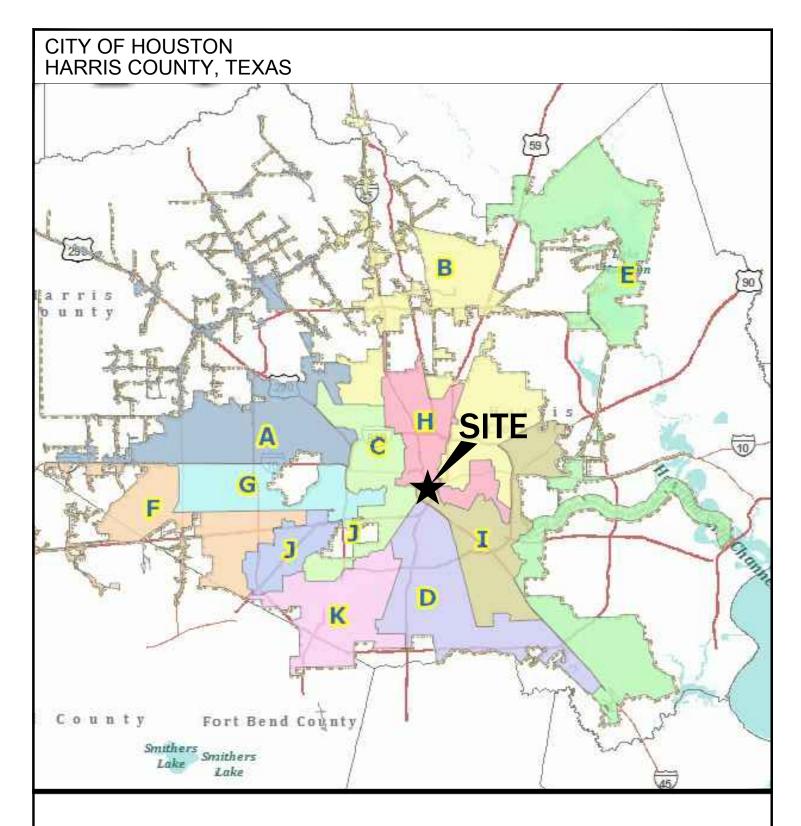

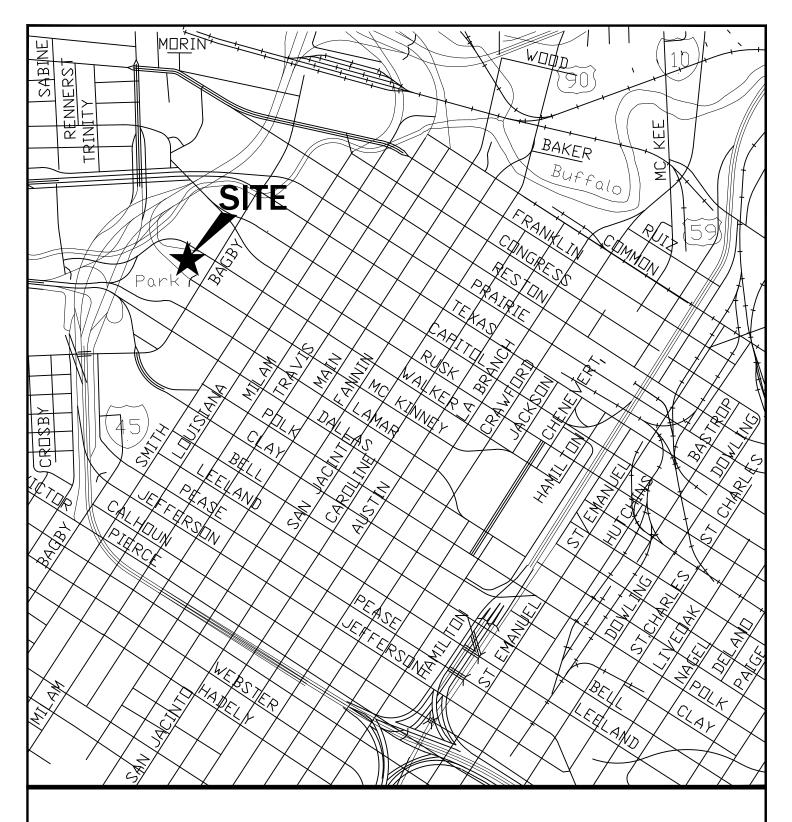

Total Operating Budget for FY25 is \$34,350,179 which includes \$2,921,406 for required fund transfers and \$31,428,773 for Project Costs primarily allocated to land acquisition to enhance economic development opportunities, the planning, design and reconstruction of the Club Creek Detention Basin and Park, property acquisition and design of Harwin Dr. from Fondren Rd. to Gessner Rd for total street reconstruction, the reconstruction of Harwin Dr. and South Gessner Rd. intersection, and efforts to revitalize the Southwest Civic Core Campus.

The FY25 Operating Budget also includes \$207,200 for administration and overhead and a municipal services charge payment in FY25 of \$2,311,587 to pay for the incremental cost of providing services to the area.

The FY25 – FY29 CIP Budget totals \$84,090,000 and includes provisions for street reconstruction, drainage and detention improvements; the redevelopment of Sharpstown Mall.

## **Summary:**

ORDINANCE relating to the fiscal affairs of HIRAM CLARKE/FORT BEND REDEVELOPMENT AUTHORITY ON BEHALF OF REINVESTMENT ZONE NUMBER TWENTY-FIVE, CITY OF HOUSTON, TEXAS (HIRAM CLARKE/FORT BEND ZONE); approving the Fiscal Year 2025 Operating Budget for the Authority and the Fiscal Years 2025-2029 Capital Improvement Plan Budget for the Zone - DISTRICT D - EVANS-SHABAZZ and DISTRICT K - CASTEX-TATUM

## **Background:**

The Administration has undertaken a comprehensive review of the proposed FY25 TIRZ budgets and recommends approval of the FY25 Operating Budget for the Hiram Clarke/Fort Bend Redevelopment Authority (the "Authority") and Fiscal Years 2025-2029 Capital Improvement Plan (CIP) Budget for Reinvestment Zone Number Twenty-Five, City of Houston, Texas (Hiram Clarke/Fort Bend Zone).

