

Background:

<u>SUBJECT</u>: Adopt an Ordinance approving an Additional Appropriation for Change Order No. 5 for Lift Station Renewal and Replacement.

RECOMMENDATION: (SUMMARY) Adopt an Ordinance approving an Additional Appropriation of \$2,244,209.21 for Lift Station Renewal and Replacement.

PROJECT NOTICE/JUSTIFICATION: This project is part of the City's ongoing program to upgrade its wastewater lift station facilities.

The work to be performed under this contract award is necessary to maintain compliance with Houston's wastewater consent decree with EPA and TCEQ.

DESCRIPTION/SCOPE: The project included the replacement of the Magnet Lift Station and the rehabilitation of Westpark No.1 and Macgregor Way North Lift Stations. The rehabilitation includes site work, pumps, piping valves, support, instrumentation, and electrical improvements. The Project was awarded to Industrial TX Corp. with an original Contract Amount of \$21,029,950.00.

ADDITIONAL APPROPRIATION: An approval is requested for an additional appropriation of

\$2,137,342.10 in excess of the original contract value and an extension of 284 days of contract time for additional work described in Change Order No.5:

Increase bypass pumping capacity from 46 MGD to 55 MGD. Level Radar relocation and change the Model. Modify the pump and motor levels grating inside the dry well at MacGregor Lift Station. Increase cash allowance for CenterPoint Energy. Furnished and install pump local disconnect. Replace ground level handrail MacGregor and drain lines. Architectural. Supply and install exhaust fan platform for Way North maintenance. Remove existing suction elbow and install new suction elbow in wet well. Change the bypass pumping system discharge location. Supply and install new valve vault covers. Modification to the flow control structure gate actuators. Wet well walls repair. Add check valves support. Field work related to control panel changes. Procure and install float switches.

Magnet Procure and install float switches.

Westpark No.1 Furnished and install pump local disconnect. Field work related to control panel changes. Procure and install float switches.

The requested appropriation will cover the additional work identified.

The total requested appropriation is \$2,244,209.21 to be appropriated as follows: \$2,137,342.10 for contract services and \$106,867.11 for CIP Cost Recovery.

HIRE HOUSTON FIRST: The proposed contract requires compliance with the City's Hire Houston First (HHF) ordinance that promotes economic opportunity for Houston business and supports job creation. In this case, Industrial TX Corp. is a designated HHF company, but they were the successful awardee without the application of the HHF preference.

PAY OR PLAY PROGRAM: The proposed contract requires compliance with the City's 'Pay or Play' ordinance regarding health benefits for employees of City contractors. In this case, the Contractor provides benefits for some employees but will pay into the Contractor Responsibility Fund for others, in compliance with City policy.

M/WBE PARTICIPATION: The M/WBE goal established for this project is 11.00% MBE goal and 7.00% WBE goal. The original Contract amount and subsequent appropriations total \$21,029,950.00. The Contractor has been paid \$19,503,354.15 (92.74%) to date. Of this amount, \$4,584,994.82 (23.51%) has been paid to M/WBE sub-contractors to date. Assuming approval of the requested additional appropriation, the contract amount will increase to \$23,167,292.10. The MWBE goal has been previously met.

FISCAL NOTE: No significant Fiscal Operating impact is anticipated as a result of this project.

SPECIFIC EXPLANATION:

StarFlite Management Group, Inc. (Lessee) has requested to lease premises at William P. Hobby Airport (HOU) to exclusively use as an air-taxi/charter service facility for the purpose of chartering aircraft to individuals and corporations. Lessee has occupied such premises under a previous agreement since February 2004.

The pertinent terms of this Lease Agreement ("Lease") are as follows:

- Leased Premises: The Leased Premises includes two parcels: 1) Approximately 94,783.95 square feet (2.176 acres) of land and improvements located at 8430 Larson Street including 17,828 square feet of space in Hanger E330/ER-11 and 25,323 square feet of Apron, and 2) Approximately 83,032 square feet (1.906 acres) of land and improvements located at 8411 Nelms Road including 20,366 square feet of space in Hangar E256/ER-7 and 21,231 square feet of Apron. The leasehold consists of an air-taxi/charter service facility, an aircraft maintenance hangar facility, aircraft parking and movement area (ramp), grassy areas, and vehicle parking spaces outside of the main hangar area at HOU.
- 2. <u>Term</u>: The Lease commences on the Effective Date and continues for ten (10) consecutive years unless earlier terminated in accordance with terms and conditions of the Lease.





The Planning and Development Department mailed notifications to all property owners indicating that the SMLSB application had been submitted. Since no protest was filed in accordance with the Code, no action is required by the Houston Planning Commission, and the application may be submitted directly to the City Council for consideration.



Proposition A Council Member Item: Evening Public Session

Summary: ORDINANCE to allow evening Public Session hearings once a month.

Background: Currently, for the public to give input to their local government, they must come to City Council chambers on Tuesday afternoons. To improve access for residents who are unable to attend daytime Public Session hearings, these sessions need to be held in the evening.

Specific Explanation: This Ordinance is to allow the Public Session to occur in the evening at city council chambers the final scheduled hearing of each month at 6 pm instead of 2 pm.

Proposal:

Section 2-2

Rule 1 (a) shall be replaced with the following:

The city council shall conduct its regular weekly meeting in two daily sessions commencing at 1:30 p.m. on Tuesday and at 9:00 a.m. on Wednesday, respectively, of each calendar week. Each session shall be conducted in the city council chamber unless another place in the City Hall is designated by the city council. The final Tuesday session of each month shall take place at 5:30 p.m. Meetings shall recess at the times provided in Rule 7 and shall be subject to recess at other times as provided in subsection c, below. No notice shall be required to be given to any member of any recessed meeting. In the event that Tuesday or Wednesday, or both, of any calendar week falls on a holiday observed by the closure of city offices, then the regular weekly meeting sessions shall be rescheduled or consolidated as determined by the city council. The city council may consolidate daily sessions or reschedule any weekly meeting or daily session the same calendar week and may for valid reasons postpone any regular weekly meeting or daily session to another week.

Rule 8 (a) shall be replaced with the following:

Any citizen of the city shall have a reasonable opportunity to be heard at all regular and special meetings of the city council in regard to any and all matters to be considered at such meetings that are germane and relevant to any subject matter of city affairs or business that is within the scope of the authority and legislative functions of the city council. Such appearances by members of the public shall be scheduled to begin at 2:00 p.m. at the Tuesday session of the regular meetings of city council. The last Tuesday session of each month shall be scheduled for 6:00 p.m. The mayor, mayor pro tem, or other presiding officer shall at all times be responsible for conducting the meeting and maintaining proper order and decorum. Any council member shall have the privilege of raising a point of order as to whether the subject matter to be heard and considered as presented by a citizen is germane and relevant to any subject matter of city affairs or business that is to be considered by city council.

Requests to appear shall be made to the office of the city secretary, and may be made in person or by mail, email, fax, or telephone, provided that the request is received before the scheduled time of commencement of the city council meeting session at which public appearances will be heard. Each speaker shall provide his or her name, street address, mailing address (if different), telephone number, and a brief description (not to exceed ten words) of the intended subject matter of the citizen's remarks. The speaker's street address, mailing address (if different), and telephone number is for internal, administrative use only by city council, the city secretary's office, and city departments, and shall not be disclosed publicly, except as required by law. Speakers who have not appeared at any of the four preceding regular city council meetings shall also state whether they wish to limit their remarks to one, two or three minutes.
