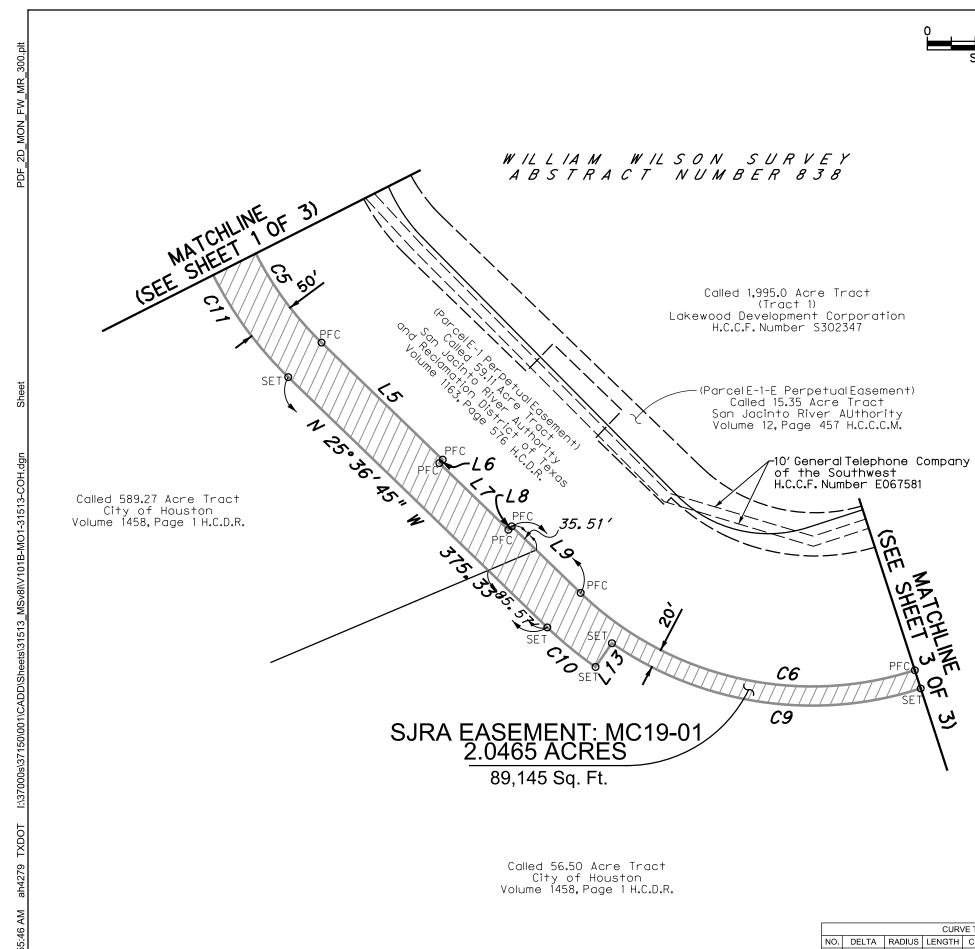


Main Canal