- Total Operating Budget for FY25 is \$12,690,597 which includes \$328,597 for required fund transfers, and \$12,362,000 for Project Costs primarily committed to blight removal and beautification, area-wide corridor beautification, 90A corridor improvements, Simon Minchen Park extension, and Carved Rock Roadway extension improvements.
- The FY25 Operating Budget also includes \$466,500 for administration and overhead, and \$1,630,000 for developer reimbursement agreements to improve façades at area grocery retailers, to the Hines southwest business park, and to an area restaurant developer.
- The FY25 Operating Budget has a municipal services charge of \$130,446.
- The FY25-FY29 CIP Budget totals \$39,467,000 and includes provisions for blight removal, the design and construction of roadways, sidewalks, and trails, and greenspace improvements.
- The Authority must advise the Chief Economic Development Officer of any budget amendments. Adjustments to the budget that exceed the lesser of \$400,000 or 5% of Project Costs require City Council approval.

#### **Background:**

The Administration has undertaken a comprehensive review of the proposed FY25 TIRZ budgets and recommends approval of the FY25 Operating Budget for the Hiram Clarke/Fort Bend Redevelopment Authority (the "Authority") and Fiscal Years 2025-2029 Capital Improvement Plan (CIP) Budget for Reinvestment Zone Number Twenty-Five, City of Houston, Texas (Hiram Clarke/Fort Bend Zone).

- Total Operating Budget for FY25 is \$12,690,597 which includes \$328,597 for required fund transfers, and \$12,362,000 for Project Costs primarily committed to blight removal and beautification, area-wide corridor beautification, 90A corridor improvements, Simon Minchen Park extension, and Carved Rock Roadway extension improvements.
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- The FY25 Operating Budget has a municipal services charge of \$130,446.
- The FY25-FY29 CIP Budget totals \$39,467,000 and includes provisions for blight removal, the design and construction of roadways, sidewalks, and trails, and greenspace improvements.
- The Authority must advise the Chief Economic Development Officer of any budget amendments. Adjustments to the budget that exceed the lesser of \$400,000 or 5% of Project Costs require City Council approval.

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V E Reinvestment Zone Number Twenty Five, City of Houston, Texas, also known as the Hiram Clarke/Fort Bend Houston Tax Increment Reinvestment Zone (TIRZ), was created by City Council on August 7, 2013, by Ordinance No. 2013-0708, as a public finance tool intended to encourage investment and stimulate commercial and residential development in a area of the City informally known as the Fondren Gardens area. The City approved the Zone's Project Plan and Reinvestment Zone Finance Plan on June 18, 2014 by Ordinance No. 2014-629. The Plan focuses on strengthening the character of residential and commercial properties in the Zone and increasing the stability and desirability of the Fondren Gardens/Fort Bend community.

Public improvements proposed as part of this plan include but are not limited to public infrastructure, including roadways, water, sewer and drainage; blight removal and beautification, public/cultural facilities improvements, and parks, recreation, trails and pedestrian improvements.

The Houston Parks and Recreation Department (HPARD) requests council action authorizing the First Amendment to the existing Interlocal Agreement between the City of Houston (the City) and Harris County Department of Education (HCDE) to increase the maximum contract amount from \$3,850,000.00 to \$5,390,000.00, modify various spending limits under the CASE for Kids Program, and to extend the term of the Original Agreement until June 30, 2029.

The proposed amendment to the interlocal agreement between the City of Houston and Harris County Department of Education (HCDE) is to continue providing funding to support youth out-of-school programs and activities. The program is managed by the HCDE's after-school division, the Cooperative for After-School Enrichment (CASE) and is called CASE for Kids City Connections (the Program) which supports youth out-of-school programs and activities. On November 15, 2022, pursuant to Ordinance No. 2022-867, City Council approved and authorized the original 5-year agreement with HCDE. HPARD receives budgeted funding of \$550,000.00 per year (\$1,100,000.00/7years). The remaining \$220,000.00 per year (\$440,000.00/7years) is capacity should Council Members choose to request that CDSF Program money be put toward the program. An annual breakdown is shown below. The HCDE's afterschool division manages the program, the Cooperative for After-School Enrichment (CASE) and it is also called CASE for Kids City Connections (the program).

The requested increase to the contract amount is \$1,540,000.00 which brings the total contract amount to \$5,390,000.00. All HCDE responsibilities regarding selection of participants, locations, including schools, community centers, and churches, applicant proposals and program coordination remain the same. No other programs requirements have changed.

The contract allows for Additional Community Awards totaling up to \$220,000 should District Council Members opt to fund additional awards through their Council District Service Fund Program requests. If approved HCDE agrees to deliver these services during the initial grant term effective from the Date of Countersignature by the City Controller to June 30, 2029. If Council

approves, this will be the ninth year the program will be implemented with City funding. This item was reviewed and approved at the Commissioners court on September 18, 2024.