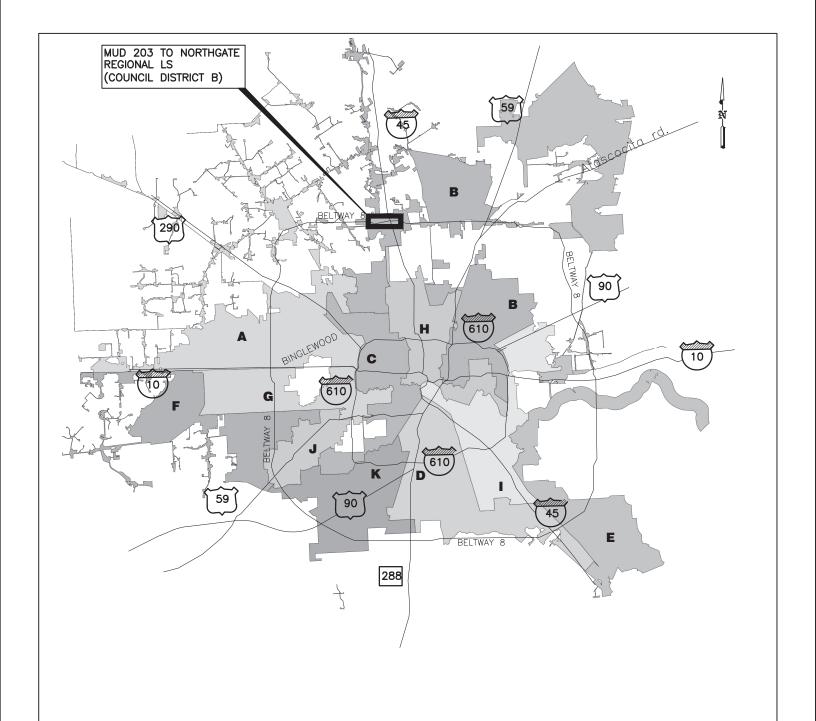

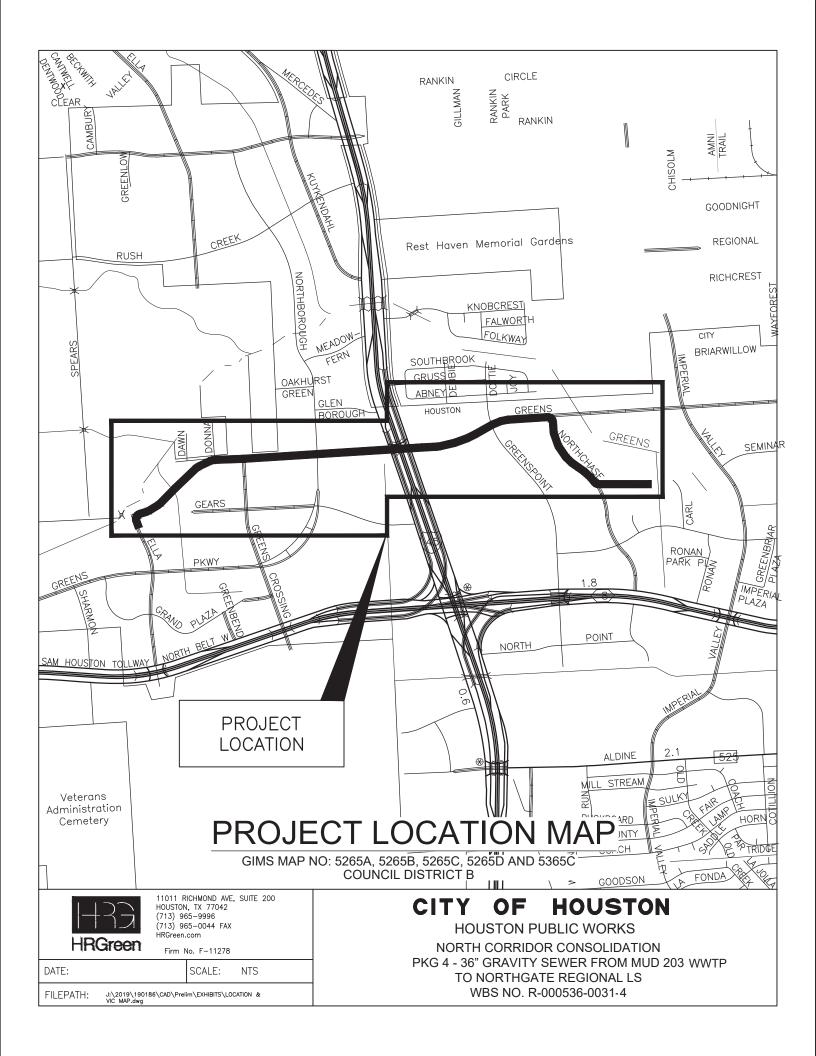