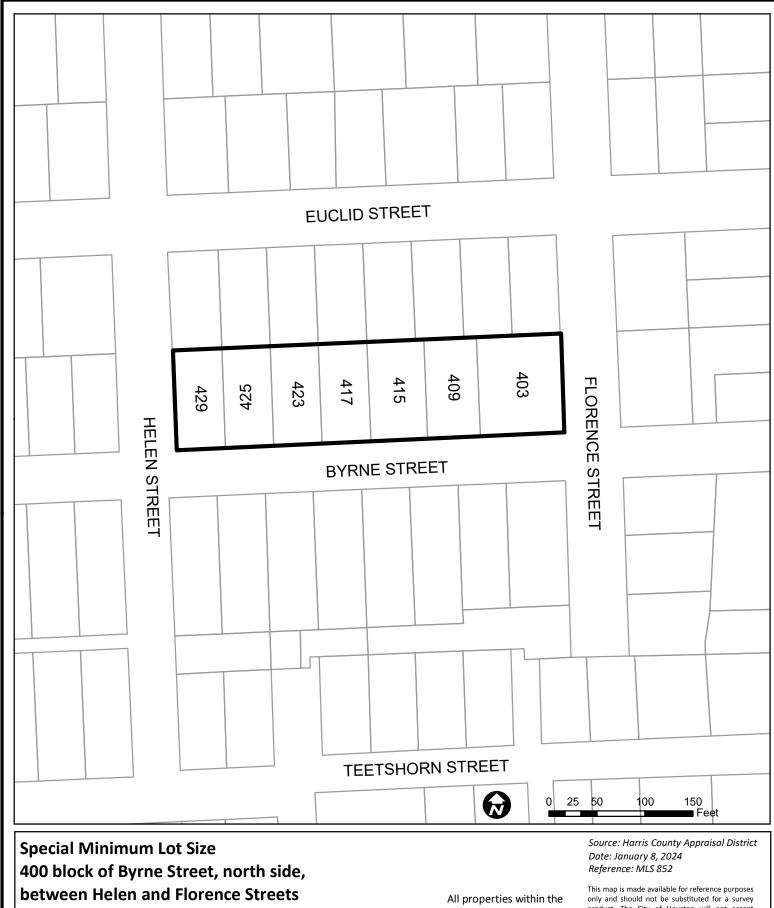

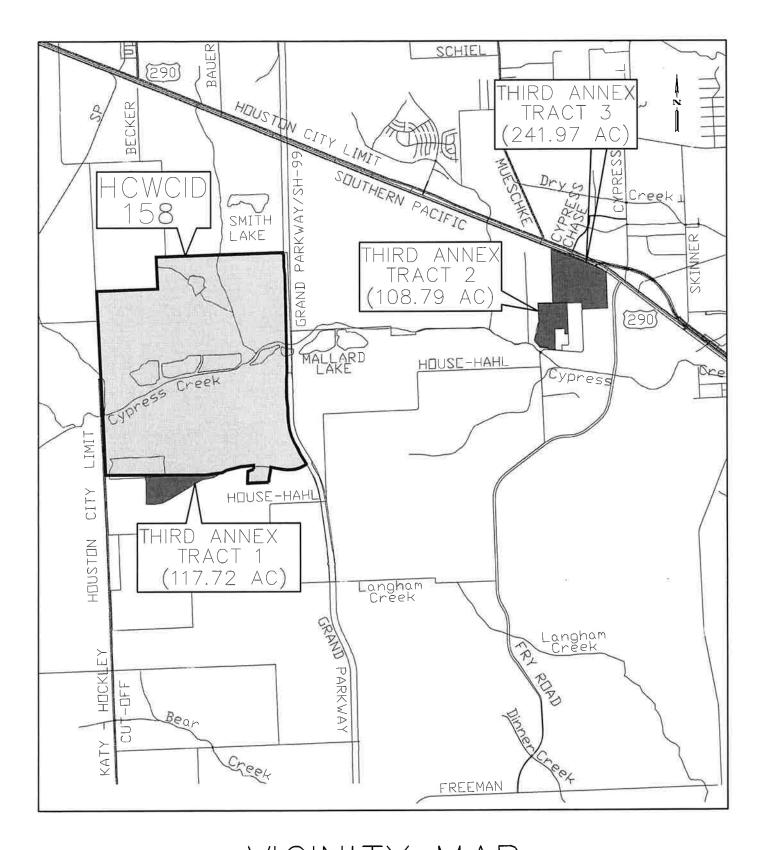

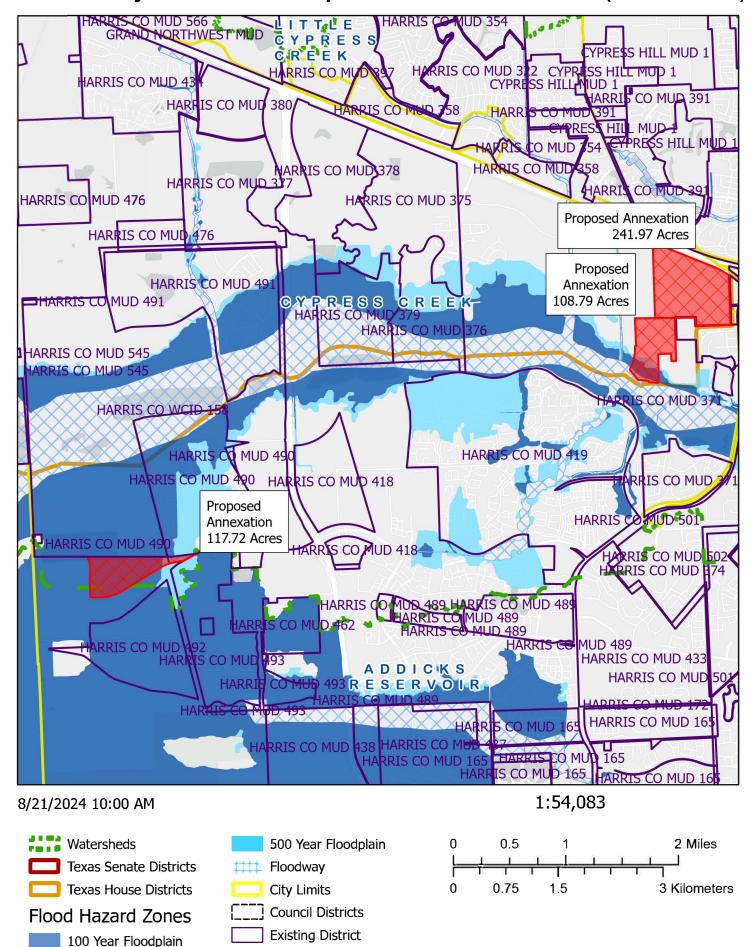


VICINITY MAP

No-New Revenue Tax Rate and Voter-Approval Tax Rate

Section 26.04 (e) of the Tax Code requires that the No-New Revenue Tax Rate and the Voter-Approval Tax Rate be reported to the governing body of each taxing unit. The No-New Revenue Tax Rate for Tax Year 2024 is \$0.519926 on each \$100 of taxable value and the Voter-Approval Tax Rate is \$0.569718 on each \$100 of taxable value. These numbers are based on Certified Initial Roll information from the Harris Central Appraisal District, Fort Bend Central Appraisal District, and the Montgomery Central Appraisal District.

## No Public Hearing

Section 26.05 (d) of the Tax Code provides that a taxing unit may not adopt a tax rate that exceeds the lower of the No-New Revenue Tax Rate and the Voter-Approval Tax Rate until the governing body has held a public hearing. Since the City of Houston proposed a tax rate that does not exceed the No-New Revenue Tax Rate or the Voter-Approval Tax Rate, the public hearings are not required.

It is therefore recommended that City Council adopt the recommendation of the Director of the Finance Department that the No New Revenue Tax Rate for Tax Year 2024 is \$0.519926 on each \$100 of taxable value and the Voter-Approval Tax Rate is \$0.569718 on each \$100 of taxable value, place the proposed tax rate of \$0.519190 on each \$100 of taxable value for Tax Year 2024 on the October 16, 2024 City Council Agenda.

#### No-New Revenue Tax Rate and Voter-Approval Tax Rate

Section 26.04(e) of the Tax Code requires that the No-New Revenue Tax Rate and the Voter-Approval Tax Rate be reported to the governing body of each taxing unit. The No-New Revenue Tax Rate for Tax Year 2024 is \$0.519926 on each \$100 of taxable value and the Voter-Approval Tax Rate is \$0.569718 on each \$100 of taxable value. These numbers are based on Certified Initial Roll information from the Harris Central Appraisal District, Fort Bend Central Appraisal District, and the Montgomery Central Appraisal District.

A proposed tax rate of \$0.55160 on each \$100 of taxable value exceeds the lower of the No-New Revenue Tax Rate and Voter-Approval Tax Rate.

City Council must pass a motion to place a specific proposed tax rate on a future City Council Agenda. The City Council meeting to adopt the proposed tax rate may occur following the publication of notice on October 11, 2024, but may not be later than October 28, 2024.

A proposed tax rate of \$0.55160 on each \$100 of taxable value must be apportioned between Maintenance and Operations (M&O) and Interest and Sinking Fund (I&S). The M&O rate is \$0.411015 on each \$100 of taxable value and the I&S rate is \$0.140585 on each \$100 of taxable value which, when combined, equals a total tax rate of \$0.55160 on each \$100 of taxable value.

It is therefore recommended that City Council adopt the recommendation of the undersigned councilmembers that the No New Revenue Tax Rate for Tax Year 2024 is \$0.519926 on each \$100 of taxable value and the Voter-Approval Tax Rate is \$0.569718 on each \$100 of taxable value, place a proposed tax rate of \$0.55160 on each \$100 of taxable value for Tax Year 2024 on the October 16, 2024, City Council agenda, and schedule a public hearing on the proposed tax rate in the Anna Russell Council Chamber on October 16, 2024, at 9 AM.

The proposed rate is expected to increase the City's ad valorem tax revenues for the current fiscal year in an amount greater than five percent more than the ad valorem property tax revenues collected during the immediately preceding fiscal year. Thus, pursuant to Section 44-25 of the City's Code of Ordinances, the ordinance to adopt the tax rate must be approved by two-thirds of the full City Council. Further, pursuant to Section 44-27 of the Code, before the passage of such ordinance, the City must publish in the major Houston newspaper an analysis of the anticipated increased revenues in a form required by state law and hold a public hearing not earlier than seven days before the date of passage. The public hearing may be combined with any hearing required by state law.

#### Background

On September 9, 2024, at a meeting of the Budget and Fiscal Affairs Committee, the City's Finance Director made two presentations: one on the financial impact of the two recent disasters, the Derecho (DR-4781) and Hurricane Beryl (DR-4798), and one on the City's ad valorem tax rate and Charter revenue cap limitation.

The Director stated that the estimated financial impact of the two disasters is an amount of \$210,628,730. FEMA is expected to reimburse the City for 75% of these costs, to the tune of an amount of \$157,971,547. Thus, the City's local share, 25%, is an amount of \$52,657,182 -- \$39,906,661 General Fund and \$12,750,521 Non-General Fund.

During her presentation, the Director presented five scenarios for a potential tax rate. All five are in compliance with state and local laws.

- 1. Scenario A tax rate of 0.519190. Setting this tax rate would require \$86 million in expenditure cuts to cover the shortfall and the 25% General Fund local share of the disasters.
- 2. Scenario B tax rate of 0.536480. Setting this tax rate would require \$40 million in expenditure cuts to cover the shortfall and the 25% General Fund local share of the disasters.
- 3. Scenario C tax rate of 0.55160. Setting this tax rate would require no expenditure cuts in FY2025 and would allow the City to obtain revenues up to the FY2025 adopted budgeted amount, in compliance with the Charter revenue cap, in addition to the full \$39,906,661 General Fund local share (25%) of disaster expenses.
- 4. Scenario D tax rate of 0.564026. Setting this tax rate would provide sufficient revenues to cover the 25% General Fund local share of the disasters and generate \$33 million in additional cash flow.
- 5. Scenario E tax rate of 0.581393. Setting this tax rate would provide sufficient revenues to cover the 25% General Fund local share of the disasters and generate \$79 million in additional cash flow.

Based on this information, and in anticipation of a potential \$230 million budget shortfall in FY2026, the undersigned council members feel it is fiscally responsible to adopt Scenario C and place a proposed tax rate of \$0.55160 on each \$100 of taxable value on the October 16, 2024 agenda and schedule a public hearing for consideration of same.
